Report on investments purchased during September 2017

Dear Sir:

Attached is a report indicating the investments made in securities and overnight money market funds for the various District Funds during the month of September 2017.

During the month, 27 individual investments were made with a total par value of \$105,000,000.00 at an average annual yield of 1.24%. The interest income to maturity of these investments is \$442,423.62.

Additionally, 6 investments were made in Money Market Funds during the month, with a par value of \$59,183.97 at an average annual yield of 1.00%.

The fixed income market continues to be challenged by exceptionally low investment yields. There is very little risk premium to be earned by extending maturities for uncollateralized investments such as commercial paper beyond a 60-day period. As such, investments continue to be made to meet the District's liquidity demands for debt service, payroll, and other operating expenditures, based upon the best yield offered on the date of investment as well as the diversification requirements of the District's Investment Policy. See the last page of the attachment for the average market interest rates offered for purchases during the month. Commercial Paper and Money Markets continue to provide the highest yields for short-term investment requirements.

The proposals were evaluated by consultants from Deloitte Consulting and staff of the Human Resources and Procurement and Materials Management Departments. Rilco, Inc., the low bidder for contract items 4, 6, 7, 11, 13, 15, 20, 23, and 25, proposed substitutions for these items. Per the material specifications, and the MWRD Board of Standards Specification #75-08-27-02, substitutions are not allowed for these materials. Therefore, Rilco's bid for these items is considered non-responsive and rejected in the public's best interest. The Director of Procurement and Materials Management has notified Rilco, Inc., of this action.

Atlas & Associates, Inc., the low bidder for items 9, 16, and 18, and the next-lowest bidder for items 15 and 20, has been deemed a non-responsible bidder and will not be awarded the items listed. At the Board Meeting of

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February 2, 2017, the District forfeited Contract 16-005-11, Group B, Furnish and Deliver Pallets to Various Locations for a One (1) Year Period, due to Atlas's failure to perform according to contract specifications for non-delivery of equipment. For this reason, Atlas & Associates has been placed on the District's list of non-responsible vendors per section 70 ILCS 2605/11.11 of the Purchasing Act for a two-year period expiring February 2, 2019.

Rilco, Inc., the lowest responsible bidder for items 1, 22, and 24, is proposing to perform the contract in accordance with the specifications. The estimated cost for items 1, 22, and 24 was \$13,982.00, placing the total bid of \$12,696.00 approximately 9.2 percent below the estimate.

Midtown Petroleum Acquisition, LLC, d.b.a. RelaDyne, the lowest responsible bidder for items 2, 4, 7, 8, 15, 16, 18, 20, 23, and 29, is proposing to perform the contract in accordance with the specifications. The estimated cost for items 2, 4, 7, 8, 15, 16, 18, 20, 23, and 29 was \$43,227.00, placing the total bid of \$41,452.40 approximately 4.1 percent below the estimate.

Valdes, LLC, the lowest responsible bidder for items 3 and 5, is proposing to perform the contract in accordance with the specifications. The estimated cost for items 3 and 5 was \$4,855.00, placing the total bid of \$3,755.00 approximately 22.7 percent below the estimate.

Feece Oil Company, the lowest responsible bidder for items 6, 11, 12, 13, 14, 17, and 21, is proposing to perform the contract in accordance with the specifications. The estimated cost for items 6, 11, 12, 13, 14, 17, and 21 was \$86,917.00, placing the total bid of \$67,895.96 approximately 21.9 percent below the estimate.

Superior Petroleum Products & Fuels, Inc., the lowest responsible bidder for items 9 and 26, is proposing to perform the contract in accordance with the specifications. The estimated cost for items 9 and 26 was \$20,155.00, placing the total bid of \$15,040.75 approximately 25.4 percent below the estimate.

PetroChoice, LLC, the lowest responsible bidder for items 10, 19, 25, 27, 28, and 30, is proposing to perform the contract in accordance with the specifications. The estimated cost for items 10, 19, 25, 27, 28, and 30 was \$51,564.00, placing the total bid of \$44,071.13 approximately 14.5 percent below the estimate.

Authority to increase Contract 11-195-AP Phosphorus Recovery System, Stickney Water Reclamation Plant, to Black & Veatch Construction, Inc. in an amount of \$1,905,939.28, from an amount of \$34,905,483.55, to an amount not to exceed \$36,811,422.83, Accounts 401-50000-645650 and 201-50000-612430, Purchase Order 5001478 (Deferred from the October 5, 2017 Board Meeting)

### Dear Sir:

On August 7, 2014, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to award Contract 11-195-AP Phosphorus Recovery System, Stickney Water Reclamation Plant, to Black & Veatch Construction, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$31,879,000.00. The scheduled contract completion date was October 29, 2016.

