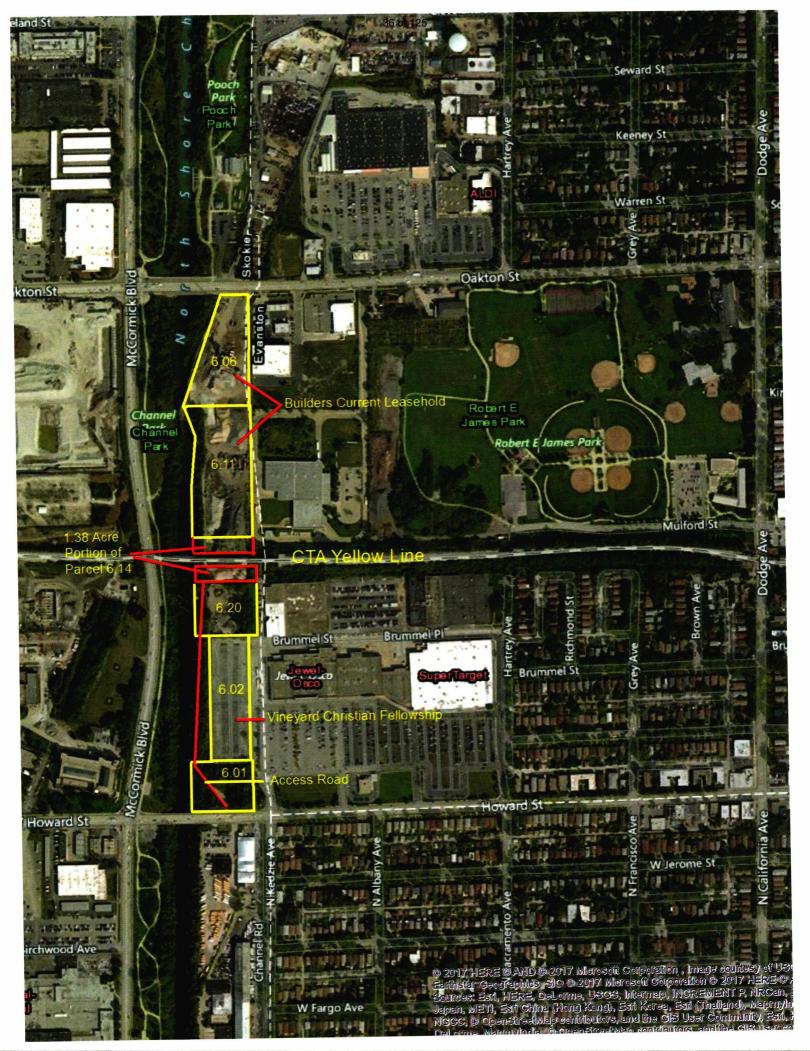

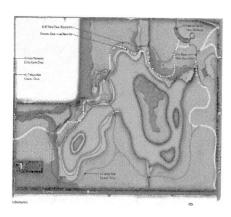

Six hundred and sixteen (616) companies were notified of this contract being advertised and thirty-five (35) companies requested specifications.

Bushnell Incorporated, the lowest responsible bidder for Group A, is proposing to perform the contract in accordance with the specifications. The estimated cost for Group A of this contract was \$9,000.00, placing the total bid of \$8,611.95, approximately 4.3 percent below the estimate.

T & N Chicago, Inc., the lowest bidder for Group B, did not bid in accordance with the contract specifications. They offered substitute gloves that are 9.4 inches in length and the Board of Standards specification requires a minimum of 9.5 inches. Therefore, the bid is considered non-responsive and rejected in the public's best interest. The Director of Procurement and Materials Management has notified T & N Chicago, Inc., of this

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action.

Graybar Electric Company, Inc., the next lowest bidder for Group B, did not bid in accordance with the contract specifications. They offered two sample substitute gloves for review. The first sample glove had a thickness of 19 mil which does not meet the 24 mil Board of Standards specification. The second sample had a thickness of 4 mil which does not meet the Board of Standards 5 mil specification. Therefore, the bid is considered non-responsive and rejected in the public's best interest. The Director of Procurement and Materials Management has notified Graybar Electric Company, Inc., of this action.

