#### Dear Sir:

Authorization is requested to make payment to the DuPage River Salt Creek Workgroup (DRSCW) for the District's membership dues in the amount of \$68,662.00. The term of the District's membership is March 1, 2015 through February 29, 2016.

The Board of Commissioners authorized the District to become a member of the DRSCW on April 6, 2006. The DRSCW's purpose is to find less costly methods of complying with the Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) goals issued in 2005 by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) and approved by Region V of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. The DRSCW is also committed to reducing pollution loadings by water reclamation plants (WRPs) along the courses of the DuPage River and Salt Creek, which includes the Egan and Hanover Park WRPs. The IEPA has been very receptive to initiatives and recommendations made by the DRSCW, which has worked tirelessly to foster partnerships with non-governmental organizations, municipalities, and the regulatory community. All agencies with treatment plants discharging to the streams in the DRSCW area are members of the group.

The DRSCW maintains a monitoring program for review of area TMDLs and works closely with the IEPA to improve them. For example, when the TMDL development for the watersheds was reviewed in 2009, the DRSCW made a number of suggestions for improving the analysis. As a result, sediment oxygen demand analysis was dropped from the program. The accuracy of the TMDLs is essential to making sound decisions regarding environmental and financial resources. Due to DRSCW's identified projects, which have improved dissolved oxygen, the IEPA recommendations of the 2004 Dissolved Oxygen TMDL for Salt Creek were not required to be implemented.

The DRSCW hosts several very successful chloride reduction workshops each year, some attended by District staff, to work towards compliance with the 2004 chloride TMDL.

The DRSCW operates four permanent dissolved oxygen monitoring stations in Salt Creek and three in the West Branch of the DuPage River. The DRSCW has multiple sample sites in Cook County; at these sites, water column chemistry and biology are measured every three years. The District contributes water quality data, acquired for District purposes, and technical expertise to this program.

The District thereafter received a request from Skokie Motor Sales, Inc. to lease the site to use for parking and storing cars in conjunction with its adjacent car dealership.

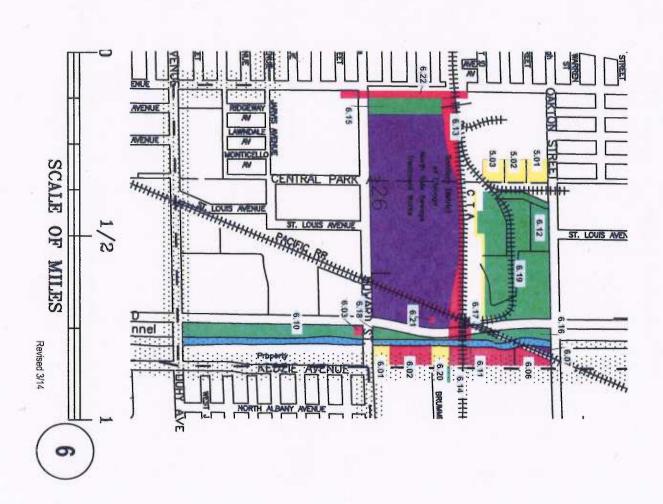

Authorization is requested to issue a purchase order and enter into an agreement with the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign (U of I) for Contract 15-833-5F Watershed Specific Release Rate Study, Phase I for the Illinois State Water Survey (ISWS) to conduct Phase I of an eventual two part Watershed Specific Release Rate Study for the Watershed Management Ordinance (WMO).

This study will be conducted under the auspices of the Master Agreement between U of I and the District, authorized by the Board of Commissioners at the Board Meeting of September 19, 2002, and amended to extend the expiration date by the Board of Commissioners at the Board Meetings of October 16, 2003, May 3, 2007, December 16, 2010 and March 15, 2012.

The purpose of the Master Agreement is to allow the District to directly take advantage of the expertise offered by U of I. ISWS is one of five Prairie Research Institute state scientific surveys formed as a group under the auspices of U of I. ISWS is familiar with the District's existing Detailed Watershed Plan hydrologic models that will be used as a basis to calculate runoff rates to determine watershed specific release rates. Per §504.3 of the WMO, the allowable release rate for stormwater detention is 0.30 cfs/acre of development for a 100-year storm event throughout the County's six watershed areas. This will change to watershed specific release rates on May 1, 2019. To determine the specific release rates, hydrologic and hydraulic models will be used to simulate future impacts of changing land use while simultaneously accounting for the stormwater mitigation provided by the WMO. ISWS has experience with modeling and access to robust modeling and hardware capabilities through U of I. With their regulatory experience and access to mapping information, the ISWS is uniquely positioned to produce a defensible and objective standard in determining watershed specific release rates.

The entire study will be completed in two phases. Phase I, for which this authorization is sought, will evaluate two pilot study areas, the first being the East and West Branches of Stony Creek in the Calumet-Sag watershed which includes several combined sewer area sub-basins. These areas are representative of more urban and industrial development. The second pilot study area is the Upper Salt Creek, which includes sub-basins representing more suburban separate sewer areas. Phase I will determine recommended specific release rates

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for the two pilot study areas and develop a streamlined methodology and set of assumptions that will be used in a follow-on Phase II study, which will determine the specific release rates for the remaining watershed areas. Authorization for the Phase II study will be sought separately, upon completion of the Phase I study.

The time to establish Phase I watershed specific release rates for the two pilot study areas is fifteen months at a total cost of \$398,000.00 with a \$25,000.00 contingency for a not to exceed cost of \$423,000.00.

Since the services to be provided are professional in nature, and the aforementioned university is reputable, it is recommended that the purchase order be issued without advertising, as per Section 11.4 of the Purchasing Act.

In view of the foregoing, it is recommended that the Director of Procurement and Materials Management be authorized to issue a purchase order and enter into an agreement with the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, in an amount not to exceed \$423,000.00.

At the Board Meeting of December 6, 2012, in accordance with Contract 12-RFP-22, the Board of Commissioners awarded a purchase order to Willis of Illinois, Inc. (Willis) to serve as the District's broker-of-record for property insurance and related services for a three-year period. In this capacity, Willis has responsibility for securing quotes from the insurance market for specified insurance policies, and presenting the quotes from qualified carriers to the Risk Manager for review and recommendation of a selected carrier to the Director of Procurement and Materials Management. The current property insurance policy will expire on July 17, 2015.

On June 2, 2015, the District received the renewal bid quotation which Willis had solicited from AIG/Lexington pursuant to the detailed specifications for property, a minimum of existing insurance policy terms and conditions, and updated property values for property insurance for a one-year period to be effective July 17, 2015 to provide insurance coverage for District property. District property includes buildings, structures and equipment at water reclamation plants, pumping stations, the Lockport Powerhouse, and offices. Policy limits and terms are the same as the expiring coverage, with the exception of an increase in the sublimit applicable to outdoor property. In addition, AIG/Lexington committed to a rate reduction of 2.5% for the 2015 insurance placement as well as another 2.5% rate reduction for the 2016 placement, should the District elect to accept it at that time.

AIG/Lexington: Limit \$1,500,000,000.00, Deductible \$1,000,000.00, Pricing \$1,988,516.89.

As with the expiring coverage, sublimits apply for earth movement and flood and water damage, in the amount of \$250,000,000.00 annual aggregate for each, except for the Lockport Powerhouse where the sublimit for flood and water damage is \$200,000,000.00 annual aggregate.

The District's insurable values for 2015 increased \$355,073,131.00 over the prior year primarily due to new construction. The impact of this increase is mitigated by the rate reduction, resulting in a renewal premium increase of only \$17,733.89.

