The proposals were evaluated by staff from the Human Resources and Procurement and Materials Management Departments. The criteria for these evaluations were outlined in Request for Proposal 18-RFP-06 and included: understanding of the project; approach to the work; technical competence; personnel effectiveness; and specialized expertise. Following the preliminary evaluation of proposals, excluding cost, all nine proposers were deemed to be finalists. Finalist interviews were conducted on March 13, 2018 and March 14, 2018. On December 4, 2014, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to award Contract 04-128-3P Westside Primary Settling Tanks 1-9 and Aerated Grit Facility, Stickney Water Reclamation Plant, to IHC Construction and F.H. Paschen/S.N. Nielsen Joint Venture, in an amount not to exceed \$224,760,000.00, plus a five (5) percent allowance for change orders in an amount of \$11,238,000.00, for a total amount not to exceed \$235,998,000.00. The scheduled contract completion date was April 6, 2018.

As of March 16, 2018, the attached list of change orders has been approved. The effect of these change orders resulted in an increase in the amount of \$7,540,662.02 from the original amount awarded of \$224,760,000.00. The current contract value is \$232,300,662.02. The prior approved change orders reflect a 3.35% increase to the original contract value.

Item 1: A credit in the amount of \$100,167.46 to revise the installation of structural glazed face tile (SGFT) in the Aerated Grit Facility. The contractor notified the District that there are inconsistencies between the Room Finish Schedule shown on contract Drawing A-32-26 and the various architectural plan view and section view drawings. In order to rectify a non-uniform installation of SGFT, the engineer has determined that the amount of SGFT utilized in the Aerated Grit Facility can be reduced without negatively affecting the building. Therefore, the 2" SGFT room finish in Stair Towers D and E, the 2" SGFT room finish above elevation +51'-10" in the Grit Processing Area and the Grit Tanks Area shall be deleted from the contract. The contractor submitted a cost proposal (CCO-110) for a credit in an amount of \$100,167.46. The engineer reviewed the proposal, found it to be reasonable, and stated via correspondence 2327, that the Engineering Department would recommend its approval.

Item 2: A credit in the amount of \$120,030.27 to make revisions to the sludge valve vault. Per RFI-327, the contractor noted that, after exploratory excavation near the new sludge valve vault, the underground utilities were located differently than shown on the contract drawings. The engineer determined that modifications would need to be made to the support pile layout and that changes to the structural design of the sludge valve vault would be required to eliminate conflicts with the existing underground utilities. The modifications include revising the concrete sludge valve vault, adjusting the support pile locations to avoid conflicts with the underground utilities, revising the sludge valve vault drain system, revising the location of the stairs, removing the tension struts and removing the sidewalk west of new Column Line 4. Through a cooperative effort between the contractor and the engineer, the design of all these revisions resulted in a credit to the contract.

The contractor submitted a cost proposal (CCO-051) for a credit in an amount of \$120,030.27. The engineer reviewed the proposal, found it to be reasonable, and stated via correspondence 2372, that the Engineering Department would recommend its approval.

The above two change orders are in compliance with the Illinois Criminal Code since the changes are germane to the contract.

Item 3: An extra in the amount of \$197,870.84 for additional earthwork required for the construction of the primary settling tanks (PSTs). While excavating for the PSTs, the contractor encountered unsuitable soil and needed to over-excavate to reach soil with the required bearing capacity of 1.5 TSF. After the suitable soil was reached, additional select fill was required to fill in the over-excavation. In the area taken up by the PSTs, unsuitable soil was discovered at several locations. The Unit Price Items Cost Proposal F, Additional Earth Excavation, and Cost Proposal G, Additional Select Fill, were fully utilized to cover a portion of the cost of the additional work. The total allowances of Cost Proposals F and G are \$30,000.00 and \$35,000.00, respectively. The remaining work is an extra to the contract. The work has been completed. Before the engineer's determination on the change order, the contractor proceeded at his own risk with this work as determined in his own best interest in executing the overall contract. The engineer has now concluded that this work is a revision to the contract. The contractor submitted a cost proposal (CCO-130) for an extra in an amount of \$197,870.84. The engineer reviewed the proposal, found it to be reasonable, and stated via correspondence 2452, that the Engineering Department would recommend its approval.

This change order is in compliance with the Illinois Criminal Code since the change is due to circumstances not reasonably foreseeable at the time the contract was signed, and is in the best interest of the District.

