A planholders' survey revealed the following reasons for not bidding: could not provide the equipment and/or services requested. In light of these findings, the Director of Procurement and Materials Management is of the opinion that the bid received is a fair and reasonable price, and nothing would be gained by rejecting the sole bid and re-advertising this contract.

Brieser Construction Company, the sole bidder, is proposing to perform the contract in accordance with the specifications. The estimated cost for this contract was \$150,000.00, placing their bid of \$201,204.00 approximately 34.1 percent above the estimate. On August 8, 2013, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to award Contract 11-054-3P Disinfection Facilities, Terrence J. O'Brien Water Reclamation Plant, to Walsh Construction Company II, LLC, in an amount not to exceed \$59,899,650.00 plus a five (5) percent allowance for change orders in an amount of \$2,994,982.50, for a total amount not to exceed \$62,894,632.50. The scheduled contract completion date was June 6, 2017.

As of September 15, 2017, the effect of change orders resulted in a net increase in the amount of \$2,578,265.38 from the original amount awarded of 59,899,650.00. The current contract value is \$62,477,915.38. The prior approved change orders reflect a 4.30% increase to the original contract value.

Item 1: A net credit in the amount of \$128,780.64 to install new pavement on the plant roadways. The contract required the use of a 12-inch thick coarse aggregate base and a 6-inch CA-6 capping for the construction of the plant roadways. The contractor submitted a request to substitute a 9-inch thick recycled crushed concrete coarse aggregate base and 3-inch thick FM-6 capping material for the roadway construction. Field investigation determined that the existing roadway base material was approximately 12-inches thick. In order to avoid any unplanned interferences, it was prudent to match the existing road base and avoid the risks of excavating an additional 6-inches. The use of recycled crushed concrete from the existing replaced plant roadways was determined to be structurally acceptable. The credit work consists of reduced roadway base and sub-base thickness, reduced excavation and reduced material costs. The extra work includes removal and replacement of existing guard rail required to perform the roadwork. The work has been completed. Before the engineer's determination on the change order, the contractor proceeded at his own risk with this work as determined in his best interest in executing the overall contract. The contractor submitted a cost proposal (CCO-064) for an extra in the amount of \$13,527.72 and a credit in the amount of \$142,308.36, for a net credit in the amount of \$128,780.64. The engineer reviewed the proposal, found it to be reasonable, and stated via correspondence 1934, that the Engineering Department would recommend its approval.

Item 2: A Settlement of Claim in the amount of \$901,835.69 to rebuild the Chicago Transit Authority's Yellow Line Railroad tracks. Although the contractor builder's risk insurance covered much of the damage caused by the embankment collapse, the cost to rebuild the railroad tracks was not covered. The work was necessary to quickly and safely restore service to the public. The contractor submitted a proposal which included costs for earthwork, sub-ballast and ballast installation, associated electrical work and instrumentation work. Payment of this claim will not operate as an admission of liability by the District. If approved by the Board of Commissioners, the contractor will be required to sign a Release before any monies are disbursed in this Settlement of Claim. In addition, the District agrees to waive the time related liquidated damages incurred on

Authority to increase Contract 11-195-AP Phosphorus Recovery System, Stickney Water Reclamation Plant, to Black & Veatch Construction, Inc. in an amount of \$1,905,939.28, from an amount of \$34,905,483.55, to an amount not to exceed \$36,811,422.83, Accounts 401-50000-645650 and 201-50000-612430, Purchase Order 5001478

Dear Sir:

On August 7, 2014, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to award Contract 11-195-AP Phosphorus Recovery System, Stickney Water Reclamation Plant, to Black & Veatch Construction, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$31,879,000.00. The scheduled contract completion date was October 29, 2016.

As of September 15, 2017, the attached list of change orders has been approved. The effect of these change orders resulted in an increase in an amount of \$3,026,483.55 from the original amount awarded of \$31,879,000.00. The current contract value is \$34,905,483.55. The prior approved change orders reflect a 9.49% increase to the original contract value.