Fisher Scientific Company, LLC, the lowest responsible bidder for Group B, is proposing to perform the contract in accordance with the specifications. The estimated cost for Group B of this contract is \$59,000.00, placing the total bid of \$56,430.86 approximately 4.4 percent below the estimate.

The Multi-Project Labor Agreement (MPLA) is not applicable to this contract because it is primarily a furnish and deliver contract.

On September 1, 2016, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to award Contract 14-824-3DR Rehabilitation of Bridges, NSA on the North Shore Channel, to IHC Construction Companies, LLC, in an amount not to exceed \$2,093,000.00, plus a five (5) percent allowance for change orders in an amount of \$104,650.00, for a total amount not to exceed \$2,197,650.00. The scheduled contract completion date was January 4, 2018.

As of February 2, 2018, the attached list of change orders has been approved. The effect of these change orders resulted in an increase in an amount of \$282,557.49 from the original amount awarded of \$2,093,000.00. The current contract value is \$2,375,557.49. The prior approved change orders reflect a 13.5% increase to the original contract value.

In accordance with the change order approved by the Board of Commissioners on October 5, 2017, the contractor successfully expedited work and the Maple Avenue Bridge was opened to the public on December 19, 2017. During the course of construction, it was determined that the replacement of four additional beams at the Maple Avenue Bridge, installation of reinforcement steel plates, and replacement of angles at bracket and pipe supports at various locations of the Linden and Maple Avenue Bridges were necessary. The additional steel members and reinforcement were required after the concrete bridge sidewalks were removed, exposing extensive deterioration of the steel support stringers, brackets and bracket connections supporting the sidewalks. In addition, replacement of eight additional concrete sidewalk slabs abutting the Linden and Maple Avenue Bridges were required to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). The original intent of the contract was to replace the sidewalk panels in-kind following work on the bridges. However, it was discovered during construction that maintaining the original sidewalk configurations would violate ADA slope requirements. This work is already completed. Before the engineer's determination on the change order, the contractor proceeded at his own risk with this work as determined in his best interest in executing the overall contract. The contractor subsequently submitted a cost proposal (CCO-006) for an extra in the amount of \$74,112.63. The engineer reviewed the proposal, found it to be reasonable, and stated via correspondence 107, that the Engineering Department would recommend its approval.

This change order is in compliance with the Illinois Criminal Code since the change is due to circumstances not reasonably foreseeable at the time the contract was signed, and is in the best interest of the District.

It is hereby recommended that the Board of Commissioners authorize the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to execute a change order to increase Contract 14-824-3DR in an amount of

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\$74,112.63 (3.12% of the current contract value), from an amount of \$2,375,557.49, to an amount not to exceed \$2,449,670.12.

On December 3, 2015, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to issue a purchase order (PO) and enter into an agreement with Horizon Technologies, Inc., for preventive maintenance and consumable supplies for Horizon Extraction Units, in an amount not to exceed \$54,622.92. The contract expires on December 31, 2018.

As of January 31, 2018, the attached list of change orders has been approved. The effect of these change orders resulted in an increase in the amount of \$4,218.75, from the original amount awarded of \$65,551.47. The current contract value is \$69,770.22. The prior change orders reflect a 6.4 percent increase to the original contract value.

The PO is to provide preventive maintenance and consumable supplies for Horizon Extraction Units located throughout the District. In 2017, the M&R Department purchased a new extraction system and traded in older units covered under the current preventive maintenance agreement to obtain a discount for the purchase. Subsequently, removing units from the preventive maintenance plan and utilizing the newly acquired equipment that is under warranty, the estimated amount of support needed on the PO is lower than originally planned. Therefore, reducing the PO to meet only the needs of units not covered under warranty is required.

This change order is in compliance with the Illinois Criminal Code since the change is due to circumstances not reasonably foreseeable at the time the contract was signed, and is in the best interest of the District.