It is hereby recommended that the Board of Commissioners authorize the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to execute three change orders to decrease Contract 04-128-3P in an amount of \$22,326.89 (.01% of the current contract value), from an amount of \$232,300,662.02, to an amount not to exceed \$232,278,335.13.

This change order is in compliance with the Illinois Criminal Code since the change is due to circumstances not reasonably foreseeable at the time the contract was signed, and is in the best interest of the District.

02-111-3M, TARP Pump #8 Rehabilitation Mainstream Pumping Station. The Contractor completed the reassembly of Pump 8 and its motor. All components have been installed and are being tested as the weather conditions permit. Currently Pump 8 has 285 hours of test run time. Final completion is anticipated next quarter.

04-128-3P, Westside Primary Settling Tanks 1-9 and Aerated Grit Facility, SWRP. All concrete structures have been completed, with architectural items such as brick work, windows, doors, roofs, handrails at 80% complete. The process, plumbing, mechanical, electrical and HVAC installations are progressing, with completion estimates as follows: Tunnel Access Pump Stations 90%, Primary Settling Tanks 95%, Aerated Grit Facility 75%, Primary Switch Gear at 95% and the Monitoring & Research Laboratory Remodeling 95%. Site work such as backfill is 95% complete with site paving anticipated to start in May. Overall Substantial Completion is estimated to be achieved in late August of 2018 with Final Completion to follow in October of 2018.

06-494-3P, Centrifuge Building and Sludge Loading System Upgrades, EWRP and HPWRP. Final completion was achieved on February 15, 2018. Change Orders CCO-028 and CCO-030 for modifications to the screw conveyor caused delays in 2017. The Contractor's credit proposal to revise the size and type of power cables between the VFD and the progressive cavity pump and the twin screw feeder pump motors was approved via Correspondence 0730 (CCO-021) on March 27, 2018. The Contractor is currently working on project closeout items required for final payment.

The Contractor submitted a price proposal for RFQ-18 (24 VDC Power for AIT-3423/3424 and FIT-0200), and approval of the pricing (via Correspondence 0386, CCO-018) is in route. The Contractor has scheduled programming of the Variable Frequency Drives for next week and is in the process of scheduling Maintenance and Operations training for the VFDs, Power Distribution Panel and Emulsion Polymer System.

Authority is requested to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) and make payment to the Fox River Water Reclamation District (FRWRD) in support of FRWRD's Anaerobic Digestion Improvements at the Albin D. Pagorski Water Reclamation Facility (17-IGA-03).

Authority to negotiate an IGA with FRWRD was granted on November 16, 2017. The project consists of equipment replacement on four digesters, including the digester gas safety systems, the digester mixing system, primary sludge pumping, associated piping and valves, digester covers, and other associated equipment.

In 1974, as required by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for grant funding, the District entered into a master agreement with the FRWRD for treatment of wastewater flow from the District's Poplar Creek Basin. The Agreement requires that the District pay an annual cost for treatment of that wastewater based on measured flow to the facility. Additionally, the District is required to contribute capital funding for FRWRD projects that are necessary to increase or improve FRWRD's ability to treat wastewater flow to its facility. The District has participated in capital projects at the facility since that time.

The District is responsible for 23.97% of the Anaerobic Digestion Improvements project. This figure is based on the percentage of the total waste that is treated that is attributable to the Poplar Creek Basin. The project's total cost is estimated at \$12,164,880.00, which includes a 5% contingency for change orders, and the District's portion is estimated at \$2,915.922.00. The total project cost includes design engineering, construction, and post award engineering services.

FRWRD has initiated construction and has completed approximately 35% of the project. The project is expected to be completed in August, 2018.

Based on the foregoing, the Engineering Department recommends that the District be authorized to enter into an IGA and make payment to the FRWRD for a project in support of Anaerobic Digestion Improvements at the Albin D. Pagorski Water Reclamation Facility in an amount not to exceed \$2,915,922.00. It is further requested that the Chairman of the Committee on Finance, Executive Director and Clerk be authorized to execute said agreement on behalf of the District, as well any document necessary to effectuate the transaction and conveyance, upon approval by the Director of Engineering as to technical matters and by the General Counsel as to form and legality.

The District owns property in Fulton County, Illinois, known as the Prairie Plan Site. This property consists of approximately 5,200 acres of agricultural land on which the District previously applied biosolids originating from District water reclamation plants in the greater Chicago area.

