The proposals were evaluated by staff from the Human Resources Department and the Procurement and Materials Management Department. The criteria for these evaluations were outlined in Request for Proposal 16-RFP-04 and included: understanding of the project, approach to the work, technical competence, financial stability, personnel effectiveness, compliance with insurance requirements, submission of licenses/permits and cost. Following the preliminary evaluation of proposals, two (2) proposers were deemed to be finalists and were interviewed on April 4, 2016. A solicitation was sent to each finalist on April 7, 2016 for an unqualified "best and final" offers were returned to the Director of Procurement and Materials Management on April 15, 2016.

Based on the evaluation of proposals and interviews, it is recommended that a purchase order be awarded to Deloitte Consulting LLP (Deloitte). Deloitte received the highest technical score among the proposers and was very competitively priced. It has significant benefits consulting experience in the public sector including work for the City of Chicago, Chicago Transit Authority, State of Illinois and Cook County. The Monitoring and Research Department's Industrial Waste Analytical Laboratory at the Stickney Water Reclamation Plant will use this equipment. This purchase order will expire on August 31, 2016.

The equipment will be used to determine hexavalent chromium concentrations in samples submitted for analysis by the Industrial Waste Division (under Appendix B of the District's Sewage and Waste Control Ordinance), the Maintenance and Operations Department (for treatment plant monitoring), and the Environmental Monitoring and Research Division (to offer research project support).

The hexavalent chromium analysis is becoming an increasingly requested parameter, particularly for wastewater treatment plant operations. The automated method sample preservation technique extends the maximum allowable sample holding time from twenty-four (24) hours (for the manual method) to twenty-eight (28) days, thereby requiring analyses to be performed only once or twice a month in contrast to the daily schedule currently in place. The supervising chemist would assign a technician to the hexavalent chromium area as needed instead of every night, sometimes for only a single sample.

Recently, two patented technologies have been developed for ion chromatographic analysis of hexavalent chromium that are necessary to attain the analytical sensitivity and sustainability of operation required by the Industrial Waste Analytical Laboratory. The first is a triple-chamber capillary chemical suppressor. This suppressor will reduce background noise thus providing the greatest sensitivity that will lead to the lowest detection limits possible for the hexachrome analysis. In addition, it will automatically clean the cartridge and rinse it making it ready to analyze another sample. This automatic cleaning step will reuse the same chemicals multiple times and will reduce chemical cost, reduce chemical waste and save technician time. The second technology is inline sample preparation with filtration. This is an internal filtration step that has reusable filters that eliminates the need for more costly disposable filters that would otherwise be needed. These two technologies are only available with the Metrohm instrument.

Metrohm, the sole-service provider to furnish, deliver, and install an ion chromatograph with autosampler for hexavalent chromium samples, has submitted pricing for the equipment and services required. Inasmuch as Metrohm is the only source of supply for the equipment and services required, nothing would be gained by advertising for bids (Section 11.4 of the Purchasing Act).

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Metrohm is registered and in good standing with the state of Florida.



As of May 6, 2016, the attached list of change orders has been approved. Authority to increase the amount of funds allocated for the emergency repairs of a Northshore Intercepting Sewer 3 manhole and the surrounding pavement in an amount of \$800,000.00, from an amount of \$300,000.00, to an amount not to exceed \$1,100,000.00

Dear Sir:

On March 3, 2016, the Board of Commissioners authorized the execution of an emergency contract for the repairs and improvements of a manhole and the surrounding pavement due to damages from a sinkhole.

During a recent inspection, the Maintenance and Operations Department (M&O) observed a sinkhole in a paved road area adjacent to a manhole on the District's Northshore 3 Intercepting Sewer. This manhole is located along Old Green Bay Road at approximately Dundee Road, in the Village of Glencoe. The site was immediately secured by M&O and the sinkhole was covered with steel road plates and blocked by road barricades.

On April 25, 2016, a contract was issued to Pullman Power, LLC to perform the carbon fiber structural rehabilitation method on the manhole. The M&O Department was to assist in the work, bypassing flow around the manhole. However, shortly after mobilizing, a storm event on the evening of April 27, 2016 overwhelmed the District bypass plan and resulted in the flooding of 3 houses.

In order to avoid future risk of flooding homes, the Engineering Department has determined that constructing a new adjacent manhole and abandoning the existing manhole is the best path moving forward. Construction of a new manhole will minimize the duration that bypass pumping will be required. It is estimated that the work associated with the manhole construction and abandonment will bring the total cost of the emergency work to \$1,100,000.00.

The District will enter into a new agreement with a contractor to construct a new manhole and abandon the existing manhole.

In consideration of the above and in accordance with Section 11.5 of the Purchasing Act, it is requested that the Board of Commissioners increase the authorization amount for these emergency repairs in an amount of \$800,000.00, from an amount of \$300,000.00, to an amount not to exceed \$1,100,000.00 and to authorize execution of contracts to resolve the emergency.

Funds for the original \$300,000.00 were made available in Account 201-50000-645700. The additional funds required for the new manhole construction are available in Account 401-50000-645600.

A full report of the resolution of the emergency will be presented to the Board at a future Board Meeting.

On October 16, 2014, the Board authorized a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Aarhus Vand A/S of Denmark to engage in a knowledge exchange program. The MOU is for a three year period beginning November 1, 2014. The purpose of the program is to share knowledge, experience and thoughtful discourse about the water sector and wastewater industry for the mutual benefit of the District and Aarhus Vand, an independent regional waste and wastewater enterprise located in southern Denmark that is owned by the municipality of Aarhus.

