At its meeting of July 12, 2018, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to advertise Contract 18-364-11 Proposal to Lease for ten (10) years, approximately 4.46 acres of District real estate located at 4035 South Cicero Avenue in Chicago, Illinois; known as Main Channel Parcel 40.02. The minimum acceptable annual rental bid was established at \$140,000.00.

A bid was received for the subject proposal and was opened on August 21, 2018, from ExxonMobil Oil Corporation ("ExxonMobil") for a minimum initial annual rental bid of \$140,000.00 (10% of the appraised fair market value). ExxonMobil currently occupies the site under a permit that commenced October 30, 2016 and expires October 29, 2018. The current annual permit fee is \$90,500.00. 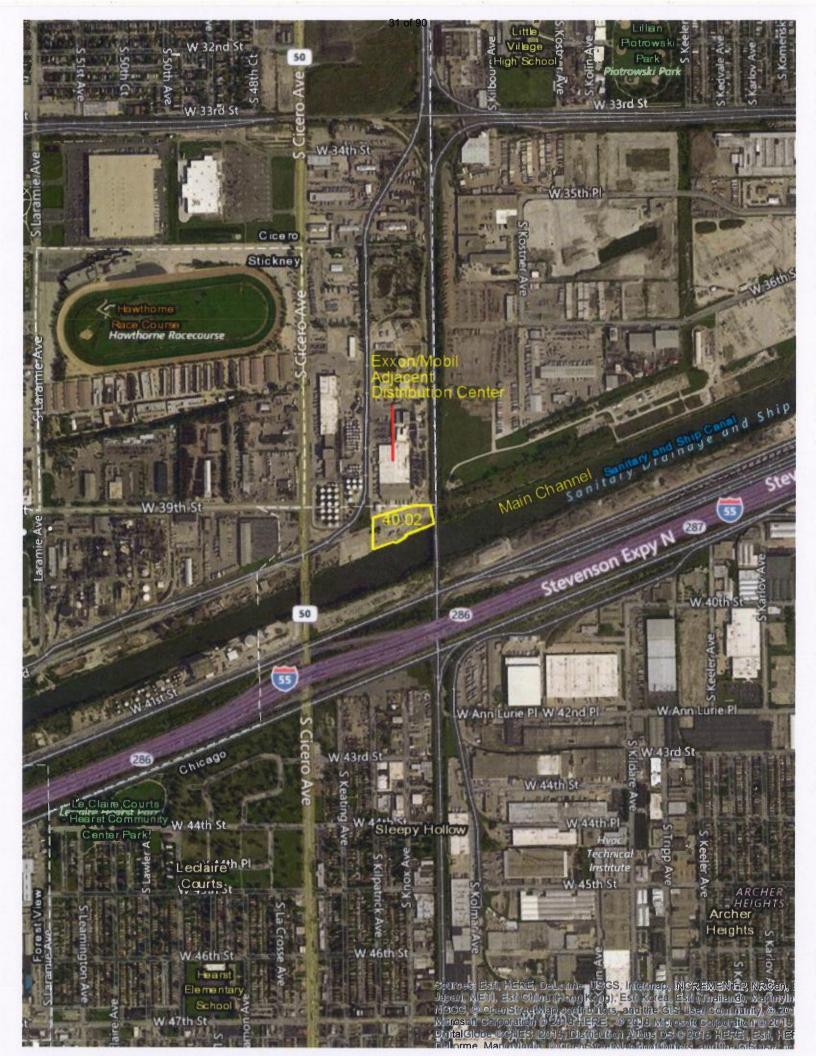

On May 29, 2018, Calumet trades determined that there was possible water infiltration in the electrical conduits and a short in the electrical feeds at SEPA Station No. 4 in Worth, Illinois. Upon further investigation, it was found to be necessary to replace the electrical feeds to the station, including 10,000 feet of 500 MCM electrical cable, connectors and miscellaneous materials for the electrical system. Calumet trades would perform the work.

On June 21, 2018, in accordance with Section 11.5 of the Purchasing Act, the Board of Commissioners declared an operational emergency affecting public health and safety and awarded Contract 18-800-01 for Emergency Repairs to SEPA Station No. 4 in the Village of Worth, IL to Paramount Electrical Supply in an amount not to exceed \$100,000.00.