As of September 15, 2017, the attached list of change orders has been approved. The effect of these change orders resulted in an increase in an amount of \$3,026,483.55 from the original amount awarded of \$31,879,000.00. The current contract value is \$34,905,483.55. The prior approved change orders reflect a 9.49% increase to the original contract value.

Item 1: This contract differed from typical District contracts in that a modified design-build approach was taken. The modified approach allowed for expedited design and construction of the facility with significant District oversight to ensure that District standards were met. During construction of the facility, several claims arose for work that was not foreseen during the design phase, differed from the original scope, or resulted from unexpected field conditions. The extra work included are as follows:

- a. Winter weather protection. The construction schedule was accelerated to have the majority of the facility completed for WEFTEC 2015. The timing of the contract award resulted in construction beginning in the winter months. Therefore, a heated tent was provided to allow for installation of the building foundation during the winter to expedite the project schedule. \$243,765.00.
- b. Additional costs associated with the accelerated schedule were due to re-sequencing of the equipment assembly and installation, including assembly of the reactors outside of the building foundation and placement of the reactors into the partially assembled building. Unanticipated work included the installation of a reactor assembly pad outside of the building and crane costs to move the assembled reactors into the building. \$42,477.21.
- c. Reinforcement and copper grounding of electrical duct banks. The District requested the contractor to include a higher level of reinforcement and grounding for all electrical duct banks through the entirety of the duct bank for increased stability and safety. Black & Veatch Construction (B&V) had only included the higher level of reinforcement within 15 feet of building entrances, under and within 5 feet of roadways, and within 10 feet of indicated future excavations. While their design was within code, the District requested a

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betterment to ensure long-term stability and safety of the duct bank. \$125,441.00.

- d. Steam line modifications. B&V's original design had the high pressure steam traps along the upper bridge, discharging to the pumped condensate from the facility. The District had concerns that in the long term operation of the facility, potential for hammer within the piping system may occur and requested a separate condensate return line be provided for these traps. Additionally, their original design had a steam pressure reducing station and low pressure coil for the make-up air handling unit. The District requested that a high pressure coil be provided to match the incoming steam pressure, thereby reducing future maintenance related to the reducing station. While their design was within code, the District requested a betterment to ensure long-term stability and safety. These requested modifications of the steam and condensate system resulted in additional engineering and construction costs. \$130,698.00.
- e. Building relocation. Upon initiation of the excavation for the post-digestion centrate pump station, an existing duct bank and manhole were encountered which were not shown on the existing As-Built drawings supplied to B&V. This caused an interference with the planned location of the pump station and building foundation. To eliminate the interference, the building was relocated 15 feet to the east. Due to this unforeseen condition, the relocation resulted in additional costs for steam system piping and supports, driveway surface, site grading, drainage and engineering design costs. \$134,616.00.
- f. Potable Water relocation. B&V's original design for potable water utilized a connection point from the MBM pelletizer facility water line. In order to control and reduce water usage costs, the District re-located the potable water connection to a District controlled supply at a location further from the facility. Additional costs were incurred to facilitate the longer connection distance. \$94,982.00.
- g. Elevation adjustments for the pre-digestion centrate pumping station. Grade elevations at the pre-digestion wet well were different than what was shown on the existing As- Built drawings supplied from the District to B&V. Construction in the vicinity was occurring under a different District contract, resulting in the inability to properly survey the site and design was based on the best available information at the time. Due to a difference in actual elevation, redesign of the height of the wet well and installation and coating of an additional section of pre-cast ring were necessary. \$12,263.00.
- h. Unanticipated obstructions encountered during pipe boring. Burial excess concrete that extended well beyond what could have been expected from an existing manhole was encountered under D Street during installation of the effluent and potable water lines. This obstruction was not reasonably foreseeable during the design, and was not shown on existing As-Built drawings. Additional work to remove the obstruction resulted in additional costs to the contractor. \$16,303.00.
- i. Interferences by Central Heat. During installation of the duct bank for the pre-digestion centrate pump station south of the Central Boiler Facility, underground asphaltic concrete was obstructing the path. This obstruction was not reasonably foreseeable during the design and was not shown on existing As-Built drawings. The contractor had to saw cut and remove the obstruction to allow for the installation of the duct bank. \$12,718.00.
- j. WASSTRIP license agreement and associated programming and commissioning to integrate with the Ostara facility. The contractor removed all costs related to integration of WASSTRIP to the Ostara phosphorus recovery facility from the overall construction costs when the District decided that District engineers would be responsible for the design of the WASSTRIP operation. A license agreement is required in order to operate the WASSTRIP process and additional programming and commissioning is required for the integration of WASSTRIP into the operations of the phosphorus recovery facility. The WASSTRIP contract is scheduled to be operational at the end of 2017. The WASSTRIP process will increase the phosphorus yield from Ostara from approximately 3,000 tons per year to 9,000 tons per year. Therefore to ensure the maximum use and benefit of the Ostara facility, this license and work needs to be

added to this contract. \$326,679.10.