Item 1: This contract differed from typical District contracts in that a modified design-build approach was taken. The modified approach allowed for expedited design and construction of the facility with significant District oversight to ensure that District standards were met. During construction of the facility, several claims arose for work that was not foreseen during the design phase, differed from the original scope, or resulted from unexpected field conditions. The extra work included are as follows:

- a. Winter weather protection. The construction schedule was accelerated to have the majority of the facility completed for WEFTEC 2015. The timing of the contract award resulted in construction beginning in the winter months. Therefore, a heated tent was provided to allow for installation of the building foundation during the winter to expedite the project schedule. \$243,765.00.
- b. Additional costs associated with the accelerated schedule were due to re-sequencing of the equipment assembly and installation, including assembly of the reactors outside of the building foundation and placement of the reactors into the partially assembled building. Unanticipated work included the installation of a reactor assembly pad outside of the building and crane costs to move the assembled reactors into the building. \$42,477.21.
- c. Reinforcement and copper grounding of electrical duct banks. The District requested the contractor to include a higher level of reinforcement and grounding for all electrical duct banks through the entirety of the duct bank for increased stability and safety. Black & Veatch Construction (B&V) had only included the higher level of reinforcement within 15 feet of building entrances, under and within 5 feet of roadways, and within 10 feet of indicated future excavations. While their design was within code, the District requested a

betterment to ensure long-term stability and safety of the duct bank. \$125,441.00.

- d. Steam line modifications. B&V's original design had the high pressure steam traps along the upper bridge, discharging to the pumped condensate from the facility. The District had concerns that in the long term operation of the facility, potential for hammer within the piping system may occur and requested a separate condensate return line be provided for these traps. Additionally, their original design had a steam pressure reducing station and low pressure coil for the make-up air handling unit. The District requested that a high pressure coil be provided to match the incoming steam pressure, thereby reducing future maintenance related to the reducing station. While their design was within code, the District requested a betterment to ensure long-term stability and safety. These requested modifications of the steam and condensate system resulted in additional engineering and construction costs. \$130,698.00.
- e. Building relocation. Upon initiation of the excavation for the post-digestion centrate pump station, an existing duct bank and manhole were encountered which were not shown on the existing As-Built drawings supplied to B&V. This caused an interference with the planned location of the pump station and building foundation. To eliminate the interference, the building was relocated 15 feet to the east. Due to this unforeseen condition, the relocation resulted in additional costs for steam system piping and supports, driveway surface, site grading, drainage and engineering design costs. \$134,616.00.
- f. Potable Water relocation. B&V's original design for potable water utilized a connection point from the MBM pelletizer facility water line. In order to control and reduce water usage costs, the District re-located the potable water connection to a District controlled supply at a location further from the facility. Additional costs were incurred to facilitate the longer connection distance. \$94,982.00.
- g. Elevation adjustments for the pre-digestion centrate pumping station. Grade elevations at the pre-digestion wet well were different than what was shown on the existing As- Built drawings supplied from the District to B&V. Construction in the vicinity was occurring under a different District contract, resulting in the inability to properly survey the site and design was based on the best available information at the time. Due to a difference in actual elevation, redesign of the height of the wet well and installation and coating of an additional section of pre-cast ring were necessary. \$12,263.00.
- h. Unanticipated obstructions encountered during pipe boring. Burial excess concrete that extended well beyond what could have been expected from an existing manhole was encountered under D Street during installation of the effluent and potable water lines. This obstruction was not reasonably foreseeable during the design, and was not shown on existing As-Built drawings. Additional work to remove the obstruction resulted in additional costs to the contractor. \$16,303.00.
- i. Interferences by Central Heat. During installation of the duct bank for the pre-digestion centrate pump station south of the Central Boiler Facility, underground asphaltic concrete was obstructing the path. This obstruction was not reasonably foreseeable during the design and was not shown on existing As-Built drawings. The contractor had to saw cut and remove the obstruction to allow for the installation of the duct bank. \$12,718.00.
- j. WASSTRIP license agreement and associated programming and commissioning to integrate with the Ostara facility. The contractor removed all costs related to integration of WASSTRIP to the Ostara phosphorus recovery facility from the overall construction costs when the District decided that District engineers would be responsible for the design of the WASSTRIP operation. A license agreement is required in order to operate the WASSTRIP process and additional programming and commissioning is required for the integration of WASSTRIP into the operations of the phosphorus recovery facility. The WASSTRIP contract is scheduled to be operational at the end of 2017. The WASSTRIP process will increase the phosphorus yield from Ostara from approximately 3,000 tons per year to 9,000 tons per year. Therefore to ensure the maximum use and benefit of the Ostara facility, this license and work needs to be

