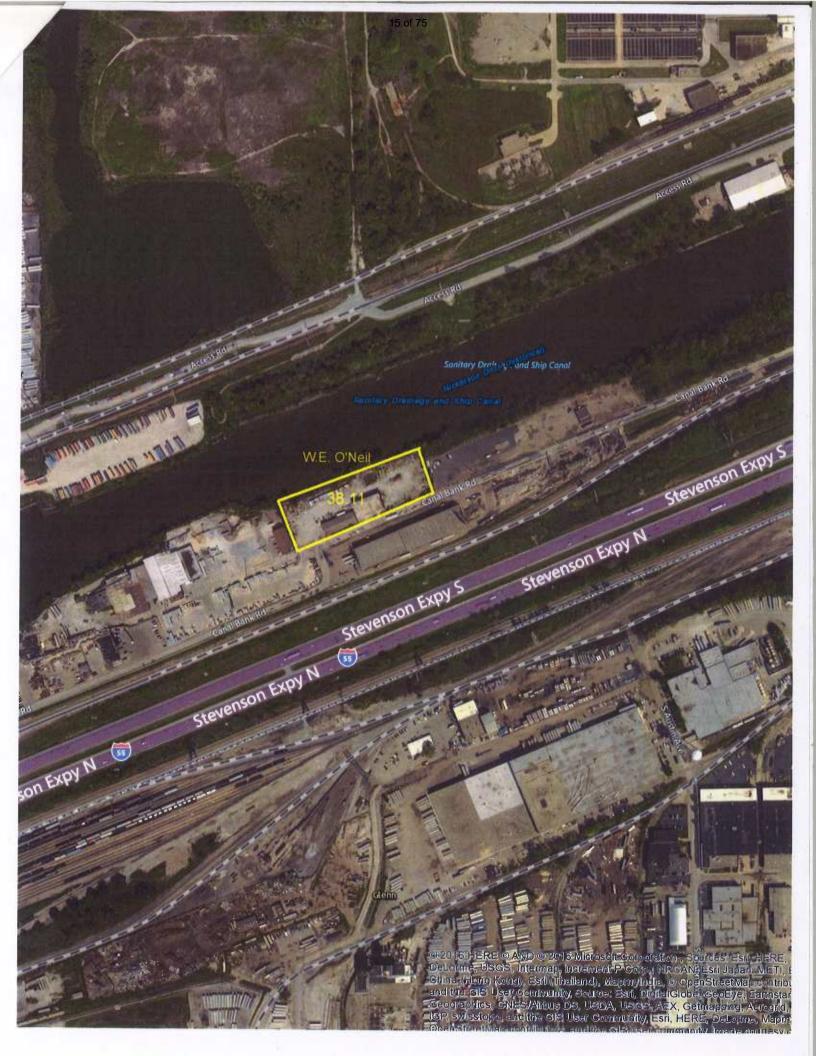

This study will be conducted under the auspices of the Master Agreement between U of I and the District, authorized by the Board of Commissioners at the Board Meeting of September 19, 2002, and amended to extend the termination date by the Board of Commissioners at the Board Meetings of October 16, 2003, May 3, 2007, December 16, 2010, March 15, 2012, and August 6, 2015. The purpose of the Master Agreement is to allow the District to directly take advantage of the expertise offered by U of I. ISWS is one of the five Prairie Research Institute state scientific surveys formed as a group under the auspices of U of I.

The Watershed Management Ordinance (WMO) regulates site stormwater management requiring stormwater detention based on development type and parcel size. If it is not practicable to provide a detention facility onsite, an offsite detention facility may be constructed as long as it is within the same subwatershed. As part of the WMO Draft Amendment that is currently in a public review comment period, volume control trading within the same subwatershed is also proposed.

The District is working in coordination with the Metropolitan Planning Council (MPC) and The Nature Conservancy (TNC) to determine the feasibility of an offsite stormwater detention and volume control trading exchange within suburban Cook County. The goal of such an exchange is to identify if stormwater management can be expanded and implemented more efficiently by locating facilities in strategic locations, rather than solely onsite as part of each individual development. Together, MPC and TNC are concurrently evaluating the trading exchange from a real estate perspective. Ultimately, a policy analysis will combine these efforts as part of this potential trading exchange.

ISWS will complete a spatial analysis of land use and hydrology across each of the six watersheds within Cook County, excluding the City of Chicago, to identify areas that would provide the most efficient stormwater management benefit for future development taking advantage of a stormwater exchange. Available geospatial data will be evaluated to identify and map favorable areas for stormwater detention and volume control facilities. Unsuitable areas will be eliminated and locations with multiple desirable characteristics will be further reviewed.