- k. Additional work related to large contaminates within the centrate and struvite build-up. Unexpected contaminants in the post-digestion centrate resulted in additional costs associated with cleaning and maintaining the strainers, replacement of the originally designed strainer baskets with baskets having larger mesh sizes, and replacement of the brushes, gaskets and gear boxes on the strainers. This work was above and beyond the normal routine maintenance required for this equipment. Unanticipated struvite build-up required removal of the large post-digestion centrate pumps for servicing and struvite removal. A previously approved change order will add an acid dosing system to the centrate flows, thus mitigating the costly pump rehabilitation costs and interruptions of the Ostara system. \$251,482.97.
- I. Four months of additional commissioning and optimization of the facility by Ostara. Additional on-site costs were incurred by Ostara for commissioning and optimizing the operation of the facility past the expected substantial completion date. This was for the months of March through June, 2017. The facility was not in operation during July and August, 2017. \$242,000.00.

A credit for work not required includes certain landscaping, valve material substitution and DCS integration and programming. The value of the above work is for an extra in the amount of \$1,633,425.28 and a credit in the amount of \$211,486.00 for a net extra in the amount of \$1,421,939.28.

Item 2: The District has determined that it is in our best interest to further extend the commissioning and optimization of the facility by Ostara under this contract for an additional eight months (September 2017 through March 2018). During this period, Ostara will provide operational staff to further optimize the facility. The additional oversight by Ostara will allow the District operating staff further shadowing opportunities, optimization of the operation of the reactors for efficiency and optimal product recovery, and provide oversight during the start-up and integration of flows from the WASSTRIP process. The value of this work is an extra in the amount of \$484,000.00. The contractor submitted a proposal (CCO-025) in a negotiated amount for an extra in the amount of \$2,117,425.28 and a credit in the amount of \$211,486.00, for a net extra in the amount of \$1,905,939.28. The engineer reviewed this proposal, found it reasonable, and stated via correspondence 574, that the Engineering Department would recommend its approval.

This change order is in compliance with the Illinois Criminal Code since the change is germane to the contract as signed.

It is hereby recommended that the Board of Commissioners authorize the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to execute a change order to increase Contract 11-195-AP in an amount not to exceed \$1,905,939.28 (5.46% of the current contract value), from an amount of \$34,905,483.55, to an amount not to exceed \$36,811,422.83.

On August 8, 2013, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to award Contract 11-054-3P Disinfection Facilities, Terrence J. O'Brien Water Reclamation Plant, to Walsh Construction Company II, LLC, in an amount not to exceed \$59,899,650.00 plus a five (5) percent allowance for change orders in an amount of \$2,994,982.50, for a total amount not to exceed \$62,894,632.50. The scheduled contract completion date was June 6, 2017.

As of October 6, 2017, the effect of change orders resulted in a net increase in the amount of \$2,578,265.38 from the original amount awarded of 59,899,650.00. The current contract value is \$62,477,915.38. The prior approved change orders reflect a 4.30% increase to the original contract value.

Item 1: A net credit in the amount of \$128,780.64 to install new pavement on the plant roadways. The contract required the use of a 12-inch thick coarse aggregate base and a 6-inch CA-6 capping for the construction of the plant roadways. The contractor submitted a request to substitute a 9-inch thick recycled crushed concrete coarse aggregate base and 3-inch thick FM-6 capping material for the roadway construction. Field investigation determined that the existing roadway base material was approximately 12-inches thick. In order to avoid any unplanned interferences, it was prudent to match the existing road base and avoid the risks of excavating an additional 6-inches. The use of recycled crushed concrete from the existing replaced plant roadways was determined to be structurally acceptable. The credit work consists of reduced roadway base and sub-base thickness, reduced excavation and reduced material costs. The extra work includes removal and replacement of existing guard rail which was not indicated on the contract drawings required to perform the roadwork. The work has been completed. Before the engineer's determination on the change order, the contractor proceeded at his own risk with this work as determined in his best interest in executing the overall contract. The contractor submitted a cost proposal (CCO-064) for an extra in the amount of \$13,527.72 and a credit in the amount of \$142,308.36, for a net credit in the amount of \$128,780.64. The engineer reviewed the proposal, found it to be reasonable, and stated via correspondence 1934, that the Engineering Department would recommend its approval.