added to this contract. \$326,679.10.

- k. Additional work related to large contaminates within the centrate and struvite build-up. Unexpected contaminants in the post-digestion centrate resulted in additional costs associated with cleaning and maintaining the strainers, replacement of the originally designed strainer baskets with baskets having larger mesh sizes, and replacement of the brushes, gaskets and gear boxes on the strainers. This work was above and beyond the normal routine maintenance required for this equipment. Unanticipated struvite build-up required removal of the large post-digestion centrate pumps for servicing and struvite removal. A previously approved change order will add an acid dosing system to the centrate flows, thus mitigating the costly pump rehabilitation costs and interruptions of the Ostara system. \$251,482.97.
- I. Four months of additional commissioning and optimization of the facility by Ostara. Additional on-site costs were incurred by Ostara for commissioning and optimizing the operation of the facility past the expected substantial completion date. This was for the months of March through June, 2017. The facility was not in operation during July and August, 2017. \$242,000.00.

A credit for work not required includes certain landscaping, valve material substitution and DCS integration and programming. The value of the above work is for an extra in the amount of \$1,633,425.28 and a credit in the amount of \$211,486.00 for a net extra in the amount of \$1,421,939.28.

Item 2: The District has determined that it is in our best interest to further extend the commissioning and optimization of the facility by Ostara under this contract for an additional eight months (September 2017 through March 2018). During this period, Ostara will provide operational staff to further optimize the facility. The additional oversight by Ostara will allow the District operating staff further shadowing opportunities, optimization of the operation of the reactors for efficiency and optimal product recovery, and provide oversight during the start-up and integration of flows from the WASSTRIP process. The value of this work is an extra in the amount of \$484,000.00. The contractor submitted a proposal (CCO-025) in a negotiated amount for an extra in the amount of \$2,117,425.28 and a credit in the amount of \$211,486.00, for a net extra in the amount of \$1,905,939.28. The engineer reviewed this proposal, found it reasonable, and stated via correspondence 574, that the Engineering Department would recommend its approval.

This change order is in compliance with the Illinois Criminal Code since the change is germane to the contract as signed.

On December 23, 2016, the Director of Procurement and Materials Management issued a purchase order to Networkfleet, Inc., for vehicle location system services under General Services Administration (GSA) Joint Purchasing Contract GS-07F-5559R, in an amount not to exceed \$9,323.40. The purchase order expires on December 31, 2017.

On October 6, 2011, the District's Board of Commissioners authorized participation in the GSA Federal Cooperative Purchasing Program under the Government Joint Purchasing Act, 30 ILCS 525/0.01 et.seq. GSA currently has a competitively bid contract for vehicle location system services with Networkfleet, Inc. The term of the contract began on January 1, 2010 and expires on December 31, 2019. Networkfleet, Inc. is registered and in good standing with the State of Illinois.

This purchase order has no prior change orders.

At the time of initial purchase order issuance, the District was only pursuing vehicle location system services/GPS installation in approximately 41 Fleet vehicles. However, upon review and consideration of the many benefits provided through vehicle location system services, it is now deemed beneficial to pursue District -wide implementation for a majority of the remaining 191 Fleet vehicles. Installation is expected to begin in October 2017 and conclude prior to year-end.

This change order is in compliance with the Illinois Criminal Code since the change is due to circumstances not reasonably foreseeable at the time the contract was signed, and is in the best interest of the District.