Insurable values for the District are in excess of \$10,400,000,000.00. Full marketing efforts in 2013 resulted in identifying only one other carrier who had the capacity to offer the policy limits required. However, that carrier's proposal contained a number of significant and undesirable sublimits and restrictions in coverage.

The proposal terms and conditions were evaluated by Willis, the Risk Manager, and representatives from the Procurement and Materials Management Department. Based on their collective review, it was determined that the District should purchase property coverage from AIG/Lexington. The company is licensed to do business in Illinois, complies with the insurance ratings requirements and, although a non-admitted carrier, the company's rating is stable and it has a reputation for excellent service.

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In view of the foregoing, it is recommended that the Director of Procurement and Materials Management be authorized to issue a purchase order to Willis of Illinois, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$1,988,516.89.

Four hundred thirty (430) companies were notified of this contract being advertised and twenty-five (25) companies requested specifications.

Christy Webber and Company, the lowest responsible bidder for Group A, is proposing to perform the contract in accordance with the specifications. The estimated cost for Group A was \$1,474,700.00, placing the bid of \$1,323,000.00, approximately 10.3 percent below the estimate.

Christy Webber and Company is in compliance with the Affirmative Action Interim Ordinance Appendix D as indicated on the attached report. The Minority Business Enterprise (MBE), Women Business Enterprise (WBE) and Small Business Enterprise (SBE) utilization goals for this contract are 10 percent MBE; the bidder offers themselves to satisfy WBE participation; and the bidder offers MBE credits to satisfy the Small Business Enterprise (SBE) participation.

Tallgrass Restoration, LLC, the lowest bidder for Group H, sent a letter to the District indicating they will not be able to comply with the Multi-Project Labor Agreement (MPLA). In accordance to the contract documents, the bid submitted by Tallgrass Restoration, LLC is considered non-responsive and rejected in the public's best interest. The Director of Procurement and Materials Management has notified Tallgrass Restoration, LLC of this action.

Native Landscape Contractors, LLC, the lowest responsible bidder for Group H, is proposing to perform the contract in accordance with the specifications. The estimated cost for Group H was \$493,000.00, placing the bid of \$438,724.00, approximately 11 percent below the estimate.

The Affirmative Action Interim Ordinance Appendix D was not included for Group E and H based on the review from the Diversity Administrator prior to advertising.

The contractors have executed the Multi-Project Labor Agreement (MPLA) certificate as required. It is anticipated that the following trades will be utilized on this contract: operating engineers and laborers. The list of construction trades is not intended to confer any rights or jurisdiction upon any union or unions.

The bid submitted by Christy Webber & Company for Group C, in the amount of \$1,185,300.00, is approximately 104 percent over the estimated cost of \$579,700.00 and is considered too high to award. Therefore, the bid is rejected in the public's best interest. The Director of Procurement and Materials Management has notified Christy Webber & Company of this action.

Herrera Landscape, Inc. (Herrera) submitted the low bids for Groups B, F and G. The Diversity Section reviewed the utilization plans submitted by Herrera for the above groups. Herrera only submitted one set of MBE and WBE utilization pages and one set of MBE, WBE and SBE subcontractor's letter of intent for Groups B, F and G with no information on how to apply the dollar values per each group.

The contract documents for 15-665-11 lists each Utilization Plan separately for each group, whereby each firm proposed to meet the contract goals would be listed and the dollar amount to be allocated to the certified firms. Herrera did not properly submit the compliance documents as provided in the contract documents nor did they provide the dollar amounts to be allocated to the certified firms for each group.

Herrera failed to comply with the Affirmative Action Interim Ordinance Appendix D Section 12 Utilization Plan Submission (a), (b) and (c).

(a) Compliance documents must be submitted as provided in the solicitation. Failure to do so will render

- the bid non-responsive. The Director shall review each bid submission to determine if it meets the requirements herein.
- (b) A Bidder must either meet the Utilization Contract Goals or establish its Good Faith Efforts to do so as described in Appendix D and solicitation.
- (c) Each bidder shall submit with its bid a completed and signed Utilization Plan that lists the names, addresses, telephone numbers, email addresses and a description of the work with contract item number and contact person of the business intended to be used as subcontractors, subconsultants and suppliers, including those firms proposed to meet the Contract Goal(s); the type of work or service each business will perform; and the dollar amount to be allocated to the certified firm(s). Each Bidder's Utilization Plan shall commit to MBE, WBE or SBE participation equal to or greater than each of the Contract Goals set forth in the solicitation, unless the Bidder requests a partial or total waiver of the requirement that it file a Utilization Plan or achieve a particular goal by submitting with the bid a signed Waiver Request in the form specified in the solicitation.

The Diversity Section recommends that the bid submitted by Herrera for Groups B, F and G be considered non-responsive and rejected for failure to comply with the Affirmative Action Interim Ordinance Appendix D. The Director of Procurement and Materials Management concurs with the Diversity Section and has informed Herrera of this action.

In view of the foregoing, it is recommended that the Director of Procurement and Materials Management be authorized to award Contract 15-665-11, Group A to Christy Webber & Company, in an amount not to exceed \$1,323,000.00, and Group H to Native Landscape Contractors LLC, in an amount not to exceed \$438,724.00, subject to the contractors furnishing a performance bond in form satisfactory to the Law Department and approved by the Director of Procurement and Materials Management.

Groups B, C, D, E, F and G will be re-advertised.

The contractor shall commence work upon approval of the contractor's bond and terminate four years thereafter, or upon expenditure of available funds, whichever occurs sooner.

The contract will employ approximately 35 to 40 people for the services.

Funds for the 2015 expenditures for Group A, in the amount of \$250,300.00, are available in Account 101-69000-612420. The estimated expenditures for 2016, 2017 and 2018 are \$363,300.00, \$363,300.00 and \$346,100.00, respectively. Funds for 2016, 2017 and 2018 expenditures are contingent on the Board of Commissioners' approval of the District's budget for that year.

Funds for the 2015 expenditures for Group H, in the amount of \$109,681.00, are available in Account 101-69000-612420. The estimated expenditures for 2016, 2017 and 2018 are \$109,681.00, \$109,681.00 and \$109,681.00, respectively. Funds for 2016, 2017 and 2018 expenditures are contingent on the Board of Commissioners' approval of the District's budget for that year.

On April 17, 2014, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to award Contract 14-839-11 Services to Manually Clean the TARP Bar Screens at the Calumet Water Reclamation Plant, to Independent Mechanical Industries, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$885,342.00. The contract expires on December 31, 2016.

As of April 28, 2015, the attached list of change orders has been approved. The effect of these change orders resulted in a decrease in an amount of \$4,742.00 from the original amount awarded of \$885,342.00. The current contract value is \$880,600.00. The prior approved change orders reflect a less than 1% decrease to the original contract value.

The decrease is because one less screen cleaning operation is needed than was originally planned for 2015.

This change order is in compliance with the Illinois Criminal Code since the change is due to circumstances not reasonably foreseeable at the time the contract was signed, and is in the best interest of the District.

On May 6, 2010, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to award Contract 04-202-4F Connecting Tunnels & Gates, Thornton Composite Reservoir, Calumet Service Area, to Walsh/II in One, Joint Venture, in an amount not to exceed \$135,475,200.00. The scheduled contract completion date was May 14, 2015. The anticipated contract completion date is December 10, 2015.

As of June 5, 2015, the attached list of change orders has been approved. The effect of these change orders resulted in an increase in an amount of \$1,102,470.92 from the original amount awarded of \$135,475,200.00. The current contract value is \$136,577,670.92. The prior approved change orders reflect a 0.81% increase to the original contract value.