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The time to complete the analysis is six months, which includes presentation of the findings. ISWS has submitted a proposal in the amount of \$143,694.00 to perform the study. The Engineering Department reviewed the proposal and found it to be acceptable.

Since the services to be provided are professional in nature, and the aforementioned university is reputable, it is recommended that the purchase order be issued without advertising, as per Section 11.4 of the Purchasing Act.

Water Quality Standards and NPDES permits continue to require lower limits. The NexION 350X is able to achieve very low levels by an advanced optical system that contains an adjustable torch that makes it easy to analyze the most difficult samples. In addition, its unique, shear gas system eliminates interferences. When buying low-level instrumentation, it is critical to have the ability to reduce or eliminate interferences, especially for the type of samples our laboratory analyzes with complex environmental or waste matrices.

The NexION 350X also has breakthrough Flat Plate plasma technology that reduces argon consumption. This

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will significantly reduce the cost of supplying argon to run the instrumentation. In addition, the user interface and instrument maintenance procedures make it the most user-friendly on the market utilizing intuitive single keystroke optimization, scheduled maintenance alerts, fully automated system functionality, and maintenance procedures that eliminate many consumable costs. Typically, ICP-MS systems can be difficult to operate and require specific training. This system can be easily trained to technical staff. These analyses are required by permits, regulations, and ordinances including: water reclamation plant influent and effluent samples for compliance with NPDES permits, industrial discharges to ensure that dischargers are in compliance with the industrial pretreatment regulations, screening samples for the Resource Recovery Ordinance, and the monitoring of water quality in the Chicago area waterways to meet the IEPA designated Water Quality Standard. In order for the M&R Department to maintain excellence in customer service and comply with the USEPA Method 1664A, it is necessary to replace the existing 8-year old Horizon 3000XL units. The old units have seen an increase in the amount of service over the last several years due to mechanical issues. The vendor has notified the IWAL that the Horizon 3000XL units purchased prior to 2011 are now obsolete. They will no longer do repairs in the field or in-house, and will have limited parts availability. The current units are still on a Horizon service contract, which will still be honored. 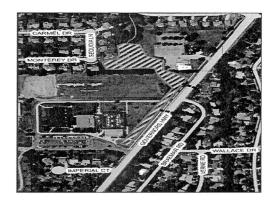

These contracts expire on May 31, 2017.

As of February 2, 2017 the attached list of change orders has been approved. 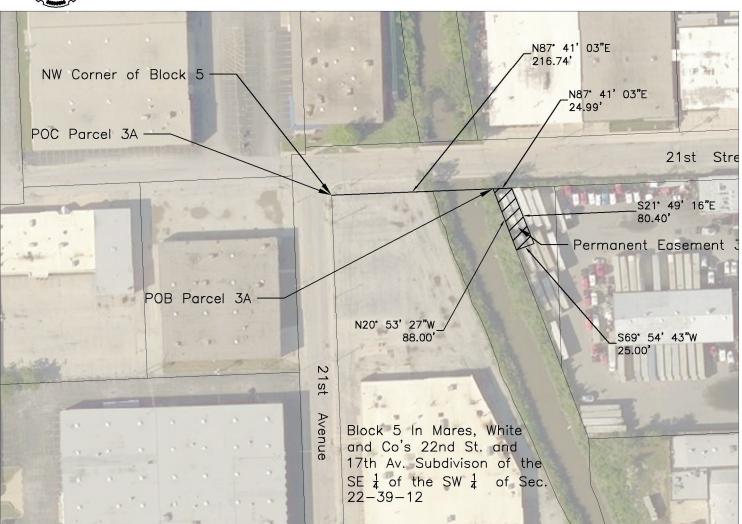