At the Board meeting of September 4, 2014, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to issue a purchase order and enter into an agreement for Contract 14-RFP-22 Remote Storage of District Records with R4 Services LLC, in an amount not to exceed \$119,000.00. The contract expires on December 17, 2017.

As of September 15, 2017, the attached change orders have been approved. The net effect of these change orders resulted in a decrease totaling \$29,689.90, from the amount originally awarded of \$119,000.00. The current value is \$89,310.10. The prior approved changes reflect a 24.9% decrease to the original contract value.

This change order is requested to cover services for the remainder of this year and to extend services for three (3) additional years. Delays in awarding this contract and problems related to the transition of records from the former vendor's storage locations resulted in no services being provided in 2014. On September 1, 2016, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to award Contract 14-824-3DR Rehabilitation of Bridges, NSA on the North Shore Channel, to IHC Construction Companies, LLC, in an amount not to exceed \$2,093,000.00, plus a five (5) percent allowance for change orders in an amount of \$104,650, for a total amount not to exceed \$2,197,650. The scheduled contract completion date is October 1, 2017.

As of September 15, 2017, the attached list of change orders has been approved. The effect of these change orders resulted in an increase in the amount of \$182,557.49 from the original amount awarded of \$2,093,000. The current contract value is \$2,275,557.49. The prior approved change orders reflect a 8.72% increase to the original contract value.

This contract involves the rehabilitation of two bridges along the North Shore channel in the Village of Wilmette. During construction, it was discovered that many of the steel stringers beneath the concrete sidewalk panels had severe corrosion, which required replacement. A change order CCO-003, Replacement and Repair of Deteriorated Beams to replace the stringers was approved on June 20, 2017. New stringers were ordered by the contractor, but the time required to fabricate and deliver the materials caused a delay to the contract, as this work was on the critical path. The contractor recently submitted Revision 3A of the Work Schedule which indicates that the delays associated with CCO-003, forced work associated with the Maple Avenue Bridge into winter months. The contractor will have to shut down over the winter due to weather and continue next spring, extending the contract completion date into the summer months of 2018. To minimize the delay, the Engineering Department met with the contractor to determine how to expedite the contract since the public is affected by the road and sidewalk closures. Additionally, the District has consulted with the Village of Wilmette, Canal Shores Golf Club and Baker Demonstration School to discuss their interests. In order to expedite the contract for completion this construction season, the contractor has proposed weekend work at Maple Avenue Bridge to be performed on an over-time basis and the utilization of a low temperature coating system with the supply temporary heat, as needed, and to allow for the closure of sidewalks on both sides of the bridge concurrently, rather than one at a time which is allowed by contract. All parties agree that closing both sidewalks on the Maple Avenue Bridge concurrently will accelerate the schedule and is in all parties' best interest. The engineer reviewed the potential work required and determined that the work shall be performed on a Time and Material basis, in an amount not to exceed \$100,000.00, and stated via correspondence 87, that the Engineering Department would recommend its approval.

If approved, the contractor would only be allowed to proceed with the closure, provided the following

conditions are met:

- 1. Contract work associated with the Linden Avenue Bridge must be complete before starting work on the Maple Avenue Bridge.
- The contractor shall sequence the work to ensure that one sidewalk is completed and re-opened for pedestrian access within 5 to 6 weeks from date of closure, and the entire Maple Avenue Bridge will be opened by mid-December 2017.
- 3. A traffic and pedestrian detour plan must be approved by the District and the Village of Wilmette prior to proceeding with the work.
- 4. The contractor shall obtain required permits for the closure.
- 5. The contractor shall update and distribute a brochure to the residents along Maple Avenue, Canal Shores Golf Club and the Baker Demonstration School, providing detail on the scope of work, anticipated completion dates, detour plans and contact information for the contractor's representative in charge of the public information program. The brochure shall also be provided to the Village of Wilmette so it can be posted on their website.

This change order is in compliance with the Illinois Criminal Code since the change is due to circumstances not reasonably foreseeable at the time the contract was signed, and is in the best interest of the District.