Final completion of all work replacing the feeds occurred on July 24, 2018. The final cost of the material purchased under the emergency contract was \$64,411.72.

There have been no prior change orders to this contract.

Substantial completion and accepting plant flow through the new facilities are pending completion of blower installation. All other open items are not flow related installations and will be completed after plant flow acceptance, during and after 60 day operation test. It is estimated that flow acceptance will be achieved in late September 2018 with final completion in December 2018.

04-203-4F, Final Reservoir Preparation Thornton Composite Reservoir, CSA. Substantial completion was achieved on December 24, 2015 and the reservoir is in operation. Final completion will be achieved upon resolution of the following items: the bubbler unit has an obstruction and must be purged, the electrical coordination study, as well as the electrical and civil As-Built drawings and the Operation and Maintenance manuals must be approved. Final completion is expected by fourth quarter 2018.

15-120-3P, **Conversion of OLD GCTs to WASSTRIP Process**. All equipment, except for the exhaust and supply fans, completed their 60-day operation test as of August 17, 2018. The exhaust and supply fans are currently under the 60-day operation testing period and are scheduled to complete their test on September 24, 2018. Contract final completion will be delayed due to two new upcoming change orders. Approval of these change orders will extend the contract duration to the end of 2018.

16-268-2V, **Industrial Waste Division (IWD) and Construction Office Renovation at the Calumet WRP.** Substantial completion was achieved on May 9, 2018. IWD and Construction staff moved into the renovated office space on May 11, 2018. The field punch list items are all electrical items and the Contractor is working to complete them. The Fire Alarm Test Report and Mechanical Equipment MMS submittals require re-submittal. Other remaining items required for close out are the As-Built CPM work schedule and the As-Built drawings. Final completion is expected by the end of September 2018.

Authorization to negotiate Intergovernmental Agreements with the Fox River Water Reclamation District for Phosphorus Removal Struvite Facilities and Liquid Facilities Projects at the Albin D. Pagorski Water Reclamation Facility of the Fox River Water Reclamation District (18-IGA-35 and 18-IGA-36)

Authority is requested to negotiate Intergovernmental Agreements (IGAs) with the Fox River Water Reclamation District (FRWRD) in support of FRWRD's Phosphorus Removal Struvite Facilities and Liquid Facilities Projects at the Albin D. Pagorski Water Reclamation Facility (ADPWRF) (18-IGA-35 and 18-IGA-36).

The Struvite Facilities Project consists of improvements to be made at the ADPWRF to reduce the phosphorus recycled within the liquid stream by precipitating it in the form of struvite within the digested biosolids. The work includes the construction of a new Struvite Building, fluidized-bed struvite reactor, and odor control system adjacent to the existing Sludge Dewatering Building. The Struvite Building will include a below-grade mixing pump station which will serve two new sludge equalization tanks as well as other associated equipment.

The Liquid Facilities Project consists of improvements to be made at the ADPWRF to the existing activated sludge process to incorporate biological phosphorus (Bio-P) removal processes. The work includes the construction of two primary sludge fermenters; a Fermenter Control Building; six mixing basins; a primary effluent/return activated sludge pump station; an odor control system; a splitter box; a flowmeter/valve vault; and other associated equipment and modifications.

In 1974, as required by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for grant funding, the District entered into a master agreement with the FRWRD for treatment of wastewater flow from the District's Poplar Creek Basin. The Agreement requires that the District pay an annual cost for treatment of that wastewater based on measured flow to the facility. Additionally, the District is required to contribute capital funding for FRWRD projects that are necessary to increase or improve FRWRD's ability to treat wastewater flow to its facility. The District has participated in capital projects at the facility since that time.

The District is responsible for 23.97% of the Phosphorus Removal Struvite Facilities project. This figure is based on the percentage of the total waste that is treated that is attributable to the Poplar Creek Basin. The struvite facilities treat solids from the Main Plant and two other FRWRD facilities. The project's estimated value is \$10,400,000.00, and the District's portion is estimated at \$2,492,880.00. The total project cost includes design engineering, construction, and post award engineering services.

The District is responsible for 36.20% of the Phosphorus Removal Liquid Facilities project. This figure is based on the percentage of the total waste that is treated that is attributable to the Poplar Creek Basin. The liquid facilities are only treating wastewater flow for the Main Plant. The project's estimated value is

\$25,888,000.00, and the District's portion is estimated at \$9,371,456.00. The total project cost includes design engineering, construction, and post award engineering services.

