Dear Sir:

At the March 6, 2014 Board meeting, authorization was approved to enter into an agreement with a successful proposer(s) for Request for Proposal 14-RFP-18, Supply of Electricity.

On August 6, 2014, the District advertised a request for proposal, 14-RFP-18, Supply of Electricity. In response to a public advertisement, the District received four (4) proposals on September 5, 2014. The four proposers were Constellation New Energy, Inc., MidAmerican Energy Company, Integrys Energy Services, Inc., and Dynegy Energy Services.

The evaluation committee, consisting of members of the Maintenance and Operations, Law, and Procurement and Materials Management Departments, evaluated the proposals.

All four proposers were notified they would be invited to participate in the reverse auction on October 20, 2014. The District offered various options in which proposers could submit a bid for round the clock (RTC) pricing, for various contract periods, for Group 1 and Group 2.

As a result of the reverse auction held on November 5, 2014, the District awarded a contract to Dynegy Energy Services, for Group 1, for a price of \$0.04285/kWh RTC, including a bandwidth of 100% for a term of 36 months, beginning on the first meter read date in December 2014 and ending December 31, 2017. The increase in cost for electricity for 2015, 2016 and 2017 is \$31,000.00 higher than 2014 prices.

Dynegy Energy Services was also awarded Group 2, for a price of \$0.03925/kWh RTC, including a bandwidth of 100% for a term of 24 months, beginning on the first meter read date in December 2015 and ending December 31, 2017. 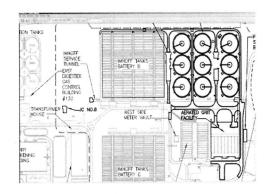

Project Description: Construction of nine Primary Settling Tanks (PSTs) of 160-foot diameter and six 132-foot long aerated grit tanks, associated support facilities, service tunnels, and conduits. The aerated grit facility will include shaftless-screw conveyors, centrifugal and airlift pumps for grit removal, grit classifiers and a dumpster-loading system. Grit tanks will be covered for odor control. Process air for the grit tanks and PSTs will be provided by new turbo blowers. The PST area will have Tunnel Access Pump Stations (TAPS) containing scum pumps, sludge airlifts, an electrical substation, odor control vessels and fans, and associated equipment. PST effluent weirs and troughs will be covered for odor control. The ability to bypass six PSTs will be provided. Additionally, modifications to the existing Monitoring & Research Building at the Stickney WRP are included in this project. The work involves the installation of new air handling units, an absorption chiller, heat exchangers, pumps, and strobic fans. Replacement of associated controls, intake, supply, and exhaust ductwork, piping, conduit, and wiring at the Monitoring & Research Building is also included. Equipment will be provided by the District, but installed by the contractor. Piping will be installed in Mechanical Room LC-118 to bypass and abandon leaking underground condenser water piping.

Project Justification: The West Side Imhoff tanks are being decommissioned and replaced with more modern and effective treatment. Imhoff Battery A and Skimming Tanks 1-8 have already been demolished in preparation for this project. The Imhoff tanks have been in service since 1928, are labor-intensive to operate, and provide treatment inferior to PSTs. Valves for sludge withdrawal are difficult to operate, and have resulted in injuries to personnel. Skimming scum from Imhoff tanks requires personnel to walk narrow walkways above open sewage with no fall protection. Certain areas of the structures have exhibited structural cracking and leakage from conduits. Maintenance and repair supplies are not readily available for antiquated systems. Sludge solids are digested in the lower anaerobic zone of the Imhoff tanks, and the methane gas byproduct of digestion is impossible to capture and is emitted to the atmosphere. A significant increase in digester gas production will result from this project, allowing the District to proceed on the path to energy neutrality. The aerated grit facility will replace the existing West Side skimming tanks and provide superior grit removal, thus preserving downstream piping and equipment from damage due to scouring by grit. The existing skimming tanks and grit concentration utilize maintenance-intensive chainand-flight mechanisms. In addition, the skimming tanks and existing grit concentration create a recycle load of up to 100 million gallons per day; there will be minimal recycling from the new facilities. The existing Imhoff and skimming tanks are significant generators of odor. Odors from new facilities will be captured and removed, in keeping with the District's goodneighbor policy. The central portion of the Monitoring & Research Building was constructed in 1963 and much of the existing equipment in this area is original to the facility. The supply and exhaust ventilation can no longer meet the testing and ventilation needs of the facility staff. Increased maintenance needs and the increased risk of failure necessitate that it be replaced to ensure a reliable and safe environment for the employees.