Item 2: A Settlement of Claim in the amount of \$901,835.69 to rebuild the Chicago Transit Authority's Yellow Line Railroad tracks. Although the contractor builder's risk insurance covered much of the damage caused by the embankment collapse, the cost to rebuild the railroad tracks was not covered. The work was necessary to quickly and safely restore service to the public. The contractor submitted a proposal which included costs for earthwork, sub-ballast and ballast installation, associated electrical work and instrumentation work. Payment

of this claim will not operate as an admission of liability by the District. If approved by the Board of Commissioners, the contractor will be required to sign a Release before any monies are disbursed in this Settlement of Claim. In addition, the District agrees to waive the time related liquidated damages incurred on this contract. The work has been completed. Before the engineer's determination on the change order, the contractor proceeded at his own risk with this work as determined in his best interest in executing the overall contract. The contractor submitted a cost proposal (CCO-070) for an addition in the amount of \$901,835.69. The engineer reviewed the proposal, and stated via correspondence 2056, that the Engineering Department would recommend its approval.

The above two change orders are in compliance with the Illinois Criminal Code since the changes are due to circumstances not reasonably foreseeable at the time the contract was signed, and are in the best interest of the District.

It is hereby recommended that the Board of Commissioners authorize the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to execute two change orders to increase Contract 11-054-3P in an amount of \$773,055.05 (1.24% of the current contract value), from an amount of \$62,477,915.38, to an amount not to exceed \$63,250,970.43.

On July 7, 2016, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to award Contract 15-123-3D Safety Railing Around Tanks, Stickney Water Reclamation Plant, to IHC Construction Companies, LLC and F.H. Paschen, S.N. Nielsen & Associates LLC Joint Venture, in an amount not to exceed \$5,239,000.00. The scheduled contract completion date was October 3, 2017.

As of October 6, 2017, the attached list of change orders has been approved. The effect of these change orders resulted in an increase in an amount of \$32,460.61 from the original amount awarded of \$5,239,000.00. The current contract value is \$5,271,460.61. The prior approved change orders reflect a 0.62% increase to the original contract value.

Item 1: During the installation of the 95,300 linear feet of new galvanized steel safety railing throughout the primary tanks and aeration tanks, it was noted that some of the 38,120 expansion anchors required to mount the handrail were located in or directly adjacent to cracks in the concrete. The contract required mechanical expansion anchors which are not suitable for this application. In order to properly mount the handrail in this condition, adhesive anchors need to be used. The engineer has determined that 2,500 adhesive anchors are required to be installed in the cracked concrete conditions in lieu of mechanical anchors to secure the handrails safely. Therefore, extra work is required for material and labor costs to install 2,500 adhesive anchors. Credit work includes installation costs for 2,500 mechanical expansion anchors that will not be installed. The contractor submitted a cost proposal (CCO-001) for an extra in the amount of \$206,699.30 and a credit in the amount of \$18,700.00, for a net extra in the amount of \$187,999.30. The engineer reviewed the proposal, found it to be reasonable, and stated via correspondence 99, that the Engineering Department would recommend its approval.

Item 2: The contract required 8,900 linear feet of existing handrail located along the South and North walkways of aeration Batteries A and B to be sandblasted and painted. Prior to commencement of the work, the resident engineer reported poor connection conditions for some of the existing handrail post anchors into the concrete. The anchor nuts for the handrail post connections were visibly intact; however, moderate force applied to the post connections displaced the handrail beyond safe conditions and revealed that the handrail fasteners had fully corroded beneath the base plate. The engineer determined that 1,826 linear feet of existing handrail needed to be replaced with new handrail. Credit work included deletion of cleaning and painting work not required. The contractor submitted a cost proposal (CCO-004) for an extra in the amount of \$187,877.81 and a credit in the amount of \$74,242.80, for a net extra in the amount of \$113,635.01. The engineer reviewed the

The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago ("District") and Beaver Oil Company, Inc. ("Beaver Oil") have reached a settlement of Board Appeal No. 17B-001 arising out of Beaver Oil's 2015 User Charge liability, thereby eliminating the need for a formal hearing before the District's Board of Commissioners ("Board").

