On August 6, 2015, the report on advertisement for the request for proposal, Microfilming and Scanning Services for a Thirty-Six (36) Month Period, was sent to the Board of Commissioners.

On October 7, 2015, the request for proposal was advertised and responses were received on October 30, 2015.

Twenty-eight (28) companies were notified of this request for proposal (RFP) and twenty-five (25) companies requested proposal documents. The tabulation of proposers is as follows:

COURT RECORD AND DATA MANAGEMENT SERVICES (CRDS) MICROSYSTEMS, INC. PROGRIO, LLC

After review of the best and final offer, the bid was approximately 88.6 percent over the District's estimate and considered too high for an award. Therefore, the request for proposal is rejected in the public's best interest. The Director of Procurement and Materials Management has informed all Proposers of this action.

Due to the dollar amount of the cost proposals and the best and final offer, the estimated expenses exceeded the funds budgeted for this purpose. The specifications of this request for proposal will be re-evaluated and revised before re-advertisement.

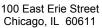

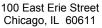

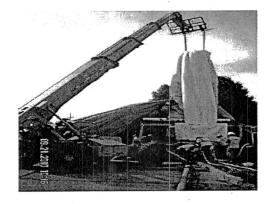

On March 6, 2008, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to issue a purchase order and enter into an agreement with Consoer Townsend Envirodyne Engineers, Inc. (now called AECOM), for professional engineering services for Contract 06-212-3M Calumet TARP Pump Station Improvements, Calumet Water Reclamation Plant, in an amount not to exceed \$887,338.00. The scheduled contract completion date is May 19, 2018.

As of January 22, 2016, the attached list of change orders has been approved. The effect of these change orders resulted in an increase in the amount of \$840,827.00 from the original amount awarded of \$887,338.00. The current contract value is \$1,728,165.00. The prior approved change order reflects a 94.8% increase to the original contract value.

AECOM was originally retained to provide engineering design work for the Calumet TARP Pump Station Improvements project, which is presently being built under Construction's Contract 06-212-3M, with Solliitt/Sachi/Alworth JV as the general contractor. The improvements include replacement of the six TARP pumps and motors, replacement of the four existing VFDs and installation of two new VFDs, construction of platforms in each pump room to support the VFDs, and other work. In order to increase the firm pumping capacity of the TARP Station, the two original small pumps are being replaced with two larger capacity pumps, identical in capacity and manufacture to the other four new pumps. Due to space constraints in the Pump Rooms, the orientation of the pump and piping had to be modified in order to fit the larger equipment. During construction, with equipment selection and dimensional layout finalized, issues have arisen with constructability of the suction piping connection to the main suction header.

During design, AECOM developed a flow model to simulate different piping angles and the effects of these angles on the fluid flow as it approaches the pump. The District is now requesting that AECOM utilize this model to run several scenarios for the suction piping, to ensure that the selected angle is optimum from both a construction and flow perspective.

This change order is in compliance with the Illinois Criminal Code since the change is germane to the contract.

#### Dear Sir:

At the February 21, 2013 Board meeting, authorization was granted to make payment to the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR), in the amount of \$10,100.00, for a Mining Permit for overburden removal from the Expanded Stage 2 portion of the McCook Reservoir, in connection with the captioned project. Authorization was also granted to pledge a certificate of deposit in the amount of \$313,100.00 in lieu of the required performance bond for that project. The pledge was chosen since it provided a no cost option to the District for meeting the requirements. The pledge was intended to last for 1,000 days, which was the duration of the project.

Excavation of the overburden and restoration at the deposition site are complete and IDNR has agreed to release that area from the mining permit as complete; however, final stabilization of the side slopes of the Expanded Stage 2 portion of the reservoir has not been completed and IDNR requires that the District maintain a reduced portion of the certificate of deposit pledge until such work is complete. The design for the stabilization of the side slopes is currently underway and it is anticipated that a contract will be issued at the end of 2016, with work anticipated to occur in 2017. In the interim, IDNR requires that the District maintain a performance bond or pledge a certificate of deposit again, in an amount of \$27,900.00 for the approximately 9 acres of land represented by the unstabilized portion of the Expanded Stage 2 site. All the interest earnings will be retained by the District.

It is requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it authorize and approve the pledging of a \$27,900.00 certificate of deposit in lieu of a performance bond to the IDNR.

It is further requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that the Chairman of the Committee on Finance and the Clerk be authorized and directed to execute any necessary documents in connection with the subject permit on behalf of the District after they are approved by the Director of Engineering as to technical matters and by the General Counsel as to form and legality.