Seven hundred and two (702) companies were notified of this contract being advertised and forty-four (44) companies requested specifications.

Report on Public Notification of Significant Industrial Users Having Exemplary Compliance Records and Industrial Users Significantly Violating Pretreatment Standards or Other Requirements

Dear Sir:

The federal General Pretreatment Regulations (40 CFR 403.8[f][2][viii]) require the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (District) to comply with the public participation requirements of 40 CFR Part 25 in the enforcement of National Pretreatment Standards. These requirements include a provision for providing annual public notification, in a newspaper of general circulation that provides meaningful public notice within the jurisdiction of the District, the names of industrial users, which were significantly violating applicable pretreatment standards or other requirements.

To comply with this provision, the Monitoring and Research Department annually compiles a list of companies, which were considered significant violators of the General Pretreatment Regulations and the District's Sewage and Waste Control Ordinance (Ordinance).

Companies are deemed to be significant violators pursuant to the provisions contained in Appendix E of the Ordinance.

In response to suggestions from the industrial community, we have included in the proposed publication document, the identities of those significant industrial users having exemplary compliance records for calendar year 2013. There were 240 significant industrial users who were not the subject of any enforcement actions taken by the District for noncompliance during calendar year 2013. The exemplary compliance record of these significant industrial users is to be commended. Therefore, we have placed this segment of the report at the top of the publication document Attachment 1.

The companies noted on pages 9 and 10 of <u>Attachment 1</u> have been determined to be significant violators of applicable pretreatment standards or other requirements for calendar year 2013 pursuant to the selection criteria contained in Appendix E of the Ordinance. These companies were notified via letter, dated October 2, 2014, of the forthcoming publication of this list and the criteria used. Further, the letter advised all companies on the attached list of their opportunity to provide written comments to the District regarding the appropriateness of their publication as significant violators within 30 days of the date of the letter. All such comments received by the District as of the date of this report were considered prior to the preparation of the attached list. Any additional comments received prior to the actual publication of this list in the newspaper will also be considered and may result in deletions from the list or modification of the entries on the list.

A summary of the significant violator publication list for calendar years 2010, 2011, 2012, and 2013 with regard to federally mandated minimum selection criteria, is provided in Attachment 2.

Dear Sir:

Peoples Gas is remediating its property at Baltimore Avenue and 96th Street, adjacent to the District's 95th Street Pumping Station at Baltimore Avenue and 95th Street in Chicago ("Pumping Station Site"). The Peoples Gas site is a former Manufactured Gas Plant ("MGP") site that operated from 1885 to 1936. Peoples Gas has indicated that, as part of its remediation, it will be installing sheet piling inside its property line. Peoples Gas has requested a permit to temporarily relocate its current fence 5 feet onto the Pumping Station Site for approximately 6 months. A companion Board letter seeking authority to issue a permit to Peoples Gas for this purpose is on today's agenda.

Peoples Gas has offered to perform an environmental site investigation on the Pumping Station Site to further determine the nature and extent of contamination thereon due to off-site migration from its MGP site. A nominal fee of \$10.00 is, therefore, recommended.

