WHEREAS, Dr. Cherie G. Steele-Mitchell was born on February 26, 1928 to Owen J. Patterson, Sr. and Ruth H. Patterson, the fifth child in a blended family of ten children; and

WHEREAS, Cherie was raised on the South Side of Chicago where she attended Chicago Public Schools, graduating with honors from Englewood High School where she was named prom queen, and enrolling in college at the age of sixteen; and

WHEREAS, Cherie earned a bachelor's degree from Northeastern Illinois University, a master's degree in Public Administration, and ultimately a Ph. D in Public Administration, and was a life-long learner who passed her love of learning to her children and grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, Cherie and her husband James D. Steele settled in the Chatham neighborhood, raising two children, John and Diane; and

WHEREAS, bowling was among Cherie's favorite pastimes, a hobby she kept throughout her life and passed on to her children; and

WHEREAS, as a member of the Concerned Citizen's Organization, Cherie gained an interest in politics from organizing her community to be involved in issues that affected them, including the impact of flooding in the Chatham neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, Cherie passed that interest on to her children and grandchildren, including her son former 6th Ward Alderman and retired Appellate Court Justice John O. Steele, and her granddaughter Metropolitan Water Reclamation District President Kari K. Steele; and

RESOLUTION sponsored by the Board of Commissioners honoring National Hispanic Heritage Month

- Section 4. That it is necessary, convenient, and desirable for the purposes of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago to acquire fee simple title or such lesser interests as may be deemed appropriate in and to the real estate necessary to facilitate the construction, operation, and maintenance of the 39th Street Conduit Rehabilitation Phase 2, SSA (Contract 01-103-AS) in parts of Sections 32 and 35, Township 39 North, Range 14, East of the Third Principal Meridian in Cook County, Illinois, as described in Sections 1 and 2 of this Ordinance.

Section 5. That the Executive Director of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago is hereby authorized and directed to negotiate with the respective owners and parties in interest of the real estate described in Sections 1 and 2 of this Ordinance for the purposes of acquiring fee simple title or such lesser interests as may be deemed appropriate in and to the real estate described in Sections 1 and 2 of this Ordinance; and to endeavor to agree with said owners and parties in interest upon the price to be paid to them for said fee simple title or such lesser interests; and to engage the services of such appraisers as may be necessary, under the provisions of Section 11.4. Act 2605, Chapter 70, Illinois Compiled Statutes, for the purposes of such acquisition. In the event that said Executive Director of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago is unable to agree with the owners and parties in interest of any or all of said pieces or parcels of property described in Sections 1 and 2 of this Ordinance, or if said owners or parties in interest are incapable of consenting or their names or residences are unknown or they are non-residents of Illinois, the Executive Director of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago shall report such fact to the General Counsel for the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago, and thereupon said General Counsel shall commence and prosecute condemnation proceedings in such courts as she may deem proper to acquire such fee simple title or lesser interests as she may deem proper by virtue of the Eminent Domain Laws of the State of Illinois as directed by the Executive Director and to pay all costs and expense, including appraisal fees, incurred in connection therewith.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

Dear Sir:

The District plans to rehabilitate a 100-year-old, 20-foot diameter intercepting sewer known as the 39th Street Conduit in the City of Chicago ("Project"). The Project extends along 39th Street (Pershing Road) from South Lake Park Avenue on the east to South Racine Avenue on the west and will rehabilitate approximately 15,400 feet of sewer, seven large connecting structures, three small connecting structures, 15 manholes, and a brick junction shaft. Rehabilitation of the sewer and related structures is critical for the long-term drainage needs of southeast Chicago.

The Project is Phase 2 of the 39th Street Conduit rehabilitation. Phase 1, completed in September 2013, is a permanent extension of the mainstream leg of the Tunnel and Reservoir Plan involving the construction of a three-mile long subterranean bypass tunnel and connecting structures generally running along 39th Street. After Phase 2 is complete, the tunnel will provide additional overflow capacity for the 39th Street Conduit.