On February 15, 2018, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to issue a purchase order and enter into an agreement for Contract 17-RFP-31, Farm Management Support Services, to Heartland Bank & Trust Company ("Heartland"), for farm management support services for the District's farmland in Fulton County, Illinois for a 3-year period. The purpose of the farm management services is to effectively manage and maximize the agricultural income of the District's farmland in Fulton County, Illinois. The agreement will expire on December 31, 2020, but can be extended by two, one-year terms to December 31, 2022.

The District leasing statute does not require competitive bidding for any lease involving land located in a County, like Fulton County, with a population of 100,000 or less and which is leased solely for agricultural use. Accordingly, Heartland surveyed and negotiated with interested area farmers to lease various available parcels for crop acreage, and secured individuals who expressed a willingness to rent the outstanding parcels. The agricultural use, acreages, lease rates and total rent for each group of parcels are provided in the attachment to this letter.

It is requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it authorize and approve the issuance of specific leases to the above cited tenant farmers under the farm management program administrated by the District's consultant, Heartland Bank and Trust Company, for land parcels of various acreages located at the Prairie Plan Operations in Fulton County, Illinois, for a one year period, pursuant to 17-RFP-31, Farm Management Support Services. Consideration shall be a sum total initial annual rent for all leases of \$669,677.38.

It is further requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it authorize the Chairman of the Committee on Finance and the Clerk of the District to execute the lease agreements after same is approved by the General Counsel as to form and legality.

Authorization to enter into a Copyright License Agreement with UWM Research Foundation, Inc. for a Software Tool for Probabilistic Reliability Evaluation and Effluent Quality Risk Analysis of Wastewater Treatment Plants

Dear Sir:

Authorization is requested to enter into a copyright license agreement with UWM Research Foundation, Inc. (UWMRF) for receiving a non-exclusive, royalty free license to a software tool for probabilistic reliability evaluation and effluent quality risk analysis of wastewater treatment plants. Through previous authorization by the Board of Commissioners, the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (District) has been a member of the National Science Foundation's Industry/University Cooperative Research Center for Water Equipment and Policy (I/UCRC WEP) since February 2015. The I/UCRC WEP's primary function is to conduct research and develop water, stormwater and wastewater oriented technologies for I/UCRC WEP members in an academic environment via partnership between Marquette University and the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee (UWM), and industrial organizations, companies and water and wastewater utilities like the District. The copyright license agreement will automatically renew annually.

The software tool for probabilistic reliability evaluation and effluent quality risk analysis of wastewater treatment plants, which the District plans to license, was developed by a UWM associate professor and his team through an I/UCRC WEP research project in 2016. This software tool can be used to perform holistic water reclamation plant (WRP) reliability evaluation with the consideration of a set of uncertain factors, including the WRP influent profile, mechanical failures of WRP components, electrical failures of the power supply system, human errors, and other factors. The outcome of such evaluation can be useful for assessing and improving WRP reliability, resiliency, and effluent quality by enabling more informed decision making for asset management in WRPs.

Pursuant to the membership agreement with I/UCRC WEP, the District has the option to exercise its right to receive a non-exclusive, royalty free license to certain university-owned technologies developed by I/UCRC WEP researchers. Pursuant to the agreement between UWM and UWMRF, UWMRF has the right to license and sublicense certain UWM-owned intellectual property.

It is hereby recommended that the Board of Commissioners authorize to enter into a copyright license agreement with UWMRF to receiving a non-exclusive, royalty free license to a software tool for probabilistic reliability evaluation and effluent quality risk analysis of wastewater treatment plants.

It is further requested that the Executive Director be given authority to execute all documents necessary in furtherance of this Agreement.

Authority to amend employee leave benefits for non-represented employees to include paid parental leave

Dear Sir:

At the request of the Board of Commissioners, the Human Resources Department researched the addition of a paid parental leave policy to the District benefit program. According to a study conducted in 2017 by WorldatWork and Mercer, 38% of U.S. organizations now offer a paid parental leave benefit to full-time employees. The average length of the paid parental leave benefit for organizations surveyed is 4.1 weeks. In addition, several states including California, New York, New Jersey and Rhode Island have enacted laws that require employers to provide a paid parental leave benefit.