The contractor requested to increase the diffuser slab panel lengths from 32 feet, as specified in the contract, to 64 feet in order to minimize the slab construction time. Although the overall dimensions of the diffuser slab do not change, this modification results in a reduction in the overall number of panels to pour and the total length of the construction joints required for the diffuser slab. The contractor submitted a cost proposal (CCO-10) for a credit in the amount of \$20,562.23. The Engineer reviewed the proposal, found it reasonable, and stated via correspondence 1531, that the Engineering Department would recommend its approval.

This change order is in compliance with the Illinois Criminal Code since the change is germane to the contract.

It is hereby recommended that the Board of Commissioners authorize the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to execute a change order to decrease Contract 04-202-4F in an amount of \$20,562.23 (0.02% of the current contract value), from an amount of \$136,577,670.92, to an amount not to exceed \$136,557,108.69.

The scheduled contract completion date is November 1, 2015.

As of June 5, 2015, the attached list of change orders has been approved. The Law Department seeks approval to enter into a settlement agreement with Progressive Northern Insurance Co. ("Progressive") for damages to its insured's vehicle due to an accident with a District vehicle driven by District employee, Mark Kirchman ("Kirchman").

The Complaint alleges that on January 30, 2014, Mr. Kirchman was exiting a parking lot in the area of Des Plaines Avenue and Roosevelt Road in Chicago, Illinois, when he struck Ms. Weis-Kelly's vehicle, sustaining damages to her vehicle in the amount of \$4,037.32.

The District's Law Department has filed an appearance on behalf of Mr. Kirchman. An initial evaluation of the collision reveals that liability cannot be definitively established without further investigation, likely involving retention of an accident reconstructionist. Jeff Deutschmann, the attorney representing Progressive, contacted the District in an attempt to negotiate a settlement. After much negotiation, Progressive has demanded \$3,030.00, and the Risk Management Department has indicated that this demand is acceptable.

Based upon the cost of further investigating and litigating this matter, the Law Department believes it is in the District's best interest to settle in the amount of \$3,030.00. Therefore, the General Counsel respectfully requests that the Executive Director approve the settlement in the amount of \$3,030.00 and that the General Counsel be given the authority to execute such documents as may be necessary to effectuate settlement.

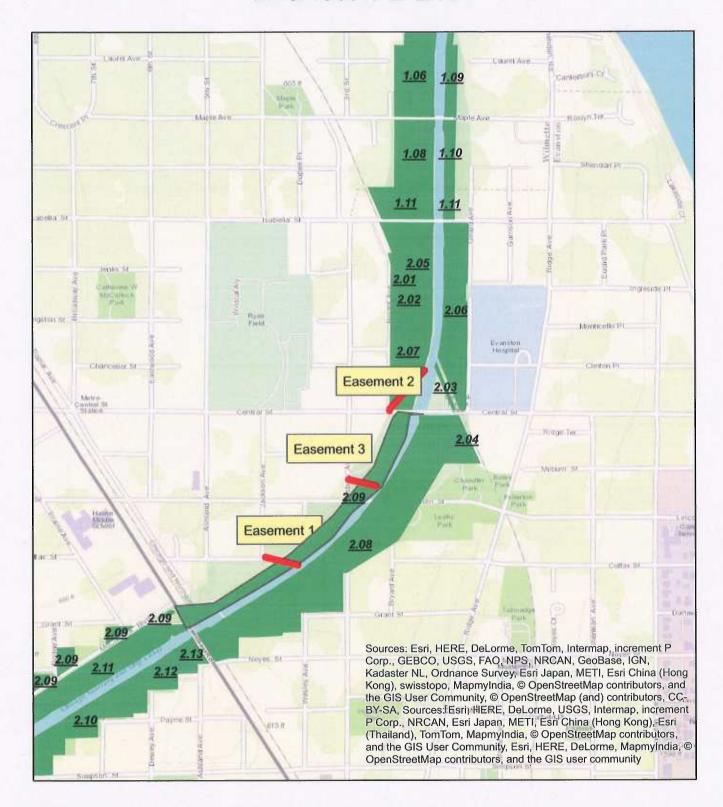

Consideration shall be \$10.00

#### Dear Sir:

On February 21, 1991, the District granted a 25-year easement to the City of Evanston ("Evanston") to construct, maintain, operate, repair and remove four (4) storm sewers, connecting structures, and outfalls to the North Shore Channel through North Shore Channel Parcels 3.06 and 6.20 in Skokie, Illinois. The subject easement expires February 20, 2016, and is subject to a \$10.00 fee. Parcel 3.06 is under lease to the Village of Skokie for public recreational purposes and this easement is therefore subject to its consent. Parcel 6.20 is vacant.

The easement comprises the following four areas: (1) a 40' x 280' area 10' south of the centerline of Dropshaft 101 for a 72' diameter relief sewer, a connecting structure, two 60' overflow pipes, and an outfall structure;(2) a 30' x 40' area east of Dropshaft 101 for connecting pipe to the Dropshaft; (3) a 40' x 210' area east of McCormick Boulevard and north of Dropshaft 107 for a 108" diameter sewer, connecting structure, two 7' x 7' overflow pipelines, and an outfall structure, (4) a 20' x 150' area north of Dropshaft 107 for the 108" diameter connecting pipe.

Evanston has requested a new 25-year easement to continue to operate the sewers and outfalls. The District's technical departments have no objections to granting the easement for Evanston's continued operation of the facilities. A nominal fee of \$10.00 is recommended as is customary for governmental entities occupying District land for a public purpose.

It is requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it grant a 25-year, non-exclusive easement to the City of Evanston for the continued operation, maintenance, and repair of four (4) storm sewers, connecting structures, and outfalls to the North Shore Channel through North Shore Channel Parcels 3.06 and 6.20 in Skokie, Illinois. Consideration shall be \$10.00.

It is also requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it authorize and direct the Chairman of the Committee on Finance and the Clerk to execute the easement agreement after it is approved by the General Counsel as to form and legality.

Authority to issue a three (3) year permit extension to the Illinois Department of Natural Resources for continued access to Main Channel Parcel 15.05 in Lockport, Will County, Illinois to launch and retrieve boats to collect and analyze aquatic species in the Main Channel. Consideration shall be a nominal fee of \$10.00

#### Dear Sir:

On July 14, 2011, the Board of Commissioners ("Board") authorized a one (1) year permit to the Illinois Department of Natural Resources ("IDNR") on Main Channel Parcel 15.05 to launch and retrieve boats to collect and analyze aquatic species in the Main Channel. The permit, as extended, expires August 31, 2015. IDNR has requested a further extension for a three (3) year period for continued access to Main Channel Parcel 15.05 to continue to launch and retrieve boats.

The Army Corps of Engineers ("Corps") operates two electric aquatic nuisance barriers north of the 135<sup>th</sup> Street Bridge in the Main Channel to monitor Asian Carp and other species in the vicinity. The Board has authorized use of the boat ramp by IDNR and certain other state and federal agencies working with the Corps to launch boats to conduct surveys of fish populations and to collect fish species, including Asian Carp, to determine the effectiveness of the barriers.

IDNR now estimates that it will need an additional three (3) years to complete the monitoring project. IDNR plans to use the site 2-4 times per month and will be responsible for safety protocols for the boats and their crews.

The District's technical departments have reviewed this request and have no objections to issuing a three (3) year permit extension to IDNR. As is customary for agreements with government entities using District property for public purposes, it is recommended that consideration be a nominal fee of \$10.00.