The Project requires temporary easements for the rehabilitation of the 39th Street Conduit not previously acquired for Phase 1. There are three affected parcels. One of the parcels is commercial, another is owned by the City of Chicago, and the third is a railroad property. The acquisition of this right-of-way requires the adoption of an ordinance authorizing the immediate acquisition of land, which is legally described in the attached documents as Exhibit A.

It is requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it adopt Ordinance R19-005 establishing the right-of-way for the construction, operation, and maintenance of the 39th Street Conduit Rehabilitation Phase 2, SSA (Contract 01-103-AS) in parts of Sections 32 and 35, Township 39 North, Range 14, East of the Third Principal Meridian in Cook County, Illinois.

It is further requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that the President be authorized and directed to execute said Ordinance after same is approved by the General Counsel as to form and legality.

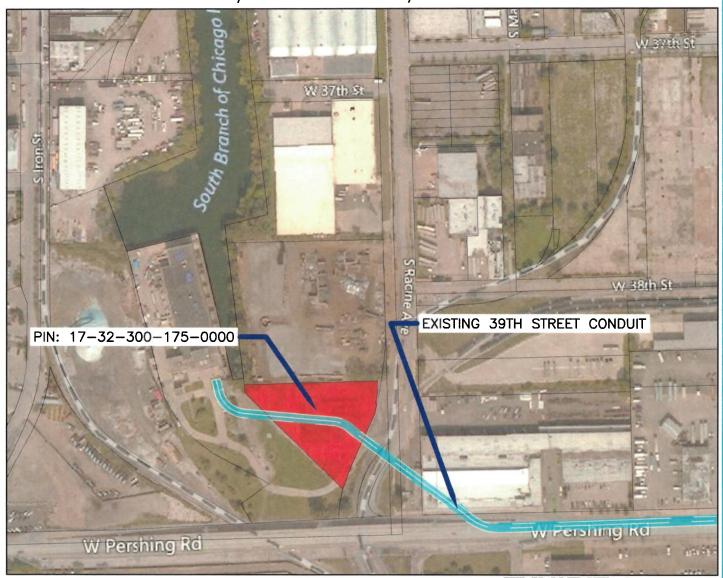

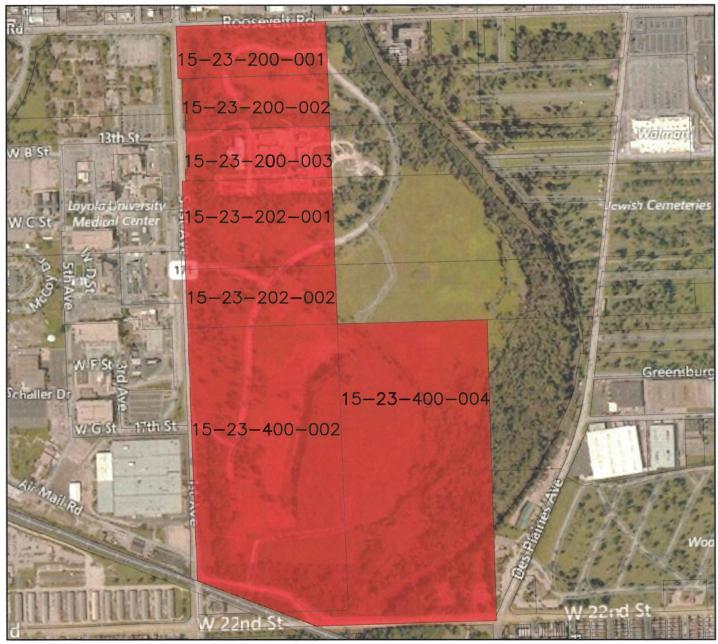

Request for Proposal (RFP) documents have been prepared for the acquisition of a Telemetry System for Water Quality Monitoring in the Chicago Area Waterway System with Data Management System Software, at the request of the Monitoring and Research Department. At the Board meeting of November 16, 2017, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to enter into an agreement for Contract 17-RFP-27 Duplication of Legal Materials, Trial Records and Other Reprographic and Electronic Discovery Services for the District's Law Department for a two (2) year period with Inservio3, LLC, in an amount not to exceed \$40,000.00, Accounts 101-30000-612090 and 401-50000-612090.