Based on the foregoing, the Engineering Department recommends that the District be authorized to negotiate IGAs with the FRWRD. Authority to execute the IGAs will be sought from the Board of Commissioners at a future date.

Declaration of an emergency and ratification of execution of contracts to conduct an investigation into and repair damage caused by the August 30, 2018 roof collapse at the Calumet Water Reclamation Plant

Dear Sir:

On Thursday, August 30, 2018, at approximately 11:00 am, the roof of the sludge concentration building at the Calumet Water Reclamation Plant collapsed. The collapse appears to have occurred as a result of an explosion within the building. Ten individuals were injured as a result of this incident and there is significant structural damage to the building.

The damage to the sludge concentration building required immediate repair and an investigation was immediately necessary to prevent any similar incidents in the future.

The Acting Executive Director authorized execution of contracts to effectuate repairs and to perform a forensic investigation. Additionally, other expenditures directly related to this emergency were authorized. Reserve Claim Funding was approved for this work. The Board of Commissioners was polled and tentatively declared an emergency affecting public health and safety, authorizing the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to issue Purchase Orders for the executed contracts and approve related expenditures, pending a public declaration of the emergency at the September 20, 2018, Board Meeting. As of this date, contracts totaling \$100,000 have been executed as follows:

18-800-02 to IHC Construction Companies, LLC in an amount not to exceed \$50,000.00, and 18-300-002 to Wiss, Janney, Elstner & Associates, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$50,000.00.

In consideration of the above, and in accordance with Section 11.5 of the Purchasing Act, it is requested that the Board of Commissioners declare an emergency affecting public health and safety to repair the roof collapse damage, to determine the cause of the collapse, to determine any existing explosion hazards, and to perform all work to mitigate such hazards. Further, that the Board of Commissioners hereby approve and ratify all prior actions by the Acting Executive Director and staff related to the implementation and execution of the two specified emergency contracts.

It is also requested that the Board of Commissioners fix the date on which the emergency is to terminate as September 20, 2019. A full report of the resolution of the emergency will be presented to the Board of Commissioners at a forthcoming regular Board Meeting.

Authorization is requested to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with and make payment to Leyden Township (Township) for the design, construction, operation and maintenance of the Diversey Avenue Drainage Improvements under Phase II of the Stormwater Management Program, in Unincorporated Cook County, Illinois (18-IGA-29).

On May 17, 2018, the Board of Commissioners authorized the District to begin negotiations with several entities, including Leyden Township, for IGAs that would include provisions allowing for the District to provide funding towards the construction of various shovel ready stormwater projects. The Township's proposed project consists of upsizing an existing ditch and culvert system with a new trunk storm sewer along the Diversey Avenue right-of-way in Leyden Township. Upon completion of the new trunk line, the project will provide flood reduction benefits to an estimated 30 structures, and after additional lateral storm sewer connections are built by the Township, a total of 250 structures will be provided with protection during future flood events. The District and the Township have agreed in principle to the terms of the IGA, which include payment by the District towards construction costs of the captioned project in an amount not to exceed \$350,000.00. Partial payments to the Township will be made at predefined intervals during construction, which is anticipated to commence in 2018. The Township has spent approximately \$50,000.00 on engineering and other design-related project costs, and will contribute approximately \$35,250.00 towards construction costs of the trunk sewer installation. The IGA will require the Township to advertise and award the construction contract in conformance with the District's Purchasing Act, Multi-Project Labor Agreement and Affirmative Action Requirements, assume responsibility for design, construction, perpetual maintenance and operation of the project, and be solely responsible for any change orders to the project. The IGA also contains provisions which allow the District to perform inspections after the project is constructed.

Based on the foregoing, it is requested that the Board of Commissioners grant authority to enter into an IGA with the Township and make payment to the Township in an amount not to exceed \$350,000.00. It is further requested that the Chairman of the Committee on Finance, Acting Executive Director, and Clerk be authorized to execute said agreement on behalf of the District, as well as any documents necessary to effectuate the transaction and conveyance, upon approval by the Director of Engineering as to technical matters and by the General Counsel as to form and legality.