Authority to settle Alpha Baking Company, Inc.'s 2015 User Charge liability in the total amount of \$25,959.00, with a waiver of interest in the amount of \$2,030.47, Board Appeal No. 17B-002

Dear Sir:

The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago ("District") and Alpha Baking Company, Inc. ("Alpha Baking") have reached a settlement of Board Appeal No. 17B-002 arising out of Alpha Baking's 2015 User Charge liability, thereby eliminating the need for a formal hearing before the District's Board of Commissioners ("Board").

The District's original determination of Alpha Baking's 2015 Net User Charge ("NUC"), based on the District's sampling data and Alpha Baking's data, was \$122,614.86. Alpha Baking appealed its 2015 NUC assessment to the District's Director of Monitoring and Research ("Director" and "M&R") by a letter dated November 11, 2016.

The Director considered information provided by Alpha Baking demonstrating that water-to-product losses and the installation of a new production line reduced the flow volume for the year. Based on that information, the Director determined that Alpha Baking's Total NUC liability should be reduced to \$57,280.00.

Alpha Baking subsequently appealed the Director's Determination of \$57,280.00 to the District's Board on March 14, 2017. The Board granted Alpha Baking's request for an appeal by virtue of a Board Order dated April 6, 2017.

The District and Alpha Baking have subsequently agreed to accept \$25,959.00 as Alpha Baking's Total NUC liability for 2015, with a waiver of interest in the amount of \$2,030.47. The reduced amount is supported by additional information obtained over the course of the appeal proceedings before the Hearing Officer which demonstrated a significantly reduced flow volume, including the following: production records; pounds of product produced; daily water-to-product losses; daily hours of operation; subsequent District inspections; and manufacturer specifications for proofing equipment. Based on this information, the total NUC was able to be recomputed using a revised wastewater flow measurement methodology that was acceptable to the District.

M&R has approved the settlement and the Hearing Officer retained by the Board to adjudicate this matter, James J. Caronis, has also approved the settlement on these terms.

Dear Sir:

Sheryl Gorski is a Laborer Foreman at the Stickney Water Reclamation Plant. On April 29, 2015, she sustained injuries to her neck, back, head and left arm. Ms. Gorski was initially seen in the hospital emergency room on April 29, 2015. She was disabled from work effective April 30, 2015. She underwent a conservative treatment for her multiple injuries consisting of physical therapy and medication. She was able to return to work on July 30, 2015. On January 27, 2016 she was disabled as she underwent surgery to repair her left shoulder. Following this surgery the employee underwent additional physical therapy. Ms. Gorski was able to return to work on March 21, 2016.

Ms. Gorski was paid a total of \$21,415.76 representing 20.60 weeks of lost time benefits.

Ms. Gorski filed an Application of Adjustment of Claim with the Illinois Workers' Compensation Commission (IWCC) through her counsel. Subject to the approval of the IWCC, this case can now be settled for \$65,870.76, representing approximately 4% loss of use of the person as a whole for the neck, back and head and 13.915% loss of the person as a whole for her left arm. This settlement will close out future lost time benefits, as well as any future medical benefits associated with this injury.

The Director of Human Resources believes this settlement is in the best interest of the District and requests payment of that sum be approved and she be authorized to execute such documents as may be necessary to effect the settlement.