It is requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it authorize and approve the issuance of a three (3) year permit extension to the Illinois Department of Natural Resources for continued access to Main Channel Parcel 15.05 in Lockport, Will County, Illinois to launch and retrieve boats to collect and analyze aguatic species in the Main Channel. Consideration shall be a nominal fee of \$10.00.

It is also requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it authorize and direct the Chairman of the Committee on Finance and the Clerk to execute the permit extension agreement after it is approved by the General Counsel as to form and legality.

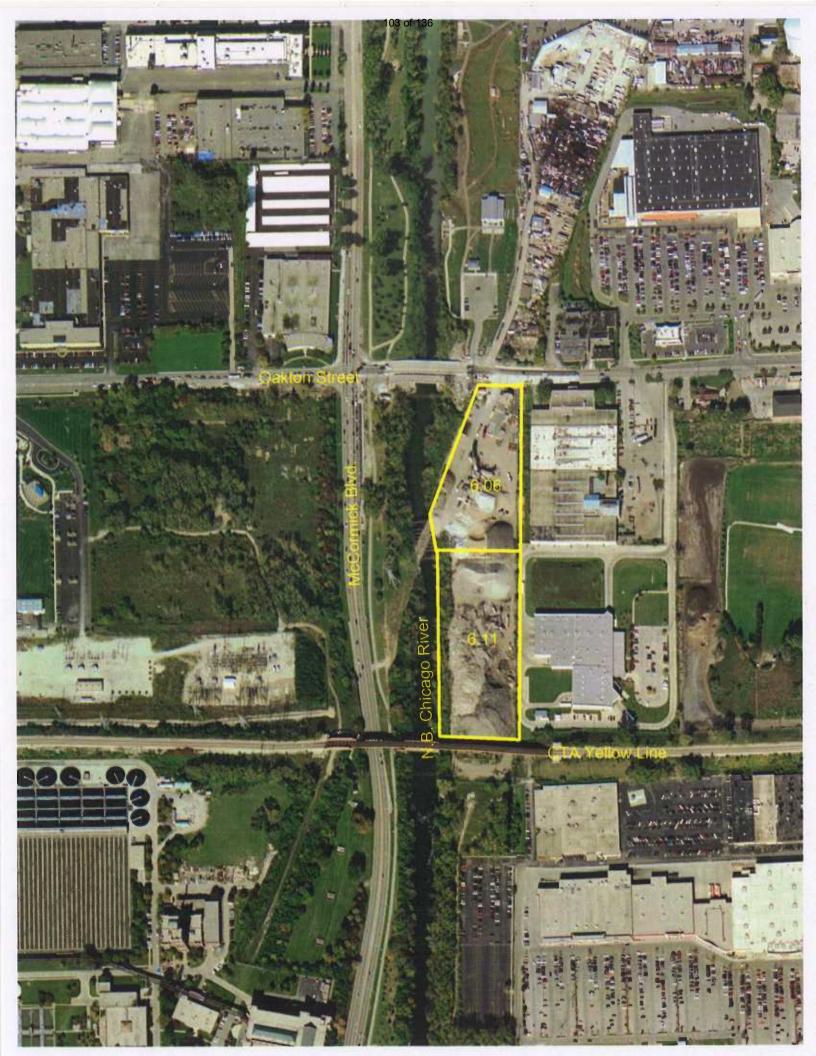

#### Dear Sir:

The Chicago Transit Authority ("CTA") leases 9.66 acres of District real estate under a lease that commenced January 1, 1955, and, as extended, expires June 30, 2015, to operate a rapid transit railroad line currently known as the "Yellow Line" for public transportation purposes ("Lease"). The leasehold is located along the northern boundary of the O'Brien Water Reclamation Plant in Skokie, Illinois, east and west of McCormick Boulevard and known as North Shore Channel Parcels 6.13 and 6.14. The current annual rent under the Lease is \$35,675.00.

The Lease was originally set to expire on December 31, 2014. Prior to the 2014 expiration, the CTA indicated that it anticipated leasing less than the current 9.66 acres that it leases under its current Lease, but needed additional time to review its land use needs under a new lease. Accordingly, on December 4, 2014, the Board of Commissioners authorized a six-month extension to the Lease to allow the CTA the additional time it requested. The Lease amendment agreement extended the Lease to June 30, 2015.

The CTA has now requested a further extension of its Lease to September 30, 2015.

A nominal fee of \$10.00 is recommended since the CTA is unable to currently conduct its normal operations on the leasehold premises.

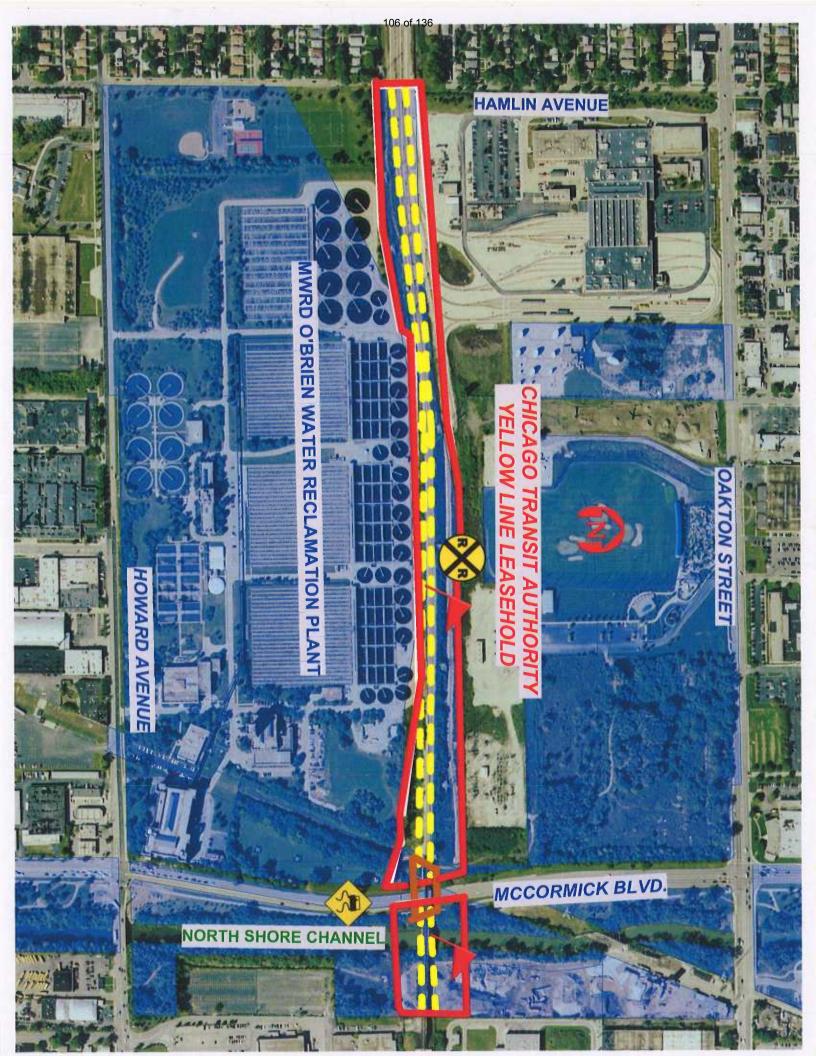

On December 6, 2001, the Board of Commissioners issued orders authorizing a 25-year easement to FutureMark Paper, formerly known as Alsip Paper Condominium Association, to operate and maintain a pumping station, an intake conduit, a sewer and appurtenances related thereto on District real estate located north of the Cal-Sag Channel and east of Crawford Avenue, in Alsip, Illinois on a portion of Cal-Sag Channel Parcel 13.04. FutureMark Paper's assets were recently purchased by Alsip MiniMill, LLC in a bankruptcy action. Under the easement, FutureMark paid an annual fee of \$2,000.00. The 2001 easement was not part of the bankruptcy proceedings. The grant of a new easement to the purchaser of FutureMark Paper is therefore necessary.