By way of background, on February 19, 2016, Beaver Oil submitted its User Charge Annual Certified Statement ("RD-925") for year 2015 to the District. In that RD-925, Beaver Oil reported a Net User Charge ("NUC") of \$453,921.93. The NUC was calculated by: (1) merging the District's and Beaver Oil's sampling data for biochemical oxygen demand ("BOD") and suspended solids ("SS") on a flow-weighted average basis, (2) applying that merged data to Beaver Oil's reported annual flow volume to calculate a Total Wastewater Loading Charge, and (3) adding a Minimum Pretreatment Requirement Charge.

After reviewing Beaver Oil's RD-925, the District revised Beaver Oil's NUC. Specifically, the District decreased the merged BOD and SS flow-weighted average because Beaver Oil had inadvertently used outdated data in its calculation. On its own, this revision would have led to a slightly decreased NUC. However, the District also revised the annual flow volume and the Minimum Pretreatment Requirement Charge, which had the net effect of significantly increasing the NUC to \$1,317,731.28.

The District advised Beaver Oil of this revision in a Notification of Revision dated June 1, 2016. In that correspondence, the District explained that Beaver Oil's flow meter calibration records were unacceptable for all but 3 months of 2015 and that, therefore, the District had to recompute Beaver Oil's volume using the maximum daily flow for 9 months of the year. The District also increased Beaver Oil's Minimum Pretreatment Requirement Charge based on five sample points that are specified in Beaver Oil's Discharge Authorization.

Beaver Oil appealed the revised NUC to the District's Director of Monitoring & Research ("Director"), and a corresponding appeal meeting took place on August 22, 2016. Based on that appeal, the Director determination revised the NUC using Beaver Oil's average, rather than maximum, daily flow. This resulted in a revised NUC of \$904,609.05, which the Director communicated to Beaver Oil by letter dated January 31, 2017.

In order to dispute the Director's determination, Beaver Oil timely filed the subject matter appeal on February 24, 2017. A Preliminary User Charge Hearing for this appeal was conducted on July 21, 2017. At that hearing, Beaver Oil asserted that its actual daily flow (as reported in its RD-925) should be used for calculating Beaver Oil's NUC. The District agreed to recalculate Beaver Oil's NUC using that volume in exchange for Beaver Oil's

agreement to undertake certain best management practices that will further ensure accurate and proper reporting in the future and will be memorialized in Beaver Oil's Discharge Authorization ("DA"). Pursuant to the above, the District will use Beaver Oil's reported annual flow volume to calculate a revised NUC of \$450,792.62.

The District's Monitoring & Research Department has approved the settlement and the Hearing Officer retained by the Board to adjudicate this matter, Jonathan A. Rosenblatt, has also approved the settlement on these terms.

Therefore, the General Counsel respectfully requests that the Board of Commissioners approve the settlement of Beaver Oil's 2015 Net User Charge liability in the total amount of \$450,792.62, and for authority to execute such documents as may be necessary to effect same.