As of October 3, 2019 the attached change order has been approved. The net effect of the change order resulted in a decrease totaling \$14,999.00 from the original contract of \$40,000.00. The current value of the contract is \$25,000.00. The prior approved change reflects a 37.5% decrease to the original contract value due to the services provided under this contract being less than anticipated in 2019.

Under the terms of the agreement, the District has an option to extend the agreement for a third year at the same prices. On April 18, 2019, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to advertise for bids Contract 17-842-3H, Modifications to TARP Control Structures & Drop Shafts, SSA and CSA.

In response to a public advertisement of May 8, 2019, a bid opening was held on August 27, 2019. There was one bid received in response to this advertisement, listed as follows:

IHC Construction Companies, Inc.

\$2,997,000.00

Six hundred two (602) companies were notified of this contract being advertised and fifty-seven (57) companies requested specifications.

IHC Construction Companies, Inc., the sole bidder, is proposing to perform the contract in accordance with the specifications. The estimated cost range for this contract is \$2,000,000.00 to \$2,400,000.00, placing their bid of \$2,997,000.00 above the estimate cost range. The bid submitted by IHC Construction Companies, Inc., is approximately 24.9% above the higher end of the estimated cost range.

The reasons for the discrepancy between the estimated cost and bid prices are the result of various factors. Costs for mobilization are likely to be more than originally estimated because of the numerous sites of work throughout the county. Additionally, the costs for louver installations at various TARP shafts were underestimated as a result of late requirements for traffic control and site restoration imposed by right-of-way grantors after the cost estimate had been established as well as uncertainty in the prices for the steel grating due to potential tariffs.

IHC Construction Companies, Inc., is in compliance with the Affirmative Action Ordinance, Revised Appendix D as indicated on the attached report. The Minority Business Enterprise

(MBE), Women Business Enterprise (WBE) and Small Business Enterprise (SBE) utilization goals for this contract are 20 percent MBE, 10 percent WBE, 3 percent VBE and bidder offers MBE credits to satisfy SBE participation.

IHC Construction Companies, Inc., has executed the Multi-Project Labor Agreement (MPLA) Certificate as required. It is anticipated that all construction trades will be utilized under this contract, with the exception of boilermaker, brick mason, construction machinist, elevator constructor, iron worker ornamental, marble setter, and terrazzo worker. The list of construction trades is not intended to confer any rights or jurisdiction upon any union or unions.

The contract will require approximately thirty (30) people for the services.

In view of the foregoing, it is recommended that the Director of Procurement and Materials Management be authorized to award Contract 17-842-3H to IHC Construction Companies, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$2,997,000.00, plus a five (5) percent allowance for change orders in an amount of \$149,850.00, for a total amount not to exceed \$3,146,850.00, subject to the contractor furnishing a performance bond in form satisfactory to the Law Department and approved by the Director of Procurement and Materials Management.

The contract will commence upon approval of the Contractor's Bond and all work will be completed within 400 calendar days.

The minimum bid represented 6.5% of the highest of the three appraised values.

One bid was received for the subject proposal and was opened on September 17, 2019. The bid was received from the Village of Crestwood ("Crestwood") for an initial annual rental bid of \$820,626.00 (6.5% of the appraised fair market value). Crestwood is currently occupying Cal-Sag Channel Parcel 12.05 under a permit authorizing the removal of spoil therefrom. Crestwood anticipates all grading activities to be completed by the end of 2019. Cal-Sag Channel Parcels 12.07 and 12.08 are both vacant. At the Board Meeting of December 21, 2017, in accordance with Contract 17-RFP-32, the Board of Commissioners awarded a purchase order to Willis of Illinois, Inc. (Willis) to serve as the District's broker-of-record for cyber risk coverage and related services for a three-year period. In this capacity, Willis has responsibility for securing quotes from the insurance market for cyber insurance for the District.