An increase is requested for post-award construction phase services included in the original scope of work in V3's contract, in which engineering support is needed to ensure construction is done in conformance with the design requirements. Significant changes made by utility companies after final design and during contract advertisement required redesign of numerous components of the project. A new access road and corresponding safety features were required by local utilities. The access road also necessitated changes to the reservoir grading design, which subsequently required adjustments to the storm sewer design. Additional re-design of telecommunications and water main facility relocations were required based on responses received from utility companies after our contract was advertised. Finally, a permit for lane closures along 87th Street was issued after an approximate nine month delay which required substantial changes to the traffic control plan and contract documents. Due to these issues, the District incurred additional consultant engineering fees during advertisement to ensure the project could be awarded in a timely and complete fashion.

The scope of post-award services to be provided by V3 includes support to the District for reviewing submittals and requests for information (RFIs) from the District's contractor. The Engineering Department and V3 have performed a thorough review of the contract documents and have identified the contractor submittals and potential RFIs which should be reviewed by the design consultant, and have agreed upon a scope of work for limited post-award assistance by V3 with additional support from in-house District staff. The resulting increase in cost due to the limited post-award services that are needed for this project is \$96,418.00.

This change order is in compliance with the Illinois Criminal Code since the change is due to circumstances not reasonably foreseeable at the time the contract was signed, and is in the best interest of the District.

It is hereby recommended that the Board of Commissioners authorize the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to execute a change order to increase the purchase order and amend the agreement in an amount of \$96,418.00 (7.87% of the current contract value), from an amount of \$1,225,059.00, to an amount not to exceed \$1,321,477.00.

The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (District) is in receipt of the 2018 annual membership invoice for the period March 1, 2018, through February 28, 2019.

The LDWG is a non-profit organization formed by municipal stakeholders to cost-effectively improve the health of the Lower Des Plaines River and its tributaries and to assist member agencies in meeting current and future National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit requirements. LDWG programs and services are prioritized and supported by dues-paying members. The District participated in the planning year for the LDWG following its inception in FY 2017, and has a Member At Large on the Board. Agency dues are calculated based on per plant millions of gallons per day (MGD) discharge and acres drained within the watershed boundary, in addition to administration and monitoring fees.

On November 15, 2012, the Board of Commissioners authorized the issuance of a five (5) year permit to the Romeoville Fire Department ("Fire Department") to use a 50' x 8' area of Main Channel Parcel 15.05 ("Parcel 15.05") to launch and retrieve boats during fire/rescue emergencies and routine training operations. The permit expires May 31, 2018, and was issued for a \$10.00 nominal fee. Parcel 15.05 comprises 22.38 acres and is under lease to ACBL Transportation Services, LLC ("ACBL") for operation of a barge transportation company. The lease commenced in 2016 and expires in 2055. The annual rent under ACBL's lease is \$61,360.00. The District reserved the right under ACBL's lease to renew these boat launch permits to governmental agencies from time to time for these limited purposes.