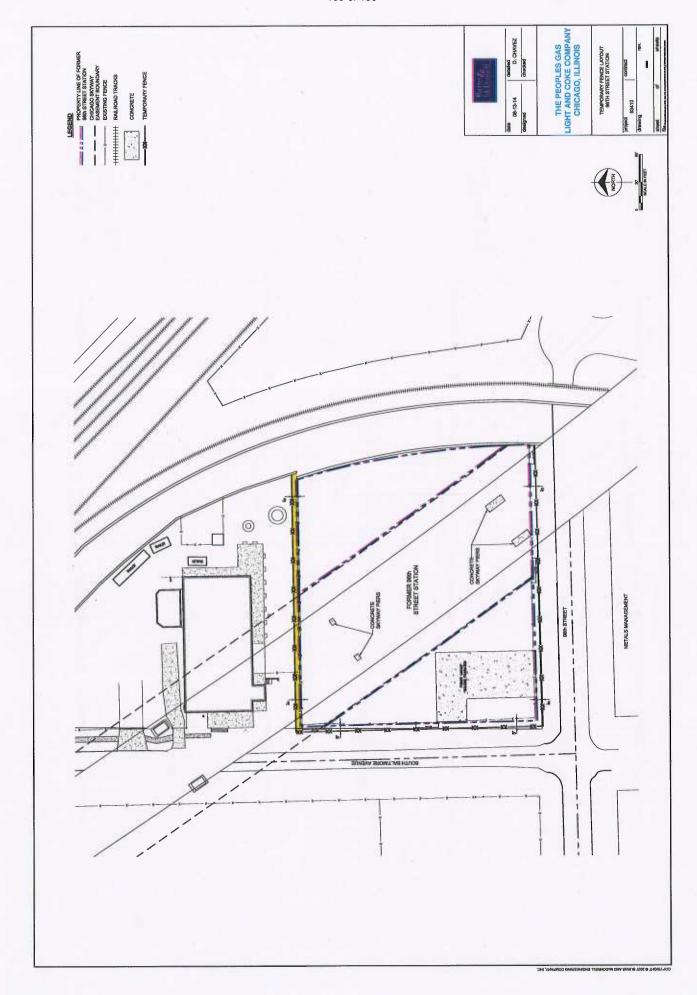
The District's technical departments have reviewed Peoples Gas' proposal to perform environmental testing and have no objections thereto.

Authority to issue a nine (9) month permit to Peoples Gas on an approximately 5' x 270' area of District real estate located along the southern boundary of the 95th Street Pumping Station Site for construction staging purposes. Consideration shall be \$10.00

Dear Sir:

Peoples Gas is remediating its property at Baltimore Avenue and 96th Street, adjacent to the District's 95th Street Pumping Station at Baltimore Avenue and 95th Street in Chicago ("Pumping Station Site"). The Peoples Gas site is a former Manufactured Gas Plant ("MGP") site. Peoples Gas has indicated that, as part of its remediation, it will be installing sheet piling inside its property line. Peoples Gas is, therefore, requesting a permit to temporarily relocate its current fence 5 feet onto the Pumping Station Site for approximately 6 months. A companion Board letter is on today's agenda seeking authority to issue a one-year permit to Peoples Gas to conduct an environmental site investigation on the Pumping Station Site.

Peoples Gas has stated that no heavy equipment will be used or stored on the District's property. All cranes and excavators for the remediation will be located on Peoples Gas' property. Construction personnel will need access to walk on the District's property, located within the relocated fence line, and certain equipment will be used on the Pumping Station Site to install the temporary fence. Upon completion of the installation of the sheet piling, the temporary fence will be removed from the Pumping Station Site, and the permanent fence will be replaced on Peoples Gas' property.

The District's technical departments have reviewed the subject requests and have no objections thereto.