The technical departments have no objections to the grant of an easement to Alsip MiniMill, LLC. An annual fee of \$2,850.00 is recommended as such represents 10% of the fair market value of the land based upon a recent appraisal of a nearby comparable site.

Authority to issue a 15-month permit extension to The Peoples Gas Light and Coke Company on approximately 9.71 acres of District real estate located west of Pulaski Road and north of the Main Channel in Chicago, Illinois, and known as Main Channel Parcels 40.04 and 40.07 for continued operation and maintenance of its natural gas pipeline and to perform environmental testing. Consideration shall be \$237,919.00

Dear Sir:

The Peoples Gas Light and Coke Company ("Peoples Gas") occupied approximately 9.71 acres of District real estate located west of Pulaski Road and north of the Main Channel in Chicago and known as Main Channel Parcel 40.07 under a 99-year lease that commenced in 1916, and as amended, expired on January 31, 2015, to operate a natural gas pipeline and appurtenances related thereto. The annual rent under the lease was \$41,873.00. On January 22, 2015, the Board of Commissioners authorized a six (6) month permit to allow continued use and occupancy of the leasehold site by Peoples Gas until July 31, 2015.

Peoples Gas requested to continue to occupy the subject land upon expiration of its lease. However, the property contains contamination as a result of migration from Peoples Gas' former Manufactured Gas Plant ("MGP") site located north of the leasehold and as a result of certain historical ancillary MGP operations on the subject site during the first half of Peoples Gas' lease term. Additionally, Peoples Gas has requested to enter Parcel 40.04 to perform environmental testing since it is adjacent to Parcel 40.07 to determine if migration of contamination is occurring.

Peoples Gas also leases approximately 4.46 acres of District real estate located east of Cicero Avenue and north of the Main Channel and known as Main Channel Parcel 40.02 ("Parcel 40.02") under a lease that commenced November 1, 1917, and expires on October 31, 2016, to operate a natural gas line and appurtenances related thereto. Parcel 40.02 also contains contamination as a result of migration from Peoples Gas' MGP site and as a result of certain historical ancillary MGP operations. A long-term occupancy agreement cannot be entered into until the site investigation plan and ultimate environmental remediation plan on all effected District property is determined.

Accordingly, a 15-month permit is recommended so that the permit on Parcels 40.04 and 40.07 can expire simultaneously with the lease on Parcel 40.02. At that time, the parcels can be combined into one long-term occupancy agreement with a comprehensive environmental remediation plan on the three parcels.

The technical departments have no objections to Peoples Gas' request for a permit extension. A permit fee of \$237,919.00 is recommended as such represents 10% of the appraised fair market value of the site.

It is requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it authorize and approve the issuance of a 15-month permit extension to The Peoples Gas Light and Coke Company on

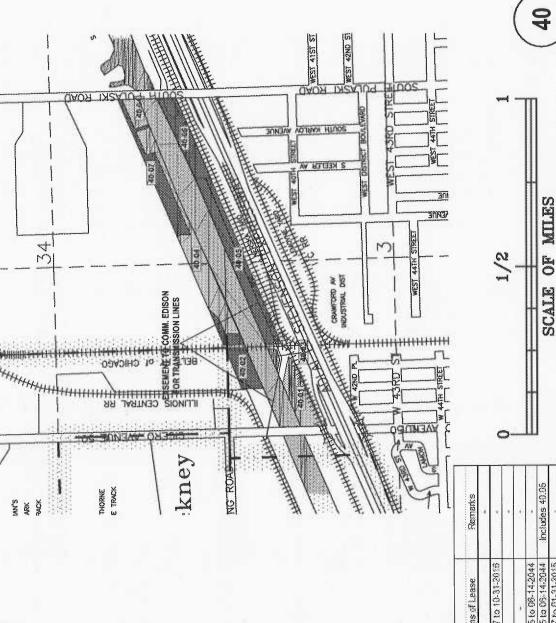

The Illinois State Toll Highway Authority ("ISTHA") has requested a permit to widen and extend an existing access road located west of Higgins Road at the Majewski Reservoir Site to remove approximately five hundred thousand (500,000) cubic yards of soil for roadway improvement in connection with the construction of the O'Hare Western Access Project, ("Project").

Pursuant to an Intergovernmental Agreement entered into among ISTHA, the District and the Mt. Prospect Park District ("Park District") on September 4, 2014, ISTHA agreed to remove the referenced soils as part of the Project. The Park District leases the area that contains the soil piles under a lease that commenced in 2000 and expires in 2050 for public recreational use. The soil will be removed by ISTHA at no cost to either the District or the Park District. ISTHA will ensure that the removal of the soil will result in grade elevation acceptable for recreational development by the Park District. A companion transmittal letter is being submitted to the Board amending the Park District's lease to extend the time for the Park District to develop its leasehold after the removal of the soil piles are completed.

The District's technical departments have reviewed this request and have no objections to issuing the permit to ISTHA. A nominal fee of \$10.00 is recommended as is customary with governmental entities using District property for public purposes.

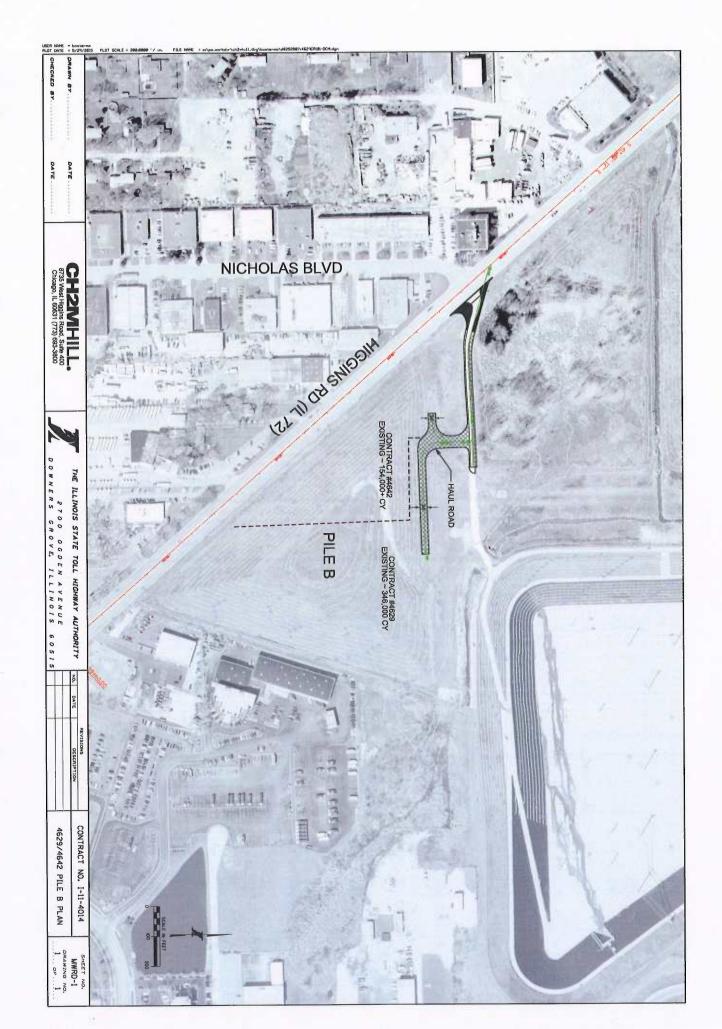

#### Dear Sir:

On April 5, 2012, the Board of Commissioners authorized the issuance of a 39-year lease to the Mount Prospect Park District ("Mt. Prospect") on 34.239 acres of District real estate located east of Elmhurst Road and south of the James C. Kirie Water Reclamation Plant and known as Majewski Metro Park ("Lease"). The Lease commenced July 1, 2012, and expires June 30, 2051. The annual rent is \$10.00. The lease also provides that the District shall receive 25% of the net profits derived from the site, if any. The leasehold is improved with baseball and soccer fields and a small building.