The Fire Department has requested a new five (5) year permit to continue using the boat launch to access the Main Channel for these same emergency and training purposes. The Fire Department will be responsible for implementation of safety protocols for its boats and crews, and for coordination of its schedules with ACBL and with other entities also authorized to use this site for boat launching purposes. 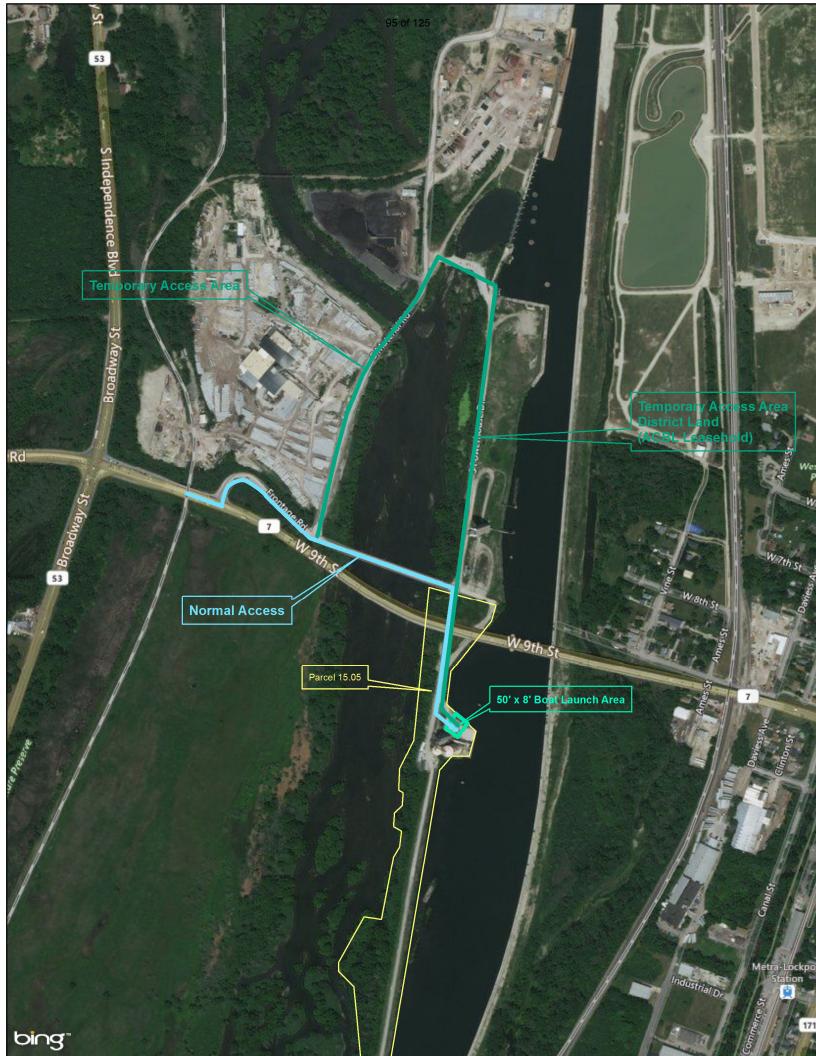

Dear Sir:

On January 18, 2018, the Board of Commissioners ("Board") authorized the grant to the Morton Grove Niles Water Commission ("Commission") of: (1) an 18-month, 17,843 sq. ft. temporary construction easement and (2) a 70-year, 38,517 sq. ft. non-exclusive easement to construct, install, operate, maintain, repair and remove three subterranean 30-inch water mains on part of North Shore Channel Parcels 3.02, 3.03 and 3.05 and beneath the North Shore Channel ("Channel") in Evanston and Skokie, Illinois. The Commission requested these easements as part of its plan to purchase its potable water from the City of Evanston ("Evanston"), then sell it to its residents. Under this request, the corresponding pump station was to be located on non-District owned land located along Wade Street.

Subsequent to the January 18, 2018, Board meeting, a public meeting was held at Evanston's City Hall to allow the project to be vetted by the public. As a result, on January 30, 2018, the Commission submitted a revised request for easements to locate a pump station and access road on District land known as Parcel 3.04. Specifically, the Commission has now requested: (1) a one year, 41,770 sq. ft. temporary construction easement and (2) a 70-year, 33,440 sq. ft. non-exclusive easement to construct, install, operate, maintain, repair and remove a pump station, access road, two subterranean 24-inch water mains, and one subterranean 30-inch water main on or beneath North Shore Channel Parcels 3.02, 3.04 and 3.05 and the Channel in Evanston and Skokie, Illinois.

Parcel 3.04 is under lease to Evanston for public recreational purposes. The Evanston lease commenced February 1, 2018, and expires in 2068. The Commission's new request contains plans for the pump station building to contain public bathrooms, an outdoor patio area, and a mechanical room all for Evanston's use in conjunction with its leasehold operations. The operations portion of the pump station will at all times be inaccessible to the public. The two 24-inch water mains will connect to the pump station and will traverse Parcel 3.04, the bed of the Channel, and the southern portion of Parcel 3.05. The third water line, the 30-inch water main, will run north/south on the west side of the Channel, between Parcels 3.05 and 3.02 and beneath Emerson Street. Parcel 3.05 is presently leased to the Village of Skokie ("Skokie") for public recreational purposes. The Skokie lease commenced in 1994 and expires in 2032. Parcel 3.02 is presently leased to Evanston under a public recreational lease that commenced in 1966 and expires in 2032.