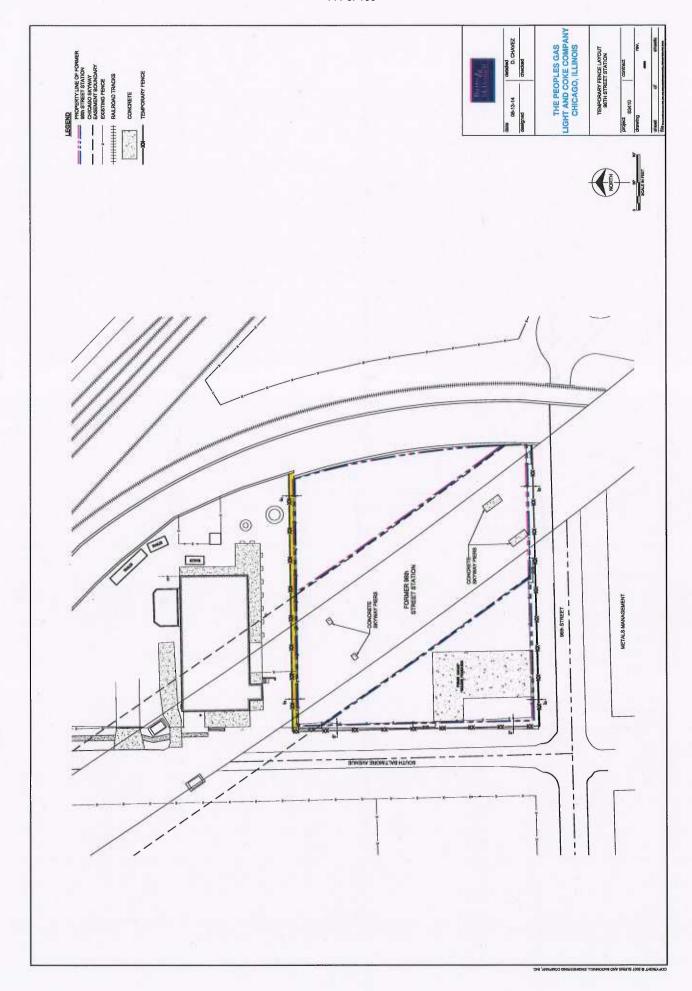

At the time the Executive Director issued the permit, he polled the Board of Commissioners and found that it was amenable to its issuance.

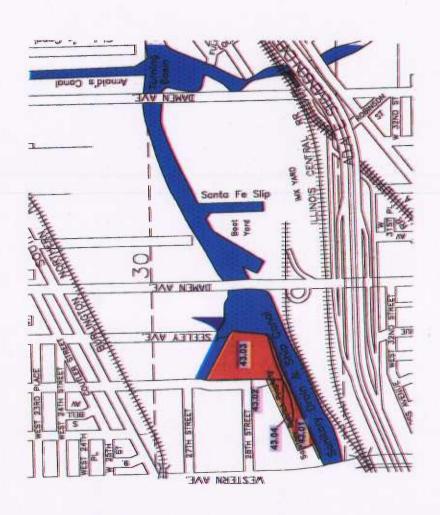

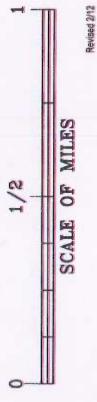

Authority to issue a 4-year permit extension to Christy Webber Landscapes for continued use of approximately 12 acres of District real estate located at the Cal-Sag Channel and Ridgeland Avenue in Alsip, Illinois and known as the Ridgeland Avenue Drying Facilities. Consideration shall be an annual fee of \$110,000.00

Dear Sir:

Christy Webber Landscapes ("CWL") has occupied, under a permit, approximately 12 acres of District land located at the Ridgeland Avenue Drying Facilities for the purpose of mulching and storing leaves since 2011. The permit, as extended, expires December 31, 2014. CWL has requested to extend the permit for an additional 4 years until December 31, 2018. CWL has also requested to use the District scale and scale house located on the permit premises. A permit was issued, in this instance, due to the Board of Commissioners April 3, 2014, designation of this site as a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers ("Corps") Regional Sediment Management Facility pursuant to the District's obligations under the Cal-Sag Navigation Project. The Cal-Sag Navigation Project was approved by the U.S. Congress in 1967 which authorized the Corps to widen and dredge the Cal-Sag Channel, improve portions of the Little Calumet River and a portion of the Calumet Harbor and Lake Calumet. Maintenance of the waterways involves the periodic dredging and depositing of the silt and dredging upon maintenance areas. As a local sponsor, the District is statutorily obligated to furnish, free of cost, to the Corps all lands necessary for the Corps' maintenance. A permit allows the District the right to terminate the agreement, if necessary, due to the Corps' needs.

The District's technical departments have reviewed this matter and have no objections to CWL's requests.