In February, 2015, the District sold approximately 2.48 acres of Mt. Prospect's Majewski Metro Park leasehold to the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority for construction of its Elgin O'Hare Western Access Project. As a result of the sale, Mt. Prospect's leasehold size was reduced from 34.239 acres to 31.759 acres. An amendment to Mt. Prospect's Lease is therefore necessary to reflect the reduced size of its leasehold.

It is requested the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it authorize and approve an amendment to the lease agreement dated April 5, 2012, between the District and the Mount Prospect Park District on 34.239 acres of District real estate located east of Elmhurst Road and south of the James C. Kirie Water Reclamation Plant and known as Majewski Metro Park in Des Plaines, Illinois to reduce the leasehold by approximately 2.48 acres. Consideration shall be a nominal fee of \$10.00.

Authority to amend lease agreement dated July 13, 2000, between the District and the Mount Prospect Park District on 50.40 acres of District real estate located at the Majewski Reservoir site to extend the construction commencement date to May 20, 2020 for constructing, operating and maintaining recreational facilities. Consideration shall be a nominal fee of \$10.00

#### Dear Sir:

On July 13, 2000, the Board of Commissioners authorized the issuance of a 50-year lease to the Mount Prospect Park District ("Mt. Prospect") on 50.40 acres of District real estate located at the Majewski Reservoir site, f/k/a the O'Hare CUP Reservoir site, for construction and operation of recreational facilities ("Lease"). The Lease commenced December 1, 2000 and expires November 30, 2050. The annual rent under the Lease is \$10.00. Upon construction of the improvements, the Lease provides for the District to receive 25% of the net profits derived from the site. Mt. Prospect initially proposed to improve the site with a golf driving range, three-hole golf teaching course, miniature golf, perimeter bike path, a winter recreational area, and administration, maintenance and parking facilities. The site contains large spoil piles deposited on site from the excavation of the Majewski Reservoir.

The Lease required Mt. Prospect to commence construction of the recreational improvements within two years from the Lease commencement date. The Lease, as amended, provides for a construction commencement date of May 20, 2015. Mt. Prospect indicated that the original plans proposed at the time the Lease was entered into would cost between \$5 million and \$10 million and that it was contemplating less costly improvements such as mountain bike trails, paintball, disc golf, and supporting facilities.

In 2014, the District, ISTHA and Mt. Prospect entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement allowing ISTHA to remove 500,000 cubic yards of soil from the spoil piles for roadway improvement work in connection with the construction of the O'Hare Western Access Project. The removal of the soil by ISTHA from Mt. Prospect's leasehold will aid it in implementing its site improvement work. Accordingly, Mt. Prospect has requested an amendment to its Lease to provide for an additional five (5) years to commence construction of its improvements so that ISTHA can remove the spoil piles from its leasehold. ISTHA has estimated that the spoil piles will be removed within three (3) years. IDOT's highway improvement project consists of rebuilding the south approach of the elevated Western Avenue Bridge structure at the subject location. The easement premises will be used for staging construction equipment and materials for the subject highway improvement project.

Because the pro-rata share of the fair market value is less than the District's standard minimum fee of \$2,500.00, an easement fee of \$2,500.00 is recommended.

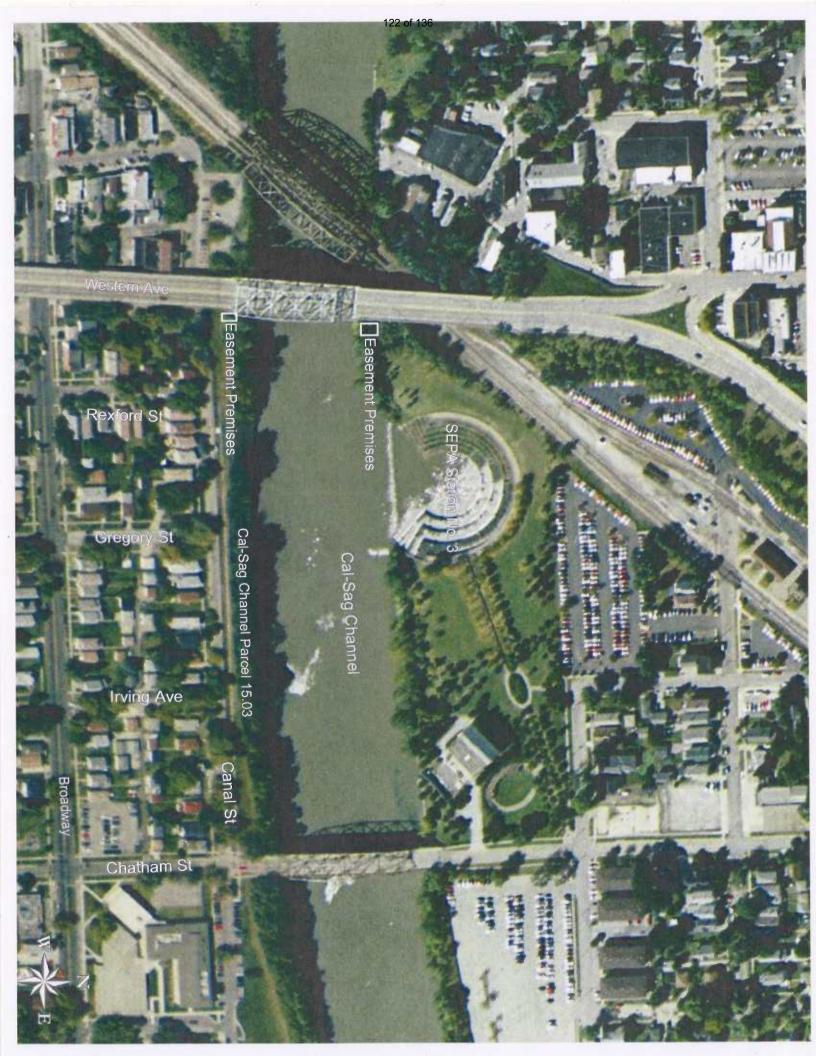

Authority to enter into an intergovernmental agreement with the Village of Barrington Hills whereby the Village of Barrington Hills will enforce the Lake County Watershed Development Ordinance for the entire Village of Barrington Hills

Dear Sir:

Authority is requested to enter into an intergovernmental agreement (IGA) with the Village of Barrington Hills (Village) whereby the Village will enforce the Lake County Watershed Development Ordinance (LCWDO) for the entire Village.

On April 3, 2014, the Board of Commissioners granted authority to negotiate IGAs with multi-county municipalities interested in adopting and enforcing a respective collar county's stormwater ordinance in lieu of the stormwater management provisions of the Watershed Management Ordinance (WMO) as stipulated in Article 2, Section 207 of the WMO.