The District's technical departments have reviewed the Commission's new request and have no objections

thereto. It is recommended that a fee of \$71,009.00 be assessed for the one year temporary construction easement and an initial annual fee of \$59,024.00 be assessed for the 70-year easement, both of which represent 10% of the appraised fair market value. The fee is based upon the District's policy to assess the annual rent based on the fair market value when the easement is generating revenue. Because the Commission will derive revenue under this easement, an initial annual easement fee of 10% is recommended rather than a nominal fee. Also, because Parcels 3.02 and 3.04 are leased to Evanston, and Parcel 3.05 is leased to Skokie, the easements are subject to the consents of both municipalities. Evanston has indicated that it has preliminarily consented to the Commission's use of both of its leaseholds, but final approval is subject to final review of the Commission's plans.

The IGA will effectuate the Village's status as a multi-county municipality under the WMO. The IGA requires the Village to issue stormwater permits, conduct inspections, and maintain records. Additionally, the IGA provides the District with a mechanism to audit the Village. The District will no longer require a Watershed Management Permit for most development activities within the Cook County portion of the Village; however, the District will still require a Watershed Management Permit for sanitary sewer construction and impacts to District-owned infrastructure for those portions of the Village located within the District's Corporate Limits.

The District received a letter of intent from the Village requesting status as a multi-county municipality. The Village has adopted and currently enforces the DCCSFPO. The District examined the letter of intent and determined that the Village meets the requirements contained in Article 2, Section 207 of the WMO.

It is respectfully requested that the Board of Commissioners grant authority to enter into an IGA with the Village of Bensenville whereby the Village will adopt and enforce the DCCSFPO for the entire Village and that the Chairman of the Committee on Stormwater Management, Executive Director, and Clerk be authorized to execute said IGA on behalf of the District upon approval by the Director of Engineering as to technical matters and by the General Counsel as to form and legality.

Future requests for authority to enter into IGAs with other multi-county municipalities for purposes of enforcing stormwater management provisions of a collar county's stormwater management ordinance will be submitted to the Board of Commissioners as requests are submitted by municipalities and after their qualifications have been evaluated by the Engineering Department.

Dear Sir:

The Board of Commissioners adopted the Watershed Management Ordinance (WMO) on October 3, 2013, and amended the WMO on April 17, 2014. The WMO became effective on May 1, 2014, and was further amended on July 10, 2014. The past several years of administration have shed light on revisions that are necessary to document the true intent of the WMO and clarify misconceptions regarding existing language. Input from outside agencies, stakeholders, and our Technical Advisory Committee led to proposing more substantial conceptual changes.

On November 3, 2016, the Board of Commissioners authorized public notification of the intent to amend the WMO. Six public meetings were held to present the proposed revisions, and a nearly five month public comment period resulted in additional input from stakeholders across Cook County. Two additional meetings with the Technical Advisory Committee were held on November 15, 2017, and January 17, 2018, to discuss the latest version of the drafted amendment. As a result, staff has made revisions to the WMO.

Many of the revisions to the WMO are non-substantive formatting and typographical corrections, and corrections to references found throughout the ordinance. There were no substantial revisions made to Articles 1, 4, 8, 11, 12 and 13 or to Appendices B, C, D and E. A summary of revisions to Articles 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10 and 14 and Appendices A, F and G is attached.

The proposed amendments, including non-substantive changes to the WMO, dated February 15, 2018, are attached for consideration for adoption.

Therefore, it is respectfully requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that the Board approve amendments to the Watershed Management Ordinance, which will be effective February 15, 2018.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE WMO

The Local Sewer Systems Section is proposing changes to the Watershed Management Ordinance (WMO), based on comments and suggestions from the Technical Advisory Committee, municipalities, design engineers, and public comment period. A summary of the substantial changes, by Article, is provided:

Article 2 - Applicability and General Provisions

Revisions to Article 2 include exempting all agricultural activities, not just those that fall under one specific development criteria, clarifying that state and federal agencies and flood control projects are exempt from the stormwater provisions of the WMO, but not the sanitary sewer and District impact provisions, and removing the Existing Development Plans List (EDPL) from this article and the title of associated Appendix C, as this provision of the WMO expired on May 1, 2015. The purpose of the WMO is to protect public health, safety, and welfare from the effects of flooding, and a provision requiring residential buildings within 100-feet of the floodplain to obtain a permit and meet flood protection requirements is added. This provision is currently in place for single-family homes. Finally, clarifications are made regarding permitting requirements for District permitted detention facilities and exempting such facilities that fall within a Multi-County Municipality, in which a neighboring county's stormwater ordinance applies in lieu of the WMO.