The annual permit fee of \$110,000.00 is recommended based upon a recent appraisal prepared by Mr. William Enright, MAI, of Appraisal Associates at the District's request.

It is requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it authorize and approve the issuance of a 4-year permit extension to Christy Webber Landscapes for continued use of approximately 12 acres of District real estate located at the Cal-Sag Channel and Ridgeland Avenue in Alsip, Illinois and known as the Ridgeland Avenue Drying Facilities. Consideration shall be an annual fee of \$110,000.00.

It is also requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it authorize and direct the Chairman of the Committee on Finance and the Clerk to execute the permit extension agreement on behalf of the District after it is approved by the General Counsel as to form and legality.

Authority to amend lease agreement dated January 1, 1954 with the Chicago Transit Authority on 8.623 of acres of District real estate located north of the O'Brien Water Reclamation Plant and east and west of the North Shore Channel in Skokie, Illinois; North Shore Channel Parcels 6.13 and 6.14, extending the lease expiration date from December 31, 2014, to June 30, 2015. Consideration shall be \$17,837.50

Dear Sir:

Since 1924, the Chicago Transit Authority ("CTA") and its predecessors have occupied North Shore Channel Parcels 6.13 and 6.14 located east and west of McCormick Boulevard and along the northern boundary of the O'Brien Water Reclamation Plant in Skokie, Illinois, under a series of leases to operate a rapid transit railroad line currently known as the "Yellow Line" for public transportation purposes. The annual rent is \$35,675.00. The current lease expires on December 31, 2014. The CTA requested a new 39-year lease upon its expiration, but is evaluating whether leasing all 8.623 of acres is necessary.

Accordingly, the CTA is re-evaluating its land use needs at the subject location and has indicated that it is currently in the process of assessing whether a new lease on a smaller area of land is suitable for its use. The CTA has requested an amendment to its lease granting a six-month extension thereto for the continued use and operation of the rapid transit railroad line currently known as the "Yellow Line" for public transportation purposes while it re-evaluates its land use needs.

The fee of \$17,837.50 represents the pro-rata share of the CTA's annual rent under its lease.

The technical departments have no objections to the CTA's request.

It is requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it authorize an amendment to the lease agreement dated January 1, 1954 with the Chicago Transit Authority on 8.623 of acres of District real estate located north of the O'Brien Water Reclamation Plant and east and west of the North Shore Channel in Skokie, Illinois; North Shore Channel Parcels 6.13 and 6.14, extending the lease expiration date from December 31, 2014, to June 30, 2015. Consideration shall be \$17,837.50.

It is further requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it authorize and direct the Chairman of the Committee on Finance and the Clerk to execute said lease amendment agreement after same is approved by the General Counsel as to form and legality.

Consideration shall be a nominal fee of \$10.00

Dear Sir:

On July 10, 1997 and May 6, 2004, the Board of Commissioners ("Board") issued a 4-year permit and a 5-year permit, respectively, to the Illinois Natural History Survey-Prairie Research Institute as a unit of the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign ("Illinois Natural History Survey") and working in cooperation with the Illinois Department of Natural Resources ("IDNR") and the United States Department of Agriculture - Animal and Plant Heath Inspection Service's Wildlife Services ("USDA") to periodically access District real estate located in Fulton County, Illinois to conduct a study of nesting mallards.

Illinois Natural History Survey, IDNR, and the USDA have now requested a 3-year permit to periodically access District real estate located along the Main Channel and the Des Plaines River in Will County, DuPage County and Cook County to conduct a study of the winter ecology of Canadian Geese in the Greater Chicago Metropolitan Area.

The study involves the capture of approximately 500 geese as they migrate into the study area. GPS transmitters and/or plastic neck collars with alpha/numeric markings and leg bands will be placed on these geese allowing the wildlife biologists and technicians to investigate and study their migration patterns.