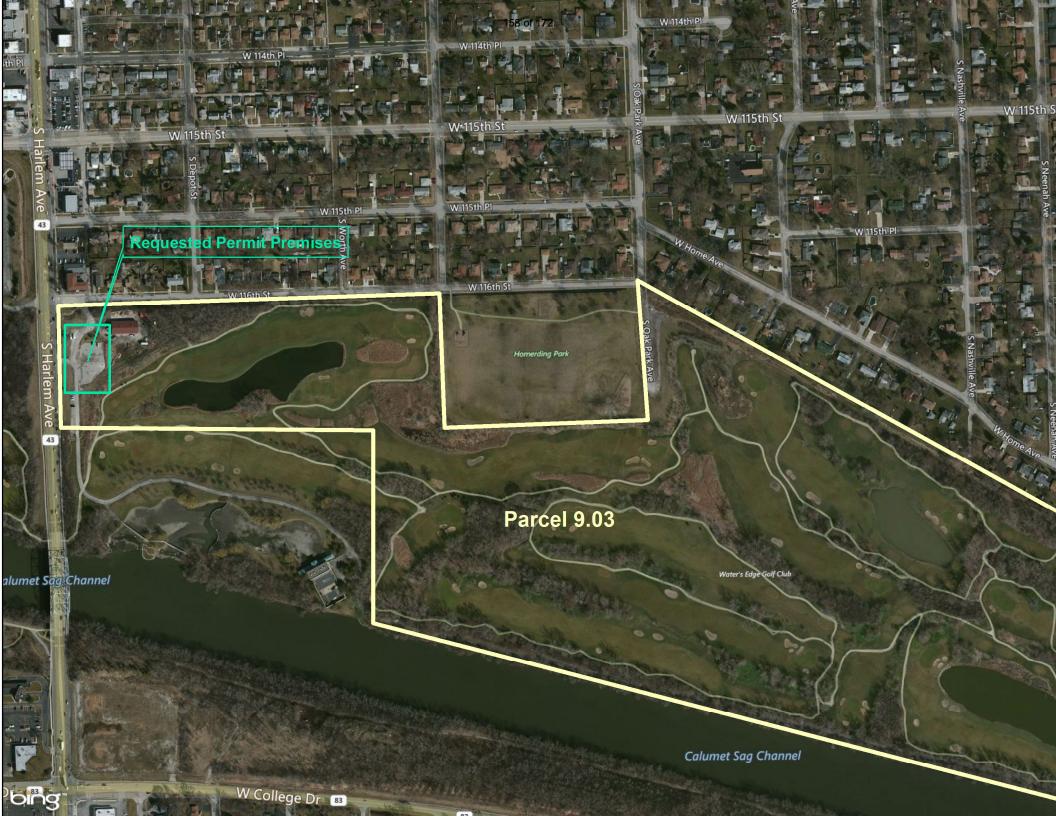

Dear Sir:

On April 1, 1993, the Board of Commissioners granted a 25-year, 18,240± sq. ft. non-exclusive easement to the Village of Wilmette ("Wilmette") to construct, reconstruct, operate, maintain, repair, replace and remove a public sewer line consisting of a relief sewer, a by-pass structure and a relief sewer manhole for a nominal fee of \$10.00. The sewer line, commonly known as the Greenleaf Avenue Relief Sewer System, traverses North Shore Channel Parcel 1.05 between Greenleaf Avenue and Sheridan Road in Wilmette, Illinois. The easement expires May 31, 2018.

Wilmette has requested a new 25-year easement to continue to operate and maintain the sewer line. Parcel 1.05 is leased by the District to the Wilmette Park District for use as a public golf course known as Canal Shores. The subject lease expires May 31, 2032. Accordingly, Wilmette will also need to obtain the written consent of the Wilmette Park District to continue using this leasehold for the subject easement request.

Dear Sir:

ExxonMobil Oil Corporation ("ExxonMobil") currently occupies approximately 4.46 acres of District real estate located east of Cicero Avenue and north of the Main Channel in Chicago, Illinois and known as Main Channel Parcel 40.02, under a permit that commenced October 30, 2016, and expires on October 29, 2017. The permit fee is \$87,425.00. ExxonMobil uses the site for truck parking, weighing of packaged and drummed lubricants in conjunction with its adjacent distribution center, and performing environmental testing. The parcel is currently improved with a barge dock. ExxonMobil previously subleased this parcel from Peoples Gas Light and Coke Company ("Peoples Gas") from 1943 to October 29, 2016. Peoples Gas previously leased this parcel under a 99-year lease that commenced in 1917 and expired October 31, 2016.