Article 3 - Watershed Management Permit Requirements and Submittals

Revisions to Article 3 include correcting a reference to a non-existing stormwater policy for the Forest Preserve District of Cook County, inserting limitations language, clarifying when Schedule K is required, as it is redundant to Schedule R in some cases, indicating Cook County as the local authority for unincorporated areas, clarifying language regarding permits in which there is no permittee for either qualified sewer or stormwater, indicating responsibility for recording documents, adding volume control practices and compensatory storage as facilities requiring perpetual maintenance, and specifying the existing requirement for record drawings of volume control facilities and qualified sewer construction. The permit fee refund policy is also added for transparency.

Article 5 – Requirements for Stormwater Management

The easement requirements for minor stormwater systems is removed, as this potentially requires an easement over an entire property. Minor stormwater systems include curb, gutter, inlets, etc. The easement requirement for major stormwater systems, which include detention facilities and pipe that conveys the 100-year storm, remains in effect.

Revisions to the volume control portions of Article 5 include requiring volume control as practicable for developments with impervious area less than 0.10 acre, requiring volume control practices be located outside the regulatory floodway, and allowing excess volume control to be constructed on a site for future development conditions. The major revision to this Article adds a mechanism to allow offsite volume control storage for circumstances in which a site constraint prohibits the use of green infrastructure. Certain conditions must be met to utilize this practice, and it must be shown that it is either met or unavailable prior to granting the reduction provision that currently exists in the WMO.

Revisions to the detention portions of Article 5 include emphasis on requiring the allowable release rate to be in compliance with tailwater conditions when detention is located in the floodplain, clarifying the floodplain shall be determined by elevation, not delineation, when determining tailwater conditions, requiring offsite volume control and detention to be located on the same site in order to qualify for the detention credit, and requiring a trade agreement for maintenance of offsite detention facilities and recording the agreement with the recording submittal. Per a public comment, language regarding detention being constructed prior to occupancy was modified to be consistent with permitted special conditions, and road construction was clarified to indicate impervious paving.

<u>Article 6 – Requirements for Flood Protection Areas</u>

Revisions to the floodplain portions of Article 6 include clarification for elevation and fill requirements to protect structures within the floodplain, requiring green infrastructure be located outside of the regulatory floodway, and allowing IDNR-OWR approved projects within the regulatory floodway.

Revisions to the wetland portion of Article 6 include clarification on determining the classification of an offsite wetland that cannot obtain a Corps jurisdictional determination, and clarifying the existing exemption for wetlands as cumulative site impacts less than 0.10 acre, not per each wetland on site.

The existing policy requiring a water quality device for outfalls to Lake Michigan is added to the section on outfalls.

Article 7 – Requirements for Sewer Construction

Revisions to Article 7 include adding protections language regarding impacts of sewer construction, and exempting single-family storm sewers and perforated underdrains that are part of green infrastructure from requiring a permit when no other permit triggers exist.

Article 9 - Maintenance

Revisions to Article 9 include outlining maintenance requirements for all permitted facilities instead of just qualified sewer construction and adding a new section on additional maintenance requirements for stormwater projects with no permittee.

Article 10 - Inspections

A clarification was added in Article 10 to indicate Authorized Municipalities shall only inspect development within their jurisdiction.

Article 14 - Administration

Revisions to Article 14 include adding the permit cancellation policy for transparency, indicating Authorized Municipalities shall follow their own administrative procedures regarding cancellation and fee refunds, and clarifying inspection and permit issuance requirements for Authorized Municipalities.

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Appendix A - Definitions

Revisions to Appendix A include new definitions for "demolition", "offsite volume control practice", and "site constraint", and increasing the size of an "accessory structure" from 500 square feet to 750 square feet. Clarifications were made to exempt private single-family drains from the definition of "outfall", to remove mobile home parks and homeowner associations from "satellite entity", to indicate a "substantial improvement" is determined by the local municipality in accordance with NFIP regulation, to add the term "channel" to the definition of "waterway", and to add development undertaken by a public utility to protect critical utility infrastructure from flood events to the definition of "flood control project".