The IGA will effectuate the Village's status as a multi-county municipality under the WMO. The IGA requires the Village to issue stormwater permits, conduct inspections and maintain records. Additionally, the IGA provides the District with a mechanism to audit the Village. The District will not require a Watershed Management Permit for most development activities within the Village; however, the District will require a Watershed Management Permit for sanitary sewer construction and impacts to District-owned infrastructure.

The District received a letter of intent from the Village requesting status as a multi-county municipality. The Village has adopted and currently enforces the LCWDO. The District examined the letter of intent and determined that the Village meets the requirements contained in Article 2, Section 207 of the WMO.

It is respectfully requested that the Board of Commissioners grant authority to enter into an IGA with the Village of Barrington Hills whereby the Village will adopt and enforce the LCWDO for the entire Village and that the Chairman of the Committee on Stormwater Management, the Executive Director and the Clerk be authorized to execute said IGA on behalf of the District upon approval by the Director of Engineering as to technical matters and by the General Counsel as to form and legality.

Future requests for authority to enter into IGAs with other multi-county municipalities for purposes of enforcing stormwater management provisions of a collar county's stormwater management ordinance will be submitted to the Board of Commissioners as requests are submitted by municipalities and after their qualifications have been evaluated by the Engineering Department.

Authority to enter into an intergovernmental agreement with the Illinois Department of Natural Resources to continue participation in the Chi-Cal Rivers Fund, with a contribution to the Illinois Department of Natural Resources in the amount of \$500,000.00

#### Dear Sir:

Authorization is requested to enter into an intergovernmental agreement ("IGA") with the Illinois Department of Natural Resources ("IDNR") to continue the District's participation in the Chi-Cal Rivers Fund ("Fund"), with a contribution to the IDNR in the amount of \$500,000.00.

On May 7, 2015, the Board of Commissioners authorized the District to begin negotiations with the IDNR for an IGA that would include provisions allowing the District to contribute toward the Fund. Since then, the District and IDNR have agreed, in principle, as to the terms of the IGA.

The District has committed to implement a Green Infrastructure Program Plan in conformance with Appendix E, Section II (C) of a certain consent decree entered into in <u>United States</u>, <u>et al.</u>, <u>v. Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago</u>, Case No. 1:11-cv-08859 (N.D. III. 2014)("Consent Decree"). The District's contribution to the Fund will be used for green infrastructure throughout the District service area, and the District intends to seek credit for this green infrastructure under the Consent Decree.

In order to maximize the benefit of the \$500,000.00 that the District intends to contribute, the District will partner with IDNR through the IGA and draw on IDNR's unique expertise with regard to green infrastructure projects. Pursuant to the IGA, the District will contribute \$500,000.00 to the IDNR, and IDNR will, in turn, provide that money to the Fund for projects relating to green infrastructure within the District service area. The Fund would then leverage the District's contribution to attract additional funding from private donors such as ArcelorMital, Crown Family Philanthropies, Gaylord & Dorothy Donnelly Foundation, Wrigley Company Foundation, The Chicago Community Trust, and the Joyce Foundation. The District and IDNR would then participate with the Fund's administrator, the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation, in evaluating worthwhile green infrastructure projects to fund. For its services, the Fund's administrator will charge an administrative fee in the range of 10% to 15% of the \$500,000.00 contribution.

The proposed draft IGA is attached.

Based on the foregoing, the Law Department recommends that the Board of Commissioners authorize the District to enter into an IGA with the IDNR to participate in the Fund, with contribution to the IDNR in the amount of \$500,000.00, and that the Chairman of the Committee on Finance, the Executive Director, and the Clerk be authorized to execute said IGA on behalf of the District, upon approval by General Counsel as to form and legality.

## INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT between STATE OF ILLINOIS, DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND

#### The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago

THIS INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT ("Agreement") entered into, by and between the Illinois Department of Natural Resources, an administrative agency organized and existing under the laws of the State of Illinois ("Department"), and the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago, a unit of local government and body politic, organized and existing under the laws of the State of Illinois ("MWRD").

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, on November 17, 2004, the Illinois General Assembly passed Public Act 093-1049 for stormwater management purposes by the MWRD under the Metropolitan Water Reclamation Act, 70 ILCS 2605 et seq. (hereinafter the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Act declares that stormwater management in Cook County shall be under the general supervision of the MWRD (70 ILCS 2605/7h); and

WHEREAS, the Act specifically authorizes the MWRD to plan, manage, implement, and finance activities relating to stormwater management in Cook County; and

WHEREAS, the MWRD has committed to implement a Green Infrastructure Program Plan in conformance with Appendix E, Section II (C) of a certain consent decree entered into in <u>United States</u>, <u>et al.</u>, <u>v. Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago</u>, Case No. 1:11-cv-08859 (N.D. III. 2014)("Consent Decree"), and the MWRD's formal commitment herein is intended to satisfy that obligation; and

WHEREAS, "green infrastructure" shall mean the range of stormwater control measures that use plant/soil systems, permeable pavement, stormwater harvest and reuse, or native landscaping to store, infiltrate, and/or evapotranspirate stormwater and reduce flows to the sewer systems or to surface waters as defined under Section 5 of the Green Infrastructure for Clean Water Act (415 ILCS 56/5); and

WHEREAS, the Department has the authority with respect to waterways and waterway improvements, canals, flood relief and water conservation to coordinate water uses to the end that water resources of the State are put to their maximum beneficial use under Section 5-5 and 5-10 of the Department of Natural Resources Act (20 ILCS 801/5-5 and 5-10); and

WHEREAS, the Department "has the power to accept, receive, expend, and administer, including by grant, agreement, or contract, those funds that are made available to the Department from the federal government and other public and private sources in the exercise of its statutory powers and duties" under Section 70a of the Department of Natural Resources (Conservation) Law (20 ILCS 805/805-70(a)); and

WHEREAS, the Department has significant experience coordinating green infrastructure projects, including the financing of such projects through the granting of public funds; and

WHEREAS, the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation ("Foundation"), is a non-profit organization established by Congress (16 U.S.C. 3701 *et seq.*) to encourage, accept, and administer public and private grants for the benefit of, or in conjunction with, various entities to undertake and conduct such activities as will reduce stormwater runoff with green infrastructure as well as further the conservation and management of fish, wildlife, and plant resources of the United States; and

WHEREAS, a team of public and private organizations created the Chi-Cal Rivers Fund ("Fund"), to be administered by the Foundation, in order to utilize funds from public and private donors for a variety of stated purposes, including enhancing green infrastructure in the Chicago River and Calumet River watersheds; and

WHEREAS, the MWRD's plan to contribute to green infrastructure may be more effective, economic, and comprehensive if the MWRD and the Department cooperate and use their joint efforts and resources; and

WHEREAS, in order to maximize the benefit of the \$500,000 that the MWRD intends to contribute towards green infrastructure, the MWRD seeks to partner with the Department and draw on its unique expertise with regard to green infrastructure projects; and

WHEREAS, the Department has determined that the most effective way to maximize the benefit of the MWRD's green infrastructure contribution is to grant that \$500,000 to the Fund and thereby leverage the money to attract additional funding from private donors for the purpose of green infrastructure improvement; and

WHEREAS, the Department and the MWRD will jointly participate with the Foundation during the selection process for grant applicants; and

**WHEREAS,** the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 *et seq.*, and Section 10 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution, allow and encourage intergovernmental cooperation; and

WHEREAS, on May 7, 2015, the MWRD's Board of Commissioners authorized the MWRD to negotiate an intergovernmental agreement with the Department and, on June 18, 2015, authorized the MWRD to formally enter into that intergovernmental agreement; and

**NOW THEREFORE,** in consideration of the matters set forth, the mutual covenants and agreements contained in this Agreement, and for other good and valuable consideration, the Department and MWRD hereby agree as follows:

- 1. **EFFECTIVE DATE:** This Agreement becomes effective on the date that the last signature is affixed hereto.
- 2. **PURPOSE, AMOUNT, AND CONDITIONS OF FUNDING:** The MWRD agrees to pay to the Department, and the Department agrees to accept, funds from the MWRD in the amount of \$500,000, to be deposited in an account of the Department used only for the purpose of fulfilling this agreement. The funds will not be available to any other state agency.