On September 19, 2019, the District received certain bid quotation(s) which Willis had solicited pursuant to the detailed specifications and underwriting submission for cyber insurance including aggregate policy limit options of \$3,000,000.00 and \$5,000,000.00 and with a self-insured retention (SIR) of \$50,000.00 for a one-year period to be effective on or after October 3, 2019 to provide cyber insurance coverage for the District.

Seven insurance companies were approached for quotations. Five companies provided quotations. All five carriers who provided a quotation offered the limits requested, but not all offered the SIR of \$50,000 as requested. A number of the quotes only included a larger SIR, but with no cost savings. Two companies declined to provide a quotation, stating that governmental entities are outside their underwriting guidelines.

It was determined that optimal program design, coverage, and pricing for cyber coverage was offered by the AXIS Insurance Company (AXIS) with an Aggregate Policy Limit of \$5,000,000.00 and a self-insured retention of \$50,000.00 at the rate of \$45,863.00. AXIS offered the most competitive pricing and the proposed program provides excellent coverage terms and conditions.

AXIS also offers specialized content and risk management tools to help improve preparedness and to facilitate response to network and data security events through a private web-based portal available to its clients.

The proposal terms and conditions were evaluated by Willis, the Risk Manager, the Director of Human Resources and a representative from the Procurement and Materials Management Department. Based on their collective review, it was determined that the District should purchase cyber insurance coverage from AXIS Insurance Company. The company is licensed to do business in Illinois, is an admitted carrier, and has an A.M. Best Company rating of A+ (Superior), XV (\$2.0 Billion or greater).

In view of the foregoing, it is recommended that the Director of Procurement and Materials Management be authorized to issue a purchase order to Willis of Illinois, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$45,863.00.

At the Board Meeting of December 21, 2017, in accordance with Contract 17-RFP-32, the Board of Commissioners awarded a purchase order to Mesirow Insurance Services, Inc. (Mesirow) to serve as the District's broker-of-record for the handling of fiduciary liability insurance and related services for a three-year period. In this capacity, Mesirow has responsibility for securing quotes from the insurance market for fiduciary liability insurance for the District. The current fiduciary insurance policy will expire on November 1, 2019.

On September 16, 2019, the District received certain bid quotations/market responses which Mesirow had solicited pursuant to the Detailed Specifications for fiduciary liability insurance for both the Deferred Compensation Plan and Trust and the Retiree Health Care Trust (OPEB) for a one-year period from November 1, 2019 through November 1, 2020. An annual aggregate liability limit of \$5,000,000.00, subject to a self-insured retention of \$10,000.00 per claim, was requested.

For the 2019 placement, six insurance carriers were approached. Two carriers provided quotations at the limits and retention level requested. Four carriers declined to offer a quotation.

It was determined that optimal program design, coverage and pricing for fiduciary liability coverage was offered by Great American Insurance Company, at the rate of \$9,134.00 for the Deferred Compensation Plan and Trust and \$6,691.00 for OPEB, for a combined policy premium of \$15,825.00 which is a 2.1% increase over the prior year's premium. This placement will provide an annual aggregate liability limit of \$5,000,000.00, subject to a self-insured retention of \$10,000.00 per claim.

The quotations/market responses were evaluated by Mesirow, the Risk Manager, and a

representative from the Procurement and Materials Management Department. Based on their collective review, it is recommended that the District should place this coverage with Great American Insurance Company. The company is licensed to do business in Illinois, complied with the terms and conditions of the bid specifications, and has an A.M. Best Company rating of A+ (Superior), XV (\$2.0 Billion or greater).