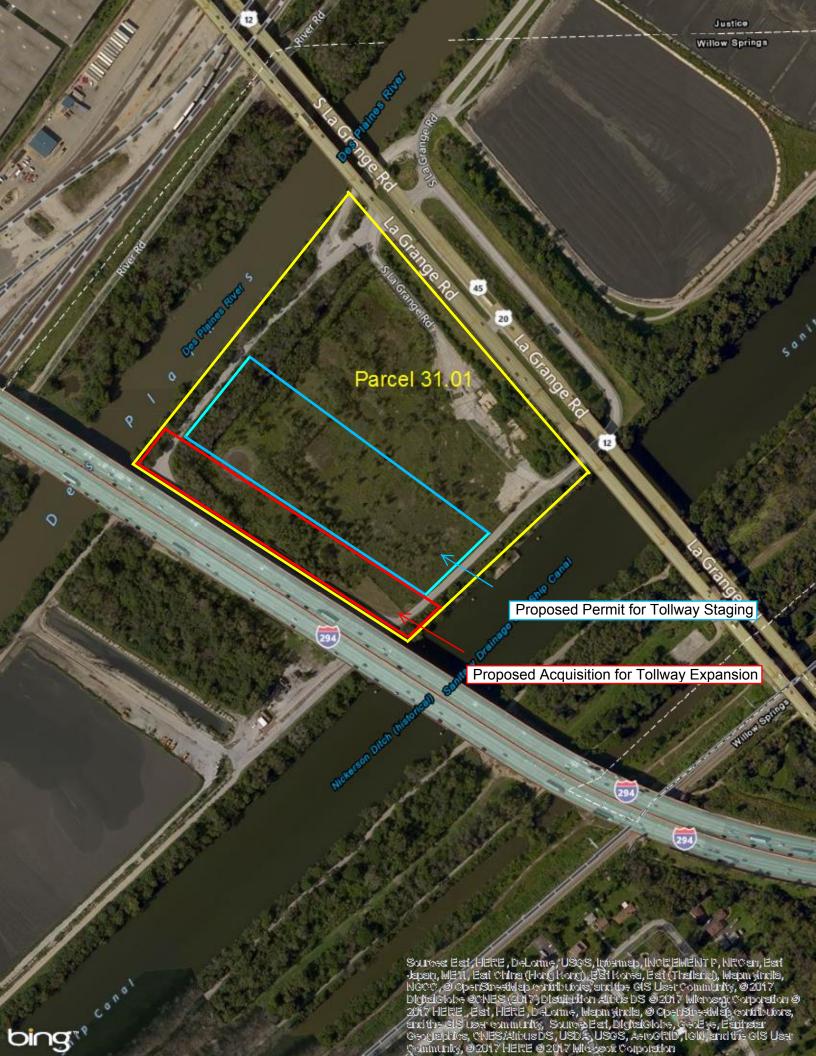

The District has requested that the South Stickney Sanitary District ("SSSD") enter into a Utility Relocation Agreement ("URA") with the District that would provide for the relocation of a certain existing water main of SSSD. The water main is located on parcels of real estate recently acquired by the District as part of the District's Melvina Ditch Reservoir Improvements Project ("Project"), which will expand the Melvina Ditch Reservoir ("Reservoir") (Contract 14-263-3F). The parcels are located north of 87<sup>th</sup> Street and west of Natchez Avenue in Burbank, Illinois.

The existing SSSD water main provided service to the residential area adjacent to the Reservoir. Due to its proximity to the expanded Reservoir, it has to be relocated so that the surrounding area can continue to receive such service.

Under the URA, the District's contractor will remove the existing water main and replace it with a new water main at the northern boundary of the Reservoir area as part of the Project construction. The relocated easement area is approximately the same size and scope of SSSD's existing easement area and comprises approximately 7,026 square feet. The Engineering Department has confirmed that such relocation is consistent with the District's plans for the construction, operation, and maintenance of the expanded Reservoir, and that the relocation work was included in the contract documents and specifications prepared for the Project.

Connelly-GPM, Inc. ("Connelly") previously leased approximately 5.95 acres of District real estate located at 3154 S. California Avenue in Chicago, Illinois and known as Main Channel Parcels 42.05 and 42.16 under two separate leases. The lease on Parcel 42.05 comprised 4.63 acres, commenced May 1, 1918, and expired April 30, 2017. The annual rent was \$1,410.00. The lease on Parcel 42.16 comprised 1.32 acres, commenced February 1, 1999, and expired April 30, 2017. The annual rent under this lease was \$41,004.00. Connelly uses the sites to operate an iron sponge manufacturing business. Connelly was in the process of selling its business but requested that the new entity continue leasing the site for a 10-year term. Connelly currently occupies the parcels under an interim permit that commenced May 1, 2017 and, as extended, expires October 31, 2017. The permit fee is \$16,250.00 per month.

As a result of Connelly's request, the Board of Commissioners ("Board") authorized the advertisement of Contract 17-360-11 for the public tender of bids a 10-year lease on the subject property for a minimum initial annual rental bid of \$195,000.00. The bid opening was January 24, 2017, and no bids were received. As no bids were received, on March 16, 2017, the Board authorized the re-bid of the site at the statutory minimum initial annual rental bid of 6% of the highest of the three appraised values and established the minimum initial annual rental bid amount at \$117,000.00. The bid opening was set for April 18, 2017, and one bid was submitted by Connelly-GPM Environmental, LLC ("CGPM"), the potential purchaser of Connelly. The bid was rejected as being non-responsive. CGPM requested that the site be re-advertised again to allow it the opportunity to re-bid. The site was again re-advertised as available for lease for a minimum bid of \$117,000.00. The bid opening was June 4, 2017. CGPM submitted a bid in the amount of \$118,000 (6.05% of the appraised fair market value), which the Board accepted on July 6, 2017. Connelly has advised that the sale of its business to CGPM is not proceeding, and CGPM has, therefore, elected not to proceed with the lease. Connelly, therefore, has requested that the site be re-advertised again to allow it the opportunity to bid.