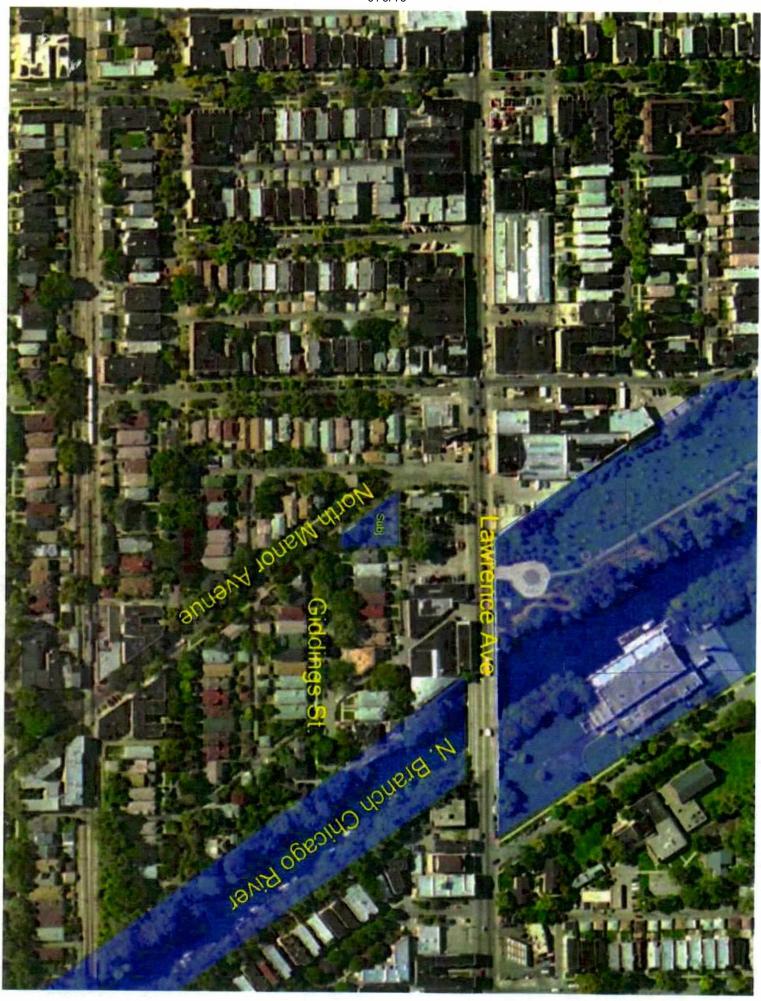

The District's appraiser estimates the fair market value of the Property, as of the date of filing the lawsuit on December 9, 2016, to be approximately \$215,000.00. The negotiated settlement will save the District substantial litigation costs that would otherwise be required to proceed to trial, including attorney's fees, expert witness fees, and additional appraisal fees.

The District's relocation consultant Urban Relocation Services, Inc. has determined that the renter of the home, Mr. Brian Gall, is eligible for relocation costs of approximately \$30,918.00. These relocation costs for renters are required to be paid by the District under the Federal Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act. This total amount includes the maximum rent supplement payment,

reasonable moving expenses, and closing costs. The amount is subject to adjustment based upon the actual costs incurred.

In connection with the execution of the vertical and horizontal expansion of the Melvina Ditch Reservoir ("Reservoir") located north of 87th Street and west of Natchez Avenue in Burbank, IL (Contract 14-263-3F) ("Project"), the District must acquire fee simple title to the real property commonly known as 8642 Natchez Avenue in Burbank, IL ("Property") owned by Bonnie L. Gall, as Trustee of the Bonnie L. Gall Revocable Trust dated October 18, 2010. Mrs. Gall also owns the adjacent parcel commonly known as 8640 Natchez Avenue, the acquisition of which is being presented for approval under a separate agenda item.

As the parties were unable to reach an agreement as to the purchase price of the Property, the District filed an eminent domain lawsuit entitled <u>The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago v. Bonnie L. Gall, et al.</u>, Case No. 16L050816, in the Circuit Court of Cook County on December 9, 2016. In addition to the complaint for condemnation, the District subsequently filed a "quick-take" motion to allow for the immediate vesting of title of the subject Property with the District, as authorized by the Board of Commissioner's ("Board") September 1, 2016 Resolution.

Since the filing of the quick-take motion, the District and the homeowners have reached a negotiated settlement for final just compensation to acquire the Property in the amount of \$442,750.00. It is the opinion of the General Counsel and Special Counsel, Neal & Leroy, that this amount for final just compensation is within the range of value for the subject Property based on the fair market value appraisal obtained by the District.

The Property comprises 0.47 acres and is improved with an approximately 3,087 square foot, single family residence. The District's appraiser estimates the fair market value of the Property, as of the date of filing the lawsuit on December 9, 2016, to be approximately \$395,000.00. The negotiated settlement will save the District substantial litigation costs that would otherwise be required to proceed to trial, including attorney's fees, expert witness fees, and additional appraisal fees.