Several public agencies in the Chicago area offer a paid parental leave policy. The City of Chicago and Chicago Transit Authority (CTA) both offer a paid parental leave benefit to full time employees. The City of Chicago policy provides four (4) weeks paid leave to the birth mother (6 weeks for a surgical delivery) and two (2) weeks paid leave to a spouse or domestic partner of the birth mother. The CTA provides six (6) weeks paid leave to the birth mother (up to 2 additional weeks for a cesarean delivery) and two (2) weeks to the birth father, spouse or domestic partner. Both plans also provide two (2) weeks paid leave to an adoptive parent.

Based on the information collected in its review, the Human Resources Department recommends the addition of a paid parental leave policy. The goal of this policy would be to provide employees with time to care for and bond with their newborn or adopted child. The policy would provide non-represented, full-time employees with the following paid parental leave benefits:

- Up to six (6) weeks paid parental leave to a birth mother after delivery; or
- Up to two (2) weeks paid parental leave to a birth father; or
- Up to two (2) weeks paid parental leave to a spouse, domestic partner or civil union partner of the birth mother; or
- Up to two (2) weeks paid parental leave to an adoptive parent for the birth or placement of an adopted child.

The policy would require that an employee be eligible for leave under the Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA) to receive paid parental leave under this policy. Paid parental leave would be paid at 100% of the employee's regular pay for any time approved under this policy. A paid parental leave policy is not currently included in the collective bargaining agreements for represented employees. Implementation of such a policy would be subject to negotiation.

A review of the medical claim data shows that the District receives approximately 44 child birth claims each year. On average, 10 of these claims are related to an employee giving birth to a child, 29 of these claims are related to an employee's spouse giving birth to a child and the remaining five claims are related to a dependent giving birth to a child. Based on this data, the projected cost for the recommended paid leave

policy would be approximately \$230,000.00 per year. It should be noted that a significant portion of this expense would come in the form of lost productivity and not in additional salary expense.

Authorization is requested to add a paid parental leave policy as described above to the District benefits program for non-represented employees effective May 1, 2018.

On May 4, 2017, the Board of Commissioners granted its advice and consent to the reappointment of Ms. Harris to the Ethics Commission for a two-year term, which will expire on May 15, 2019.

Mr. Lopez and Mr. Weicher are highly competent private attorneys and their reappointment to the Ethics Commission is warranted by the professionalism and commitment they have demonstrated during their two years of service as Commissioners.

On August 12, 1993, the Board of Commissioners granted a 25-year, non-exclusive easement to the Village of Schaumburg ("Schaumburg") to construct, reconstruct, operate, maintain, repair, replace and remove the subject 12" sanitary sewer line known as the Briar Pointe sanitary sewer line. The Briar Pointe sanitary sewer line traverses the District's Hanover Park Water Reclamation Plant premises. The subject easement expires August 11, 2018.

Schaumburg has requested a new 25-year easement to continue to operate and maintain the sewer line. A portion of the easement traverses the Village of Hanover Park leasehold for public and recreational use which commenced January 1, 2013, and expires December 31, 2052. Accordingly, the easement is subject to the Village of Hanover Park's consent.

The District's technical departments have reviewed Schaumburg's request for continued use of the easement and have no objections thereto. The District has requested to connect its own sanitary sewer to the Briar Pointe sanitary sewer line, and Schaumburg has no objection to this request. A nominal fee of \$10.00 is recommended as is customary for governmental entities using District property for a public purpose.

NeighborSpace is a not-for-profit corporation established in 1996, funded and supported in part by the City of Chicago, the Chicago Park District, and the Forest Preserve District of Cook County. Since 1998, the Board of Commissioners ("Board") has issued a series of permits to NeighborSpace to use a 1.5± acre portion of District real estate located along the east bank of the North Branch of the Chicago River between Montrose Avenue and Berteau Avenue in Chicago, Illinois, and known as North Shore Channel Parcel 10.03 (portion) for riverbank management and restoration, such as native planting and debris removal, and the maintenance of a wood chipped path. Since 2003, the Board has also issued a series of permits to NeighborSpace to use the remaining 0.3± acre portion of Parcel 10.03 from Berteau Avenue to 212 feet south therefrom for similar purposes. On December 5, 2013, the Board consolidated the two permits into a single permit. The consolidated permit expires August 13, 2018, and was issued for a nominal fee of \$10.00.

NeighborSpace has requested to renew the permit for a five (5) year term to use the entire 1.8± acre parcel to continue native planting, debris removal, and maintenance of a wood-chipped walking path.