In view of the foregoing, it is recommended that the Director of Procurement and Materials Management be authorized to issue a purchase order to Mesirow Insurance Services, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$9,134.00, for the Deferred Compensation Plan and Trust and authorize payment by direct voucher to Mesirow Insurance Services, Inc., for furnishing fiduciary liability insurance for the Retiree Health Care Trust (OPEB), in an amount not to exceed \$6,691.00.

Authorization is requested to issue purchase orders and enter into agreements with OTT HydroMet Corp. to provide hardware, installation, set-up, and twelve (12) months of network communications for a telemetry system; and with Aquatic Informatics USA Inc. to provide platform set-up, system design, time-series based data management software training, and a 12-month cloud service subscription for the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (District).

Professional services are required to implement a telemetry system for water quality monitoring in the Chicago Area Waterway System with data management system software to collect real-time water quality information and provide data visualization, analysis, and quality control tools for the District's Monitoring and Research Department. Ten (10) of the District's existing continuous dissolved oxygen monitoring locations in the Chicago and Calumet River Systems will be upgraded to a real-time telemetry-based system. The system will increase efficiency through the automatic uploading of the water quality data and the new data management system will allow for more efficient management, review, and quality control of this data and other water quality data collected by the District. The two (2) groups of services outlined in the scope of work for Request for Proposal 19-RFP-17 were:

- A. Acquisition and Installation of the Telemetry System
- B. Cloud Based Data Service with Time-Series Based Environmental Data Management Software

On June 19, 2019, Request for Proposal 19-RFP-17 was publicly advertised. Fifty (50) firms were notified, with thirty-five (35) requesting proposal documents. Five (5) proposals were received on July 26, 2019.

The proposals were reviewed and evaluated by a panel consisting of two (2) members from the Monitoring and Research Department, one (1) member from the Information Technology Department, and one (1) member from the Procurement and Materials Management Department. The criteria for these evaluations, outlined in Request for Proposal 19-RFP-17, included understanding of the project, approach to the work, cost of services, technical competence, financial stability, team effectiveness, compliance with insurance requirements, and submission of all necessary licenses and permits. Following the preliminary evaluation of proposals, it was determined that the five (5) proposers were acceptable, and they were interviewed on August 28, 2019. A solicitation was sent to each of the finalists on September 4, 2019, for an unqualified Best and Final Offer. The Best and Final Offers were returned to the Director of Procurement and Materials Management on September 10, 2019.

Based on the review of the proposals, the interviews, and the Best and Final Offers, the evaluation team determined that OTT HydroMet Corp. is the most suitable firm for Group A, Acquisition and Installation of the Telemetry System; and that Aquatic Informatics USA Inc. is the most suitable firm for Group B, Cloud Based Data Service with Time-Series Based Environmental Data Management Software. Both firms have extensive experience relative to the scope of work and had the highest matrix scores for the respective group. The evaluation team determined during its review that it is in the District's best interest to award the work outlined in 19-RFP-17 to these two (2) separate firms.

The agreement for 19-RFP-17 will be in effect from the date of award through December 31, 2019.

The Diversity Section has reviewed the Proposal and has concluded that Affirmative Action goals do not apply and Appendix A and V are not required.

Each of the firms will have teams that consist of a project manager and supporting specialists. Both firms have estimated that the project tasks will be completed within six (6) weeks.

Inasmuch as the firms of OTT HydroMet Corp. and Aquatic Informatics USA Inc. possess a high degree of professional skill, it is recommended that the Director of Procurement and Materials Management be authorized to issue two purchase orders and enter into agreements per Section 11.4 of the Purchasing Act, in an amount not to exceed \$56,273.60 with OTT HydroMet Corp., and \$38,075.00 with Aquatic Informatics USA Inc.