The District's relocation consultant Urban Relocation Services, Inc. has determined that Bonnie L. Gall is eligible for relocation costs of approximately \$18,000.00. 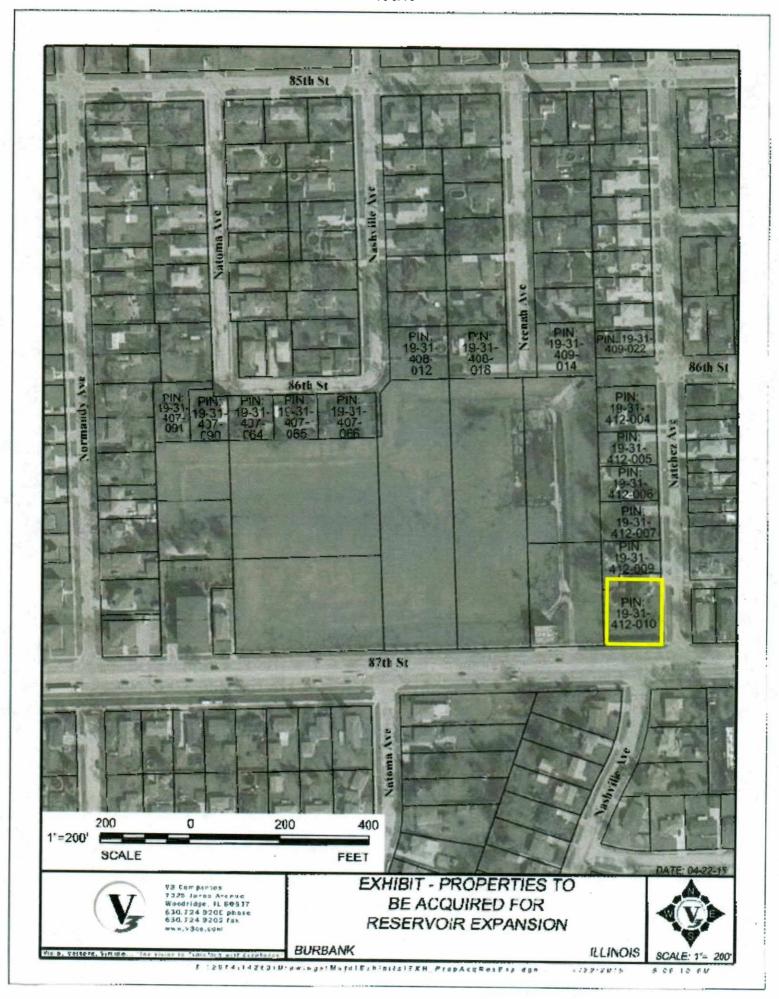

Recommendations for the State of Illinois 2017 Legislative Program

I respectfully submit the following legislative initiatives and recommendation to the Board of Commissioners for their consideration and guidance.

Legislative Initiative No. 1

<u>Authorization to amend the District's Act to allow the District to participate in a nutrient trading program throughout the State of Illinois to meet water quality standards, in the event that nutrient trading becomes available in Illinois.</u>

The District anticipates that forthcoming regulation regarding nutrients and algae will result in more stringent permit limits throughout the state. In order to further reduce nutrient discharges in compliance with tightening permit limits, the District will need to make significant capital improvements at its water reclamation plants in the coming years.

The District anticipates that state regulators will be developing some type of nutrient trading platform and/or recognize nutrient trading as a way to reduce nutrient discharges into the Illinois waterways throughout the state. To that end, the District proposes seeking legislative authority to amend the District's Act to allow the District to participate in a nutrient trading program throughout the state to meet water quality standards, in the event nutrient trading becomes available in Illinois. Nutrient trading can reduce potentially costly capital improvements at District facilities that the District could otherwise be required to incur.

Based on the above, the District anticipates cost savings to its taxpayers while also improving water quality throughout the State of Illinois.

Legislative Initiative No. 2

Authority to amend the District's Pension Code to provide for pension benefits to those District retirees who retired prior to June 1, 2011 and received a spousal refund and subsequently entered into a Civil Union or became married after February 26, 2014.

The District's Retirement Fund currently has a policy, set by statute that provides for a benefit to the survivor of a District retiree only if the survivor was married to the District retiree at the time of separation from service; the District retiree met the service requirement; and the survivor and District retiree were married at the time of the District retiree's death. This policy has prevented the partners of some retirees in civil unions or marriages who may have retired from the District before state law allowed them to enter into a marriage or civil union

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from collecting survivor benefits.

On June 1, 2011 the Illinois Religious Freedom Protection and Civil Union Act (Civil Union Act) went into effect, allowing two persons of the same or opposite gender to enter into a legal relationship referred to as a civil union. Parties to a civil union have the same obligations, responsibilities, protections and benefits afforded by Illinois law to a married couple. As a result of the Civil Union Act, all pension benefits previously made available by the District's Retirement Fund to a married retiree and his or her spouse, are now benefits that are available to parties of a civil union.

On June 1, 2014 the Illinois Religious Freedom and Marriage Fairness Act went into effect, legalizing samesex marriage in Illinois, leaving in place the Civil Union Act, and providing for voluntary conversion of civil unions into marriages.

To that end, the District proposes seeking legislative authority to amend the District's Pension Code to extend pension benefits to those retirees who retired before June 1, 2011 and received a spousal refund because they could not avail themselves of a civil union or marriage until such time as Illinois law was changed. The election period to establish the survivor benefit will be one year and the District retiree will have to repay the original spousal refund plus the actuarial rate of return of 7.5% and will have twenty-four months to make this repayment.