The permit will allow periodic access to District land located within the Stickney Water Reclamation Plant, vacant parcels and several parcels leased to the Forest Preserve District of Cook County ("FPDCC") and the Forest Preserve District of DuPage County ("FPDDC") located along the Main Channel and the Des Plaines River (from 31st Street in Chicago to 135th Street in Romeoville) to conduct its study. The study will not be conducted near operational areas of the Stickney Water Reclamation Plant. The permit will encompass the following locations:

The permit will require that the Illinois Natural History Survey obtain a written consent of the FPDCC and the FPDDC prior to accessing their respective leaseholds.

The District's technical departments have no objections to the Illinois Natural History Survey's request subject to access being coordinated with District staff.

As in the past, the Illinois Natural History Survey has requested a waiver of the environmental contamination insurance requirement, a reduction of the general liability and property damage insurance requirements from \$4,000,000.00 to \$1,000,000.00 and that the Permit is issued for a nominal fee of \$10.00. In the past, the Board has approved such requests determining that the study of geese poses little or no risk of environmental contamination to District land, that the potential liability to third parties on account of the Illinois Natural History Survey's actions is very limited, and that permit fees be waived as it is a governmental agency.

It is requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it authorize the issuance of a 3-year permit to the Illinois Natural History Survey to periodically access District real estate located along the Main Channel and the Des Plaines River in Will County, DuPage County and Cook County to conduct its study of the winter ecology of Canadian Geese in the Greater Chicago Metropolitan Area. Consideration shall be a nominal fee of \$10.00.

The Village of Willow Springs ("Willow Springs") leases approximately 2.13 acres of District real estate under a lease agreement between Willow Springs and the District that commenced January 1, 1989 and expires December 31, 2014. The permitted use under the lease is for the operation of a Metra commuter parking lot. The current rent under the lease is 8% of the gross parking receipts. The District receives approximately \$2,000.00/year.

Authority to enter into an agreement with the Wheeling Park District for modifications to athletic field shade structures associated with Contract 09-365-5F, Heritage Park Flood Control Facility.

Dear Sir:

Authority is requested to enter into an agreement with the Wheeling Park District (WPD) for modifications to the athletic field shade structures associated with the captioned project. At the November 6, 2008, Board Meeting, the Board of Commissioners granted its approval to enter into agreements with the WPD and the Village of Wheeling (Village) for the construction of stormwater storage facilities and improvements at Heritage Park. The District entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement with the WPD and the Village, dated April 1, 2010, for the acquisition, design, construction, use, operation and maintenance of stormwater and recreational improvements, and on November 16, 2011 entered into an agreement with WPD for enhancements to the recreational improvements to be paid for by the WPD. On April 11, 2012, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to award Contract 09-365-5F Heritage Park Flood Control Facility to F.H. Paschen/Lake County Grading, A Joint Venture (FHP/LCG), in an amount not to exceed \$29,475,000.00.

The recreational improvements to be constructed by the District at the site include a baseball complex with four fields. In a letter dated September 8, 2014, the WPD requested that the District eliminate the dugout shade structures included in the District's contract plans and provide a credit to the WPD in an amount of \$11,525.93 based on a quotation provided by FHP/LCG for this work. The WPD indicated in their letter they would be responsible for obtaining any permits, licenses or approvals for the installation of dugout shade structures, including all associated permit fees.

As a condition of the new agreement, the amount to be credited to the WPD will be deducted from the funds to be paid to the District by the WPD as indicated in the November 16, 2011 agreement between the two parties. The agreement shall be subject to the approval of the Law Department as to form and legality.

Based on the foregoing, the WPD's request to eliminate the athletic field shade structures via a change order to the subject contract is reasonable and in the best interest of the District. Subject to authorization by the Board of Commissioners of this request, a board letter will be prepared for an upcoming regular board meeting to request authorization to execute a change order to decrease Contract 09-365-5F, Heritage Park Flood Control Facility, by an amount of \$11,525.93.

It is respectfully requested that the Board of Commissioners grant authority to enter into an agreement with the WPD for their requested athletic field shade structures associated with the Heritage Park Flood Control Facility. It is also requested that the Chairman of the Committee on Finance and the Clerk be authorized and directed to execute the agreement on behalf of the District.