Since 2008, the Board of Commissioners has issued a series of permits to the U.S. Department of Interior, U.S. Geological Survey ("USGS") and the University of Illinois at Urbana Champaign ("UIUC"), as copermittees, to access, operate, maintain and improve their Chicago Waterway Observatory ("Observatory") within an approximate 3" x 6" area of the District's Chicago River Controlling Works South Sluice Gate Building located at DuSable Harbor in Chicago, Illinois. The current permit, which was issued for a \$10.00 nominal fee, commenced October 1, 2013, and expires September 30, 2018.

USGS and UIUC have requested a new 5-year permit to continue accessing and operating the Observatory. The current permit allows USGS and UIUC to measure bi-directional flow, stratification, and density pertaining to the Chicago River. Under the new permit, they will also gather water level, water velocity, and water discharge data to support ongoing research into Chicagoland area flooding and water quality.

The District's technical departments have reviewed this request and have no objections thereto. A nominal fee of \$10.00 is recommended as USGS and UIUC are public entities utilizing the property in furtherance of a public purpose.

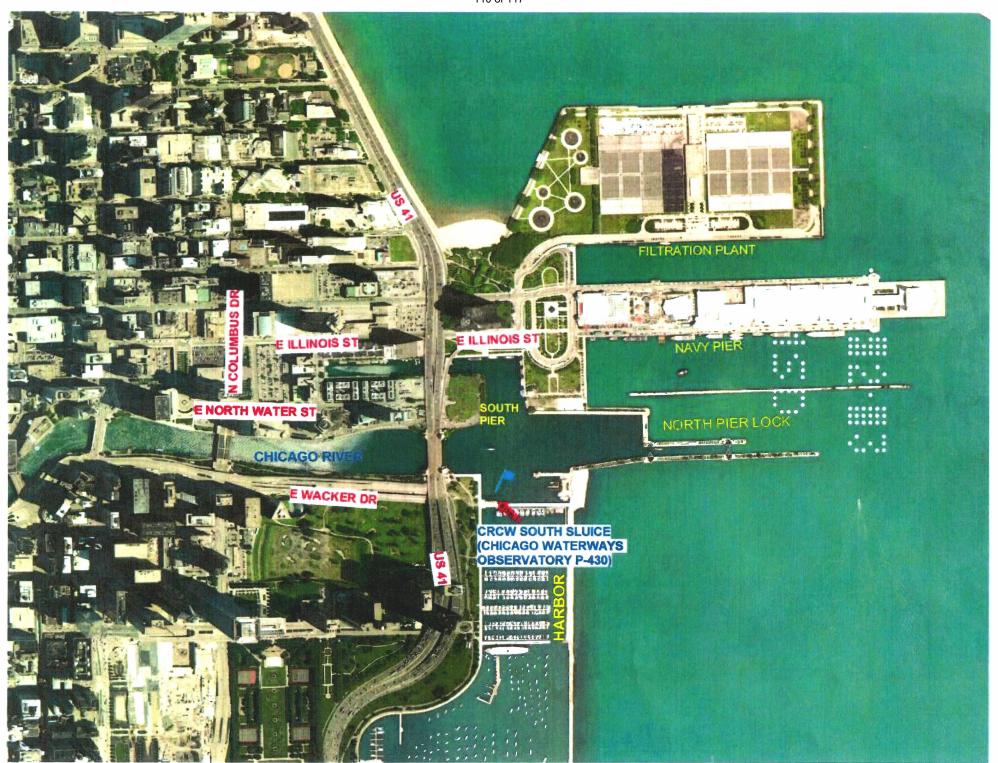

Report on Green Infrastructure, Detention, and Compensatory Storage Volumes Required by the Watershed Management Ordinance

Dear Sir:

The Watershed Management Ordinance (WMO) regulates sewer construction within the District's service area and development within suburban Cook County. It provides uniform stormwater management regulations to prevent future development projects from exacerbating flooding and protect environmentally sensitive areas. Green infrastructure (GI) is installed to comply with the stormwater management requirement of capturing one inch of stormwater runoff from all impervious surfaces of the development. Detention requirements have been enhanced by the WMO as compared to the previous requirements under the Sewer Permit Ordinance, and compensatory storage is required to mitigate development impacting the floodplain.

When a WMO permit is required, the development must comply with the stormwater management provisions of the WMO. The attached table includes the number of permits issued per quarter since the WMO became effective. It also summarizes the development area, volume captured by GI, detention provided, and compensatory storage. The total for each year and running total are also provided. This table will continue to be updated at the end of each quarter and transmitted for your information.