Authorization is requested to issue a purchase order and enter into an agreement with Dr. Marcelo H. Garcia, PhD for professional engineering and expert witness services to assist in the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago's (the "District") defense of Hampton, et al. v. Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago, Case No. 2011 CH 25822, and Jacklin, et al. v. Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago, Case No. 2011 CH 25985, currently pending in the Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois.

The District is the sole defendant in these proposed class actions filed by residents and homeowners in Bellwood, Hillside, and Westchester, Illinois for damages suffered following a July 2010 severe rain event. Plaintiffs allege that the District's actions during that rain event effectuated a taking of their homes without just compensation in violation of the United States and Illinois Constitutions.

During recent court hearings, plaintiffs indicated they will be retaining at least three expert witnesses to support their claims against the District. District technical staff will be used as part of the District's defense providing testimony on internal operations and procedures and some expert testimony. However, the District must also retain the services of an independent expert in the areas of hydrology and modeling of area waterways. The District interviewed three experts in this field and they were: Dr.Susan Paulsen, PhD of Exponent, Dr. Marcelo Garcia, PhD, affiliated with the University of Illinois and Dr. Theodore Hromdaka of Hromdaka and Associates.

The Law Department interviewed three potential experts, and evaluated their credentials and proposed hourly rates. In order to adequately defend the District, the Law Department requests approval to retain Dr. Marcelo H. Garcia, PhD, a professor in the University of Illinois'

Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering, to provide engineering and expert witness services in these cases.

The level of expertise required for this work is specialized, requiring experience in reviewing and analyzing rainfall data, collection systems, area waterways, and other hydraulic and hydrological data. Dr. Garcia is a reputable scientific investigator and researcher and has served as an expert witness in the past. The Law Department's recommendation is based on Dr. Garcia's superior knowledge of District operations, area waterways, and modeling.

Dr. Garcia has submitted a proposal for performing the requested work on an hourly basis. Dr. Garcia's rates for this service would be \$300.00 per hour for document review, research, and general file work; \$350.00 per hour for computer programming, engineering analysis, graphical presentations of data and results, exhibit preparation, 2D and 3D graphics and animations, image processing, simulations, and video preparation; and \$500.00 per hour for deposition or trial testimony. Dr. Garcia would also be reimbursed for reasonable costs and expenses incurred for travel.

Since the services to be provided require a high degree of professional skill where the ability of the individual plays an important part, and Dr. Garcia possesses the requisite skill, it is recommended that the Director of Procurement and Materials Management be authorized to issue a purchase order and enter into an agreement without advertising, as per Section 11.4 of the Purchasing Act, in an amount not to exceed \$200,000.00.

The Multi-Project Labor Agreement ("MPLA") is not applicable to this contract because the classification of work does not fall within the provisions of the MPLA.

The services requested do not provide practical opportunities for direct or indirect subcontracting. The vendor selected must be able to stake their professional reputation and credibility on their own work. Reliance on another vendor is not feasible. U.S. Compliance Centers, Inc., the lowest responsible bidder for Groups A and B, is proposing to perform the contract in accordance with the specifications. The estimated cost for Groups A and B of this contract was \$28,000.00, placing the total bid of \$24,053.16 approximately 14.1 percent below the estimate.

T&N Chicago, Inc., the apparent low bidder for Group B, offered the district seven (7) item substitutions. Six (6) of the substitutions were for MWRD Master Material numbers 112018 thru 112023, which include miscellaneous sizes of the same make of rain bib overalls, MWRD B.O.S. Specification #90-12-21-01. T&N Chicago, Inc., offered a substitution product, PIP #201-350B, which does not meet the MWRD specification requirements calling for "Onguard #76050" or approved equal. The "Onguard #76050" outer layer is made of 0.65mm PVC, while the outer layer of PIP #201-350B is made of 0.35mm PVC. The outer layer of the PIP substitution offered is 46% less thick than the approved "Onguard" product and was deemed to be not equal to the MWRD B.O.S. Specification requirements. Therefore, this bid is rejected in the public's best interest. The Director of Procurement and Materials Management has notified T&N Chicago, Inc. of this action.