As Connelly's permit expires October 31, 2017, a six (6) month permit extension allowing continued occupancy of the site is recommended. ### **RESOLUTION FOR BOARD MEETING OF OCTOBER 19, 2017**

RESOLUTION sponsored by the Board of Commissioners opposing House Bill 4075 pertaining to creating single member districts for Board of Commissioner positions

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago has, throughout its history, exercised outstanding leadership in protecting the integrity of our waterways by promoting regional flood control programs, pollution enforcement and resource recovery activities; and

WHEREAS, the District has vigorously enforced water quality standards thus protecting Lake Michigan and the water supply in its service area and in Northeastern Illinois; and

WHEREAS, it has been the basic philosophy of the District's Board of Commissioners that the health and welfare of all citizens should be protected and fostered; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the District, which, by statute, consists of nine members who are elected at large, has at all times performed its duties in a nonpartisan manner and has placed the common good of the citizenry above the factional interests of any group; and

WHEREAS, the District has met the needs of all of our communities by establishing wastewater treatment facilities throughout the service area of the District in Lemont, Stickney, Skokie, Chicago, Des Plaines, Schaumburg and Hanover Park; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the Board of Commissioners having a regional perspective, the District has designed and constructed over 34 flood control storage reservoirs in diverse locations such as Markham, Thornton, Palatine, Chicago, Ford Heights, Northbrook and Hazel Crest; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the Board of Commissioners having a regional perspective, the District currently has over 100 on-going stormwater management projects throughout its service area; and

WHEREAS, universal recognition has been given to the District as an independent unit of local government that effectively and economically performs its mandated responsibilities of sewage treatment, resource recovery, water quality control and flood management; and

WHEREAS, the District has received numerous awards for practicing efficient, fiscally responsible and transparent government; and

WHEREAS, there is presently pending in the Illinois General Assembly, a bill that would geographically divide the District into nine commissioner districts; and

WHEREAS, electing District commissioners from single member districts would dramatically narrow the perspective and accountability of each commissioner and would foster competition and rivalry among the various communities served by the District; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the District does hereby oppose any legislation, which, by

requiring the election of commissioners from single member districts, would result in competition and rivalry among various communities; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the District does hereby advocate retaining the District-wide election of nine commissioners to the District's Board because this method has proven highly effective in ensuring that the District serves the needs of all communities within its jurisdiction and that the District's Board of Commissioners advocates a cooperative, regional approach to solving the complex environmental problems facing our citizens; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution be spread upon the permanent Record of Proceedings of the Board of Commissioners of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago.

Dear Sir:

The Board of Commissioners adopted the Watershed Management Ordinance (WMO) on October 3, 2013, and amended the WMO on April 17, 2014. The WMO became effective on May 1, 2014, and was further amended on July 10, 2014. The past three years of administration have shed light on revisions that are necessary to document the true intent of the WMO and clarify misconceptions regarding existing language. Input from outside agencies, stakeholders, and our Technical Advisory Committee led to proposing more substantial conceptual changes.

On November 3, 2016, the Board of Commissioners authorized public notification of the intent to amend the WMO. Six public meetings were held to present the proposed revisions, and a nearly five month public comment period resulted in additional input from stakeholders across Cook County. As a result, staff has made revisions to the WMO.

Many of the revisions to the WMO are non-substantive formatting and typographical corrections, and corrections to references found throughout the ordinance. There were no substantial revisions made to Articles 1, 4, 8, 11, 12 and 13 or to Appendices B, C, D and E. A summary of revisions to Articles 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10 and 14 and Appendices A, F and G is attached.

The proposed amendments, including non-substantive changes to the WMO, dated October 19, 2017, are attached for consideration for adoption.

Therefore, it is respectfully requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that the Board approve amendments to the Watershed Management Ordinance, which will be effective October 19, 2017.

### PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE WMO

The Local Sewer Systems Section is proposing changes to the Watershed Management Ordinance (WMO), based on comments and suggestions from the Technical Advisory Committee, municipalities, design engineers, and public comment period. A summary of the substantial changes, by Article, is provided:

Article 2 - Applicability and General Provisions

Revisions to Article 2 include exempting all agricultural activities, not just those that fall under one specific development criteria, clarifying that state and federal agencies and flood control projects are exempt from the stormwater provisions of the WMO, but not the sanitary sewer and District impact provisions, and removing the Existing Development Plans List (EDPL) from this article and the title of associated Appendix C, as this provision of the WMO expired on May 1, 2015. The purpose of the WMO is to protect public health, safety, and welfare from the effects of flooding, and a provision requiring residential buildings within 100-feet of the floodplain to obtain a permit and meet flood protection requirements is added. This provision is currently in place for single-family homes. Finally, clarifications are made regarding permitting requirements for District permitted detention facilities and exempting such facilities that fall within a Multi-County Municipality, in which a neighboring county's stormwater ordinance applies in lieu of the WMO.