Job exchange visits, where District employees can visit Aarhus Vand's water treatment facilities, are an important part of the MOU. Jane C. Schipma, a Treatment Plant Operator I at the Kirie Water Reclamation Plant, has been invited by Aarhus Vand to visit its water treatment facility in Ega, Denmark from October 1, 2016 through November 30, 2016. The facility is in the process of expansion and renovation to become 150% energy self-sufficient. Among other processes being implemented, the treatment facility will begin their deammonification process in October. As the District will also be implementing a deammonification process at the John Egan Water Reclamation Plant, the knowledge and experience gained by Ms. Schipma will be of great value to the District.

Ms. Schipma would not be working for Aarhus Vand during her visit. Salary and benefit continuation, and airfare would be the responsibility of the District. Airfare is estimated at \$1,500.00. Aarhus Vand would provide housing for Ms. Schipma.



Sheffield's lease allows it to sublease or assign the lease subject to the District's consent.

On January 20, 1994, the District entered into a Consent to Sublease with Sheffield and Seeler Industries, Inc. ("Seeler"), wherein the District consented to a sublease of 23.5 acres of the leased premises from Sheffield to Seeler. The sublease has since been assigned to Pure Metal Recycling, LLC ("Pure Metal"). Pure Metal uses the sublease area for processing, bundling, loading, and unloading scrap iron and metal; storing items such as containers and semi-truck trailers; and parking motor vehicles in conjunction with these business activities, all permitted uses under the Sheffield lease. The sublease agreement is subject to decennial reappraisals. Under the sublease, Pure Metal currently pays an annual rent of \$72,000.00, all of which is paid directly to the District. Such rent is based upon a March 2014 reappraisal.

On December 10, 2015, Pure Metal executed an "Assignment for the Benefit of Creditors" that assigned all of its assets, including the sublease, to an Assignee/Trustee ("Assignee") for liquidation purposes. As part of this liquidation, the Assignee has requested the District's consent to an assignment of the sublease to B.L. Duke Inc. ("B.L. Duke"). B.L. Duke intends to use the sublease area for the same purposes as did Pure Metal. The assignment will be conditioned upon the annual rent being subject to annual CPI increases. The District's Finance Department has reviewed B.L. Duke's financial and company background information and recommends that a security deposit in the amount of one-year's rent be posted to further ensure payment of rent under the sublease. Additionally, the prior subtenant, Seeler, remains liable under the sublease.



Duke Inc. of approximately 23.5 acres of District real estate located west of the Des Plaines River and south of the CN Railroad in Crest Hill, Will County, Illinois; Main Channel Parcel 12.01. Consideration shall be a \$5,000.00 document preparation fee.

The District acquired the Site in 1908 with the intent to build and operate an electrical substation. District records indicate that the substation was never built and the Site was never used by the District.


Wrigley owns the adjacent parcel of land at 3538 South Ashland Avenue where benzene was discovered due to a leaking underground storage tank. Reports and data indicated that the contamination migrated onto the District's Site. Wrigley entered into an Agreement with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency to remediate its site and the District's Site. Accordingly, the District issued a series of permits to Wrigley from 2009-2012 whereby Wrigley remediated the contamination on the Site.

The technical departments have reported that there is no foreseeable corporate need for the Site and have no objections to selling it.

The sale will be upon competitive bid as required by statute. Before advertising the Site for sale, the Board will be provided the appraised value of it and requested therefrom to establish a minimum acceptable bid.

It is requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it authorize and direct the General Counsel to commence statutory procedures to sell an approximately 25 foot by 125 foot parcel of District real estate located at 3548 South Ashland Avenue in Chicago, Illinois, upon the terms and conditions set forth herein.

Builders Paving LLC ("Builders") has requested a six (6) month permit for construction staging on North Shore Channel Parcel 6.20. Builders is engaged in a water main improvement project along Crawford Avenue between Dempster and Oakton Streets in Skokie, Illinois. Parcel 6.20 is currently vacant.

Builders leases North Shore Channel Parcel 6.06 and 6.11 under a lease that commenced July 1, 2014 and expires June 30, 2024 to operate an asphalt plant. Builders is proposing to access Parcel 6.20 through North Shore Channel Parcels 6.01 and 6.02. Parcel 6.01 is vacant. Parcel 6.02 is under lease to the Vineyard Christian Church ("Vineyard") for use as a parking lot. Access through Parcel 6.02 will, to the extent any portion of the access road traverses Parcel 6.02, be subject to the consent of Vineyard.

The District's technical departments have no objections to issuing the six (6) month permit. The permit fee of \$8,625.00 represents 10% of the pro-rata share of the site's fair market value based on a recent appraisal of a nearby comparable site.

The subject property falls within the area subject to the North Shore Channel Resolution which requires that District land located along the North Shore Channel between Devon Avenue and the Wilmette Harbor be leased only for green-space and public recreational use. A waiver of the North Shore Channel Resolution is requested in this instance since the proposed use is under a permit of a short-term duration.

It is requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it authorize and approve the issuance of a six (6) month permit to Builders Paving LLC to operate a construction staging area on two (2) acres of District real estate located on North Shore Channel Parcel 6.20 in Skokie, Illinois and access thereto through North Shore Channel Parcels 6.01 and 6.02 located north of Howard Street and east of the North Shore Channel in Skokie, Illinois.