Appendix F - Permit Fees to the Watershed Management Ordinance

Revisions to Appendix F include the addition of a base fee for the new Earthwork/Foundation Limited Permit type, which permits limited grading and foundation work prior to final approval of a full WMO permit, indicating the base permit fees are non-refundable, per the District's refund policy, and adding a note regarding fees for permits under the jurisdiction of an Authorized Municipality.

Appendix G – Existing Intergovernmental Agreements

The Intergovernmental Agreement with the Village of Flossmoor and the Homewood Flossmoor School District 233 was added to the list of existing intergovernmental agreements for stormwater regulation in Appendix G.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago, pursuant to the statute in such case made and provided, has from time to time acquired by purchase, condemnation, or otherwise, lands necessary and desirable for use in the upgrading of the quality of the waters in the Chicago Metropolitan communities; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to obtain permanent and temporary easements or fee simple title as the right-of-way for the construction, operation and maintenance of modifications to TARP Control Structures CDS-C1 and CDS-45 in the Village of South Holland (Contract 17-842-3H), in parts of Sections 9 and 15, Township 36 North, Range 14, East of the Third Principal Meridian in Cook County, Illinois.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago:

Section 1. That there be and is hereby laid out, located, created, and established a right-of-way for the construction, operation, and maintenance of modifications to TARP Control Structures CDS-C1, and CDS-45 in the Village of South Holland (Contract 17-842-3H), in parts of Sections 9 and 15, Township 36 North, Range 14, East of the Third Principal Meridian in Cook County, Illinois, and legally described as follows, to wit:

(For Legal Description, see "Exhibit A" which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.)

Section 2. That it is necessary, convenient, desirable and in the public interest to acquire fee simple title or such lesser interests as may be deemed appropriate in and to the real estate hereinafter described as a site for the construction, operation and maintenance of the modification of TARP Control Structures in the Village of South Holland (Contract 17-842-3H), in parts of Sections 9 and 15, Township 36 North, Range 14, East of the Third Principal Meridian in Cook County, Illinois, which site is the following described real estate situated in the State of Illinois, to wit:

(For Legal Description, see Exhibit "A" which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.)

- Section 3. That the construction, operation, and maintenance of the modifications to TARP Control Structures CDS-C1 and CDS-45 in the Village of South Holland (Contract 17-842-3H), in parts of Sections 9 and 15, Township 36 North, Range 14, East of the Third Principal Meridian in Cook County, Illinois, together with all appurtenances thereto, within the right-of-way described in Sections 1 and 2 of this Ordinance, is hereby provided for and there shall be constructed, maintained, and operated within the limits of said right-of-way described in Sections 1 and 2 of this Ordinance, said modifications to TARP Control Structures, Contract 17-842-3H, together with all necessary appurtenances thereto, the same to be an adjunct of and addition to the drainage system of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago.
- Section 4. That it is necessary, convenient and desirable for the purposes of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago to acquire fee simple title or such lesser interests as may be deemed appropriate in and to the real estate necessary to facilitate the construction, operation, and maintenance of the modifications to TARP Control Structures CDS-C1 and CDS-45 in the Village of South Holland (Contract 17-842-3H) in parts of Sections 9 and 15, Township 36 North, Range 14,

East of the Third Principal Meridian in Cook County, Illinois, as described in Sections 1 and 2 of this Ordinance.

Section 5. That the Executive Director of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago is hereby authorized and directed to negotiate with the respective owners and parties in interest of the real estate described in Sections 1 and 2 of this Ordinance for the purposes of acquiring fee simple title or such lesser interests as may be deemed appropriate in and to the real estate described in Sections 1 and 2 of this Ordinance; and to endeavor to agree with said owners and parties in interest upon the price to be paid to them for said fee simple title or such lesser interests; and to engage the services of such appraisers as may be necessary, under the provisions of Section 11.4, Act 2605. Chapter 70. Illinois Compiled Statutes, for the purposes of such acquisition. In the event that said Executive Director of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago is unable to agree with the owners and parties in interest of any or all of said pieces or parcels of property described in Sections 1 and 2 of this Ordinance, or if said owners or parties in interest are incapable of consenting or their names or residences are unknown or they are non-residents of Illinois, the Executive Director of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago shall report such fact to the General Counsel for the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago, and thereupon said General Counsel shall commence and prosecute condemnation proceedings in such courts as he may deem proper to acquire such fee simple title or lesser interests as he may deem proper by virtue of the Eminent Domain Laws of the State of Illinois as directed by the Executive Director and to pay all costs and expense, including appraisal fees, incurred in connection therewith.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