Article 3 - Watershed Management Permit Requirements and Submittals

Revisions to Article 3 include correcting a reference to a non-existing stormwater policy for the Forest Preserve District of Cook County, inserting limitations language, clarifying when Schedule K is required, as it is redundant to Schedule R in some cases, indicating Cook County as the local authority for unincorporated areas, clarifying language regarding permits in which there is no permittee for either qualified sewer or stormwater, indicating responsibility for recording documents, adding volume control practices and compensatory storage as facilities requiring perpetual maintenance, and specifying the existing requirement for record drawings of volume control facilities and qualified sewer construction. The permit fee refund policy is also added for transparency.

Article 5 - Requirements for Stormwater Management

The easement requirements for minor stormwater systems is removed, as this potentially requires an easement over an entire property. Minor stormwater systems include curb, gutter, inlets, etc. The easement requirement for major stormwater systems, which include detention facilities and pipe that conveys the 100-year storm, remains in effect.

Revisions to the volume control portions of Article 5 include requiring volume control as practicable for developments with impervious area less than 0.10 acre, requiring volume control practices be located outside the regulatory floodway, and allowing excess volume control to be constructed on a site for future development conditions. The major revision to this Article adds a mechanism to allow offsite volume control storage for circumstances in which a site constraint prohibits the use of green infrastructure. Certain conditions must be met to utilize this practice, and it must be shown that it is either met or unavailable prior to granting the reduction provision that currently exists in the WMO.

Revisions to the detention portions of Article 5 include emphasis on requiring the allowable release rate to be in compliance with tailwater conditions when detention is located in the floodplain, clarifying the floodplain shall be determined by elevation, not delineation, when determining tailwater conditions, requiring offsite volume control and detention to be located on the same site in order to qualify for the detention credit, and requiring a trade agreement for maintenance of offsite detention facilities and recording the agreement with the recording submittal. Per a public comment, language regarding detention being constructed prior to occupancy was modified to be consistent with permitted special conditions, and road construction was clarified to indicate impervious paving.

Article 6 - Requirements for Flood Protection Areas

Revisions to the floodplain portions of Article 6 include clarification for elevation and fill requirements to protect structures within the floodplain, requiring green infrastructure be located outside of the regulatory floodway, and allowing IDNR-OWR approved projects within the regulatory floodway.

Revisions to the wetland and riparian portions of Article 6 include clarification on determining the classification of an offsite wetland that cannot obtain a Corps jurisdictional determination, and exempting mitigation requirements if the total cumulative impact to onsite riparian environments is less than 0.10 acre. The existing exemption for wetlands is clarified to indicate cumulative site impacts less than 0.10 acre, not per each wetland on site.

The existing policy requiring a water quality device for outfalls to Lake Michigan is added to the section on outfalls.

Article 7 - Requirements for Sewer Construction

Revisions to Article 7 include adding protections language regarding impacts of sewer construction, and exempting single-family storm sewers and perforated underdrains that are part of green infrastructure from requiring a permit when no other permit triggers exist.

Article 9 - Maintenance

Revisions to Article 9 include outlining maintenance requirements for all permitted facilities instead of just qualified sewer construction and adding a new section on additional maintenance requirements for stormwater projects with no permittee.

Article 10 - Inspections

A clarification was added in Article 10 to indicate Authorized Municipalities shall only inspect development within their jurisdiction.

Article 14 - Administration

Revisions to Article 14 include adding the permit cancellation policy for transparency, indicating Authorized Municipalities shall follow their own administrative procedures regarding cancellation and fee refunds, and clarifying inspection and permit issuance requirements for Authorized Municipalities.

Appendix A - Definitions

Revisions to Appendix A include new definitions for "demolition", "offsite volume control practice", and "site constraint", and increasing the size of an "accessory structure" from 500 square feet to 750 square feet. Clarifications were made to exempt private single-family drains from the definition of "outfall", to remove mobile home parks and homeowner associations from "satellite entity", to indicate a "substantial improvement" is determined by the local municipality in accordance with NFIP regulation, to add the term "channel" to the definition of "waterway", and to add development undertaken by a public utility to protect critical utility infrastructure from flood events to the definition of "flood control project".

Appendix F - Permit Fees to the Watershed Management Ordinance

Revisions to Appendix F include the addition of a base fee for the new Earthwork/Foundation Limited Permit type, which permits limited grading and foundation work prior to final approval of a full WMO permit, indicating the base permit fees are non-refundable, per the District's refund policy, and adding a note regarding fees for permits under the jurisdiction of an Authorized Municipality.

Appendix G - Existing Intergovernmental Agreements

The Intergovernmental Agreement with the Village of Flossmoor and the Homewood Flossmoor School District 233 was added to the list of existing intergovernmental agreements for stormwater regulation in Appendix G.