#### Dear Sir:

On August 30, 2012, Yussef Ihmoud was driving a motorcycle on the 3200 block of West Peterson Avenue in Chicago, Illinois when he collided with a District vehicle driven by George Bee, an Engineering Technician V. As a result of the collision, Mr. Ihmoud fell from his motorcycle to the pavement. Although emergency services were called to the scene, both Mr. Ihmoud and Mr. Bee declined assistance. However, Mr. Ihmoud went to the Swedish Covenant Hospital on September 1, 2012 where he was treated and released. Mr. Ihmoud received follow-up care from his family doctor and other medical professionals.

Mr. Ihmoud retained counsel and filed a lawsuit in September of 2013 in the Circuit Court of Cook County, Law Division, seeking \$90,000 in damages.

To date, the Law Department has vigorously defended the lawsuit. The written discovery process has been completed, during which the Law Department obtained dismissal of one of the Plaintiff's claims for recovery, and also participated in oral discovery. Additionally, the Law Department retained an expert to provide consultation and testimony, if necessary, regarding the injury claimed by Mr. Ihmoud.

At this time, given the high cost of expert discovery and the uncertainty inherent in taking the matter to trial, the General Counsel believes that settlement is in the District's best interest. After extensive negotiation, Mr. Ihmoud has agreed to settle this matter for \$19,900.00.

Therefore, the General Counsel respectfully requests that the Board of Commissioners approve the settlement of Yussef Ihmoud v. Metropolitan Water Reclamation District and George Bee in the total amount of \$19,900.00. Additionally, the General Counsel requests authority to execute such documents as may be necessary to effectuate this settlement.

timely manner through WERF's excellent progress reports and final reports. The information that will be gathered particularly in the areas of water quality, wastewater treatment, energy recovery, sludge processing, and nutrient removal will be highly beneficial to the District's current operations and future planning of capital improvement projects. It is estimated that the District's annual investment of \$138,000.00 for a WERF subscription saves the District many times that amount if this research were to be conducted in-house.

WERF, the sole-source of supply, has submitted pricing for the amount of the research commitment requested. Inasmuch as the research benefits are not available through any other source of supply, nothing would be gained by advertising for bids (Section 11.4 of the Purchasing Act).

It is hereby recommended that the Board of Commissioners authorize payment, by direct voucher, to WERF, in an amount not to exceed \$138,000.00. Funds are available in Account 101-15000-612280.

On March 17, 2011, the District's Board of Commissioners authorized a five (5) year permit to the United States Geological Survey ("USGS") to install, operate, monitor, maintain, repair, and remove a stream gaging station near the Summit Conduit on approximately five (5) square feet of District real estate near Joliet Road and west of Lawndale Avenue in Summit, Illinois on Main Channel Parcel 35.07. The permit expires on February 28, 2016.

The purpose of the gaging station is for the Army Corps of Engineers to monitor the stream flow and water quality through the Summit Conduit into the Chicago Sanitary and Ship Canal. USGS is responsible for the installation and maintenance of the equipment.

The District's technical departments have reviewed the request and have no objections to issuing a new five (5) year permit to USGS provided that District facilities are protected and 24-hour access is maintained. It is recommended that the permit be issued for a nominal fee of \$10.00 as is customary for permits with governmental agencies that use District property for public purposes.