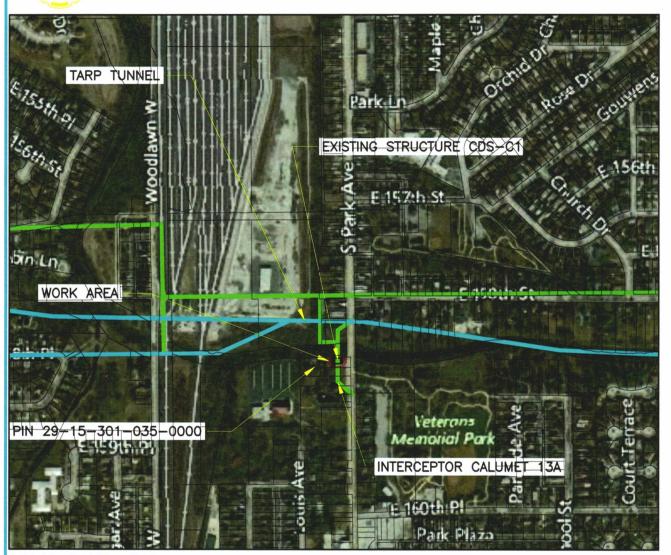

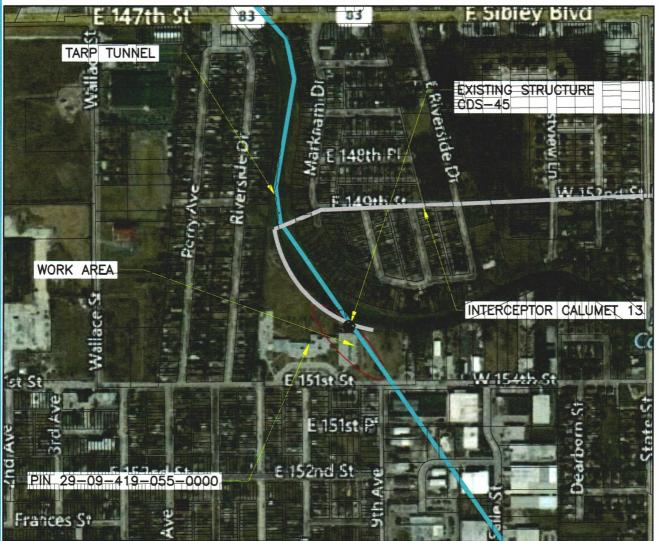

Dear Sir:

The District plans to make modifications to certain TARP control structures located in the Village of South Holland. The modifications will consist of new permanent dry weather diversion bypass sewers and minor demolition and concrete work for the removal of existing flumes. The purpose of the modifications are to reduce combined sewer overflows from TARP structures CDS-C1 and CDS-45 to the Little Calumet River.

While the District possesses all of the property rights for the existing TARP facilities, the new modifications to these TARP control structures will require additional temporary and permanent easements or fee simple title within the Village of South Holland. The acquisition of this right-of-way requires the adoption of an ordinance authorizing the immediate acquisition of land, which is legally described in the attached documents.

It is requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it adopt Ordinance R18-001 establishing and authorizing the acquisition of the right-of-way for the construction, operation and maintenance of modifications to TARP Control Structures CDS-C1 and CDS-45 in the Village of South Holland, Cook County, Illinois (Contract 17-842-3H) in Sections 9 and 15, Township 36 North, Range 14, East of the Third Principal Meridian in Cook County, Illinois.

It is further requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that the President be authorized and directed to execute said Ordinance after same is approved by the General Counsel as to form and legality.