The Department agrees, upon receipt of the aforesaid funds, to grant \$500,000 to the Fund exclusively for projects relating to green infrastructure in the MWRD service area. The ultimate approval and award of any grants from these funds by the Fund shall be subject to the Department's and MWRD's written consent, through a subsequent

agreement with the Fund and the Foundation that complies with all of the Department's grant requirements. The Department may not use the funds for any other purpose, and any corresponding contract, agreement, or memorandum of understanding between the Department, Fund, and/or Foundation shall be subject to the written consent of the MWRD.

In addition, the Fund, the Foundation, and their grantees must comply with the MWRD's Purchasing Act (70 ILCS 2605/11.1-11.24) and the MWRD's Affirmative Action Requirements and Affirmative Action Ordinance (Attachment A).

Furthermore, in order to receive the grant, the Fund, the Foundation, and their grantees must comply with the Prevailing Wage Act, 820 ILCS 130/0.01 et seq. Current prevailing wage rates for Cook County are determined by the Illinois Department of Labor. The prevailing wage rates are revised by the Illinois Department of Labor and are available on the Department of Labor's official website. The Department will inform the Fund, Foundation, and their grantees that it is their responsibility to obtain and comply with any revisions to the rates should they change during the duration of the subject matter project(s).

If the Department or MWRD identifies any violation of the abovementioned statutes, ordinances, or regulations, that entity must immediately notify the other and, in the case of any such violation, both the MWRD and Department reserve the right to order that funds be withheld and refunded to the MWRD.

- 3. **TERMINATION:** This Agreement may be terminated in writing signed by either Director of the respective agencies or by their designee. If the MWRD or the Department terminates this agreement after the MWRD's disbursement of the \$500,000 to the Department, but prior to the Department's grant of that sum to the Fund as set forth in this Agreement, then the Department shall refund the entire disbursement to the MWRD within thirty (30) days of termination. Additionally, if the Department fails to complete its grant of the \$500,000 to the Fund by January 1, 2017, or if any of the granted money is not disbursed by the Fund for green infrastructure projects by that date, then this Agreement will automatically terminate and the Department shall recover and refund any unspent portion of the disbursement to the MWRD by January 31, 2017.
- 4. **LAWS OF ILLINOIS:** This Agreement shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the State of Illinois.
- 5. **INDEMNITY AND INSURANCE:** It is understood and agreed that neither party to the Agreement shall be liable for any negligent or wrongful acts either of commission or omission unless such liability is imposed by law.
- 6. **ENTIRE AGREEMENT:** This contract, including these attachments, constitutes the entirety of the Agreement between the parties and supersedes any other agreement or communication, whether written or oral, that may have been made by either party. Amendments or modifications to this Agreement must be in writing and signed by authorized representatives of the parties.
- 7. **NOTICES:** All notices, submissions or other correspondence required to be given to the Department or to the MWRD shall be delivered or mailed to the following addresses:

Authority to negotiate an intergovernmental agreement with the Forest Preserve District of Cook County to collaborate on the restoration and maintenance of the Lyons Levee

Dear Sir:

Authority is requested to negotiate an intergovernmental agreement (IGA) with the Forest Preserve District of Cook County (FPDCC) to collaborate on the restoration and maintenance of the Lyons Levee.

Lyons Levee was constructed by the District circa 1900 on District property. The property was sold to the FPDCC in 1950. Severe flooding occurred when the Lyons Levee was overtopped by the Des Plaines River in the Village of Forest View (Village) as a result of a severe rainfall event that occurred on April 18-19, 2013. The Village reported that about 270 homes and numerous businesses located along Harlem Avenue sustained flood damages as a result of this event.

On June 6, 2013, the Board of Commissioners granted authority to initiate the design of the Lyons Levee restoration. The restoration will include raising the Lyons Levee from Joliet Road downstream to south of 47th Street on property owned by the FPDCC. On January 23, 2014 the Board of Commissioners authorized the District to issue a purchase order to MC Consulting, Inc. for the preliminary engineering of the restoration of the Lyons Levee. The preliminary engineering is complete and proposes to raise the Lyons Levee by two to three feet vertically, to prevent levee overtopping during a 100-year flood event. The construction cost estimate for the levee restoration is approximately \$9.8 million.

An IGA will define the collaborative responsibilities of both the FPDCC and the District on this project. The District intends to design, construct, and maintain the structural components of the Lyons Levee, while the FPDCC would maintain the landscaping adjacent to the Lyons Levee. The IGA would also require the FPDCC to convey easements necessary for construction and maintenance. Additionally, the IGA would require the FPDCC to provide a monetary credit to the District for the District's expenditures on the Lyons Levee restoration.

Based on the foregoing, it is respectfully requested that the Board of Commissioners grant authority to negotiate an IGA with the FPDCC, which will include the above provisions. Once the parties agree in principle, authority to enter into an IGA will be sought from the Board of Commissioners.

MEMORIAL RESOLUTION sponsored by the Board of Commissioners extending sympathy and condolences to the family of Alice Lucille Tregay

WHEREAS, Alice Lucille Hicks was born on November 14, 1929 in Evanston to Roy and Fannie Hicks, the youngest of their six children; and

WHEREAS, Alice accepted Christ at an early age and was baptized at Ebenezer AME Church in Evanston, where she served as an usher; and

WHEREAS, in 1947 Alice married the late Vincent Lindsay and the couple had a daughter; and

WHEREAS, Alice had a son and another daughter with her husband James Tregay, who she married in 1964; and

WHEREAS, as an adult, Alice went back to school, attending Southeast Junior College and Roosevelt University; and

WHEREAS, Alice devoted her life to social change and community service and with her husband James supported people and organizations that shared her vision for a more equal society; and

WHEREAS, under the leadership of Al Raby and Dick Gregory, Alice was an integral part of the group that from 1962 to 1966 protested school overcrowding and segregation in black neighborhoods, joined later by the Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr.; and

WHEREAS, the group also worked with the American Friends Society (Quakers) to help put an end to housing discrimination in the city and suburbs; and

WHEREAS, Alice, James and their children participated in marches in favor of open housing, led by Dr. King and ministers from the Southern Leadership Council; and

WHEREAS, Alice worked with the Reverend Jesse Jackson for Operation Breadbasket (which became the Rainbow PUSH Coalition), focusing on the struggle against discrimination in hiring practices of large companies; and

WHEREAS, while working for Operation Breadbasket, Alice became more involved in politics, running the campaigns for those she felt shared her commitment to equality, including Alderman William Cousins, Abner Mikva and Congressman Ralph Metcalfe and working for the campaigns of President Jimmy Carter, Vice President Walter Mondale, Harold Washington, Jesse Jackson and Senator Carol Moseley Braun; and