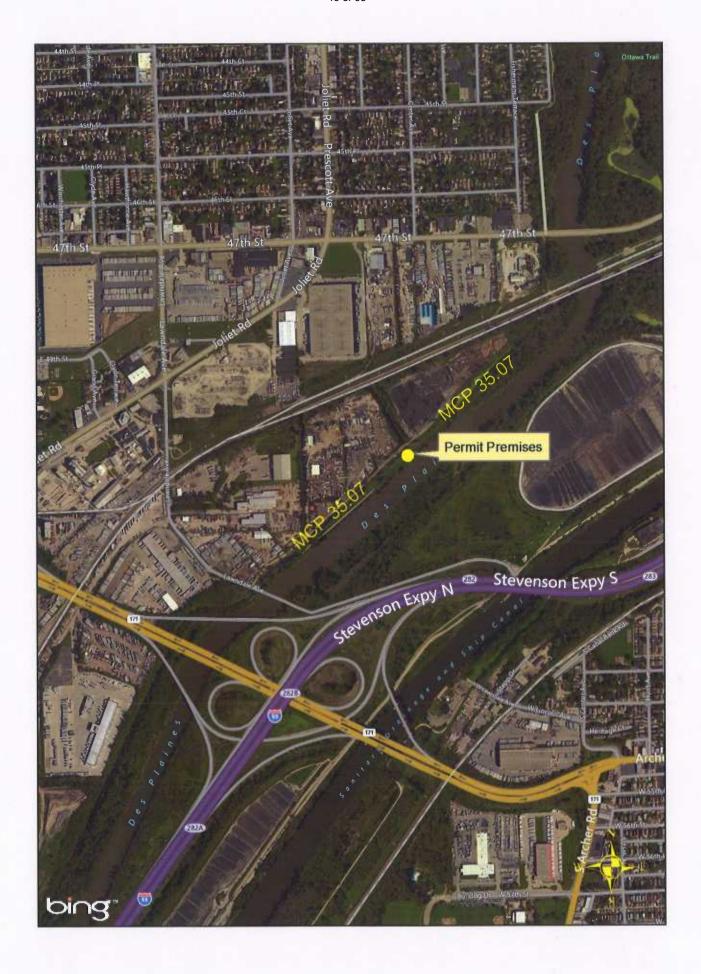

HMB405, Inc. has requested to purchase an approximately 73-acre parcel of District real estate located at 820 W. 138th Street in Riverdale, Illinois ("Riverdale Site").

The District purchased the Riverdale Site in 1967 as part of its obligations as local sponsor under the Calumet-Sag Navigation Project. The Cal-Sag Navigation Project was approved by the U.S. Congress at that time and it authorized the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers ("Corps") to widen and dredge the Cal-Sag Channel, improve portions of the Little Calumet River and that portion of the Calumet River between Calumet Harbor and Lake Calumet.

Maintenance of the waterways involved periodic dredging and depositing of the silt and dredging upon maintenance areas. As local sponsor, the District was statutorily obligated to furnish, free of cost to the Corps, all lands, easements, rights-of-way and soil disposal areas necessary for the work and for subsequent maintenance by the Corps. One of the maintenance areas purchased by the District as part of its local sponsor obligations was the Riverdale Site. When acquired, the Riverdale Site was a worked out clay pit.

The Village of Riverdale has made a longstanding request that the District sell or make available for lease the Riverdale Site for mixed use development. The District has been reluctant to sell this parcel of land because it was purchased and held in reserve pursuant to its continuing obligation under the Cal-Sag Navigation Project to provide maintenance areas for the Corps, if and when the Cal-Sag Channel, Little Calumet River or Calumet River improvement work was undertaken.

Until recently, the Corps was unwilling or unable to project for the District when or if the Riverdale Site would be required for use. Because of the lack of information, the District was reluctant to sell the parcel. The Corps has now provided the District with information that allows for an informed decision to be made with respect to the future disposition of the Riverdale Site. The Corps has indicated that this parcel is not sufficient for its maintenance of the waterways and has indicated that it is no longer required by the Corps. The District is therefore statutorily required to sell the land if it is not needed for its own corporate purposes.

The technical departments have reviewed the request and indicated that they do not foresee any need for the Riverdale site for any corporate purpose. Accordingly, the technical departments have no objections to the proposed sale.

The sale will be upon competitive bid as required by statute. Before advertising the property for sale the Board will be provided the appraised value of the property and requested therefrom to establish a minimum

WHEREAS the Board of Commissioners (the "Board") of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (the "District") has provided for the issuance of General Obligation Unlimited Tax Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source), 2014 Series B (Green Bonds) (the "Bonds) and the Board by ordinance duly adopted did provide for the levy of direct annual taxes sufficient to pay the interest and principal on the Bonds, which levy has been implemented, in part, by the filing of a certain certificate of tax levy signed by the Treasurer of the District; and

WHEREAS the District has on hand, and lawfully available for the purpose, funds which will provide for the payment of interest and principal of the said bonds and the amount to be levied can be abated in the amount of \$3,391,347; and

WHEREAS it is appropriate and in the best interests of the District that the taxes heretofore levied for tax year 2015 to pay the interest and principal on the Bonds be abated;

*Now Therefore* It is Hereby Ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago as follows:

Dear Sir:

The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago's Bond Redemption and Interest Fund holds sufficient assets on hand to permit the full abatement of its 2015 Real Estate Tax Levies, to be collected in the year 2016. The attached Ordinance presents the detail of abatement for the bond issue, and authorizes the abatement action on the 2015 levy of taxes for the Bond Redemption and Interest Fund.

A full abatement of \$3,391,347 is requested for approval from the Bond Redemption and Interest Fund levy for the General Obligation Unlimited Tax Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source), 2014 Series B (Green Bonds). The abatement is required as a result of the deposit into the 2014 Alternate Bond Debt Service Fund on January 4, 2016. A transfer was made by the Treasurer from the Stormwater Management Fund tax receipts account in an amount sufficient to provide for the punctual payment of principal and interest due in 2016 in accordance with Ordinance O14-012, Section 15.

The 2015 levy will be reduced in the amount of \$3,391,347 and the amount levied for interest and principal on outstanding bonds, when due, will be adjusted to \$224,487,725.