ExxonMobil has requested to lease Parcel 40.02 for the same purposes that it uses the land under the permit. The requested lease term is thirty-nine (39) years. ExxonMobil has also requested a one (1) year extension of the permit to continue its operations on Parcel 40.02 during the statutory leasing process. A companion transmittal letter is on today's agenda seeking an extension of the permit.

The District's technical departments have reviewed this lease request and have indicated that the subject site is not currently needed for corporate use and that they have no objections thereto.

ExxonMobil Oil Corporation ("ExxonMobil") occupies approximately 4.46 acres of District real estate located east of Cicero Avenue and north of the Main Channel in Chicago, Illinois and known as Main Channel Parcel 40.02 under a permit that commenced October 30, 2016, and expires October 29, 2017. ExxonMobil uses the site for the purpose of truck parking, weighing of packaged materials in conjunction with its adjacent distribution center, and performing environmental testing. ExxonMobil previously occupied this site under a sublease from Peoples Gas Light and Coke Company from 1943 to October 29, 2016. The current annual permit fee is 87,425.00.

ExxonMobil has requested a long term lease of Parcel 40.02. In conjunction with this request, ExxonMobil has also requested a one (1) year permit extension to allow it to continue using Parcel 40.02 during the statutory leasing process. A companion transmittal letter is on today's agenda seeking authority to commence statutory procedures for leasing the parcel.

The Alsip Park District ("Alsip") currently leases the subject 79.931 acres known as Cal-Sag Channel Parcels 11.02, 11.03, 12.01, 12.03, 12.11 and part of Parcel 10.03 for public recreational use and for the construction, operation and maintenance of the Cal-Sag Trail, a bicycle/pedestrian path. The lease commenced November 1, 1993, and as amended, expires October 31, 2052. The annual rent is \$10.00.

Alsip has requested to surrender 0.074 acres of its 79.931 acre leasehold, thereby reducing the acreage from 79.931 acres to 79.857 acres, so that the District can commence statutory leasing procedures for a new long-term lease on that section of the site. RESOLUTION sponsored by the Board of Commissioners recognizing William Yoshino for his years of service to the community

WHEREAS, Bill Yoshino was hired as Midwest Regional Director of the Japanese American Citizens League (JACL) in 1978; and

WHEREAS, in his work with the JACL, Bill was devoted to the effort to seek a remedy for the Japanese Internment during World War II; and

WHEREAS, Bill was instrumental in organizing grassroots letter writing and lobbying campaigns to members of Congress for legislation to establish the Commission on Wartime Relocation and Internment of Civilians and to pass Civil Liberties Act of 1988; and

WHEREAS, when the Commission held one of its hearings in Chicago, Bill worked to identify and prepare witnesses to testify; and

WHEREAS, in the 1990s, Bill worked with the Office of Redress Administration to assist in contacting individuals who were eligible to receive redress payments; and

WHEREAS, Bill is a respected leader in JACL's efforts to combat anti-Asian sentiment through stronger hate crime legislation and anti-defamation initiatives; and

WHEREAS, Bill testified before the U.S. Senate on the Hate Crimes Statistics Act of 1988, has produced a semi-annual newsletter on hate crimes and hate incidents and has conducted hate crime workshops at college conferences; and

WHEREAS, locally, Bill has represented the Asian American community on the Illinois Asian American Advisory Council to the Governor, the Chicago Asian American Advisory Committee, the Chicago Commission on Human Relations, and the Illinois Commission on Discrimination and Hate Crimes; and

WHEREAS, Bill supported and expanded JACL's youth and leadership programs by organizing teacher training workshops through grants from the National Park Service and the National Endowment for the Humanities, revising and updating the JACL curriculum guide, and producing educational materials on Japanese American internment and Asian Pacific Islander history. He also established the JACL Collegiate Washington, DC Leadership Program and has provided fellowship opportunities to college graduates; and

WHEREAS, Bill has insured the continued success of the Japanese American Citizens League through his dedicated work to develop young leaders; and

WHEREAS, Bill's commitment to honor and address history and his work to educate the public on hate crimes to prevent future injustices has made a major impact on generations of citizens; and