On July 9, 2015, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to issue purchase order and enter into an agreement for Contract 14-RFP-36 Professional Auditing Services with RSM US LLP (formerly McGladrey LLP), in an amount not to exceed \$258,750.00 with the option to renew the agreement for each of the four subsequent years. The contract expires in 2020.

As September 20, 2019, the following change orders have been approved. The effect of these change orders resulted in an increase in the amount of \$273,000.00 from original amount awarded of \$771,200.00, the current contract value is \$1,044,200.00. The prior approved change orders reflect a 35% increase to the original contract value.

The reason for the change order is to exercise the District's final option to extend the contract.

Dear Sir:

Heligear Acquisition Co., d/b/a Northstar Aerospace Inc. (Heligear), operates a facility at the subject address which is located within the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (District). The facility is classified under federal general pretreatment standards for the metal finishing point source category and is subject to the District's Sewage and Waste Control Ordinance (Ordinance) and Discharge Authorization No. 27062-2, effective November 8, 2017. Pursuant to Appendix F of the Ordinance, the District issued Billing Invoice No. 27062-2019-D-006 for a Noncompliance Enforcement (NCE) charge in the amount of \$2,486.00 to recover the administrative and compliance monitoring costs pertaining to Cease and Desist Order Number 94571, issued on May 13, 2019. The Cease and Desist Order was issued because Heligear had exceeded categorical pretreatment levels for cyanide at its facility.

In a letter dated June 21, 2019, Heligear notified the Director of the Monitoring and Research Department (M&R) that it disputed the assessed NCE charge. On July 23, 2019, representatives of M&R's Industrial Waste Division met with a Heligear representative, who maintained that the subject NCE charge should be rescinded because an analysis of a cyanide sample by Heligear's wastewater quality consultant, Scientific Control Labs, Inc., revealed that Heligear was in compliance for cyanide prior to the discharge. Heligear also maintained that a split sample collected during District sampling also verified that Heligear was in compliance.

Following a review of the documentation provided by Heligear during the above-referenced meeting, M&R determined that the NCE charge was properly assessed in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinance. M&R notified Heligear of its determination in a letter dated July 30, 2019. In a subsequent letter dated August 30, 2019, Heligear requested an administrative hearing on this issue before a hearing officer appointed by the Board of Commissioners (Board). The request for a hearing was made in a timely manner.

In accordance with Article V, Section 10 of the Ordinance, if a person requests a conference

with the Director of M&R and the matter is not resolved at the conference, the person subject to the NCE charge may request an administrative hearing before a hearing officer appointed by the Board to determine the person's liability for the NCE charge. Accordingly, it is respectfully requested that the Board appoint a hearing officer to conduct an administrative hearing concerning the subject NCE charge in the amount of \$2,486.00 assessed for Cease and Desist Order Number 94571 under Billing Invoice No. 27062-2019-D-006.

The attainment of compliance shall forestall further enforcement action and the consequential costs provided in Appendix F, Section I of the Ordinance.

You will be invoiced a noncompliance enforcement (NCE) charge of \$2,486.00 for the sampling and administrative costs associated with this Order. The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (District) makes reference to the meeting of July 23, 2019, regarding the subject appeal. In attendance at the meeting representing Heligear Acquisition Co. (Heligear) were you, Mr. Jason Hicks, and your consultant, Mr. Jeffrey Zak, of Scientific Control Laboratories, Inc. (SCL). Representing the District were Messrs. Gregory Yarnik, Amjad Kawash, Brian Pikelny, Pawel Grunwald, James Barnes, Francis Wambi-Buesso and Mses. Tiffany Poole and Kara Gavin.

The District issued Cease and Desist (C&D) Order No. 94571 on May 13, 2019, for a cyanide violation that occurred on March 27, 2019. The District acknowledges receipt of your Compliance Schedule (RD-112) and investigation report on June 14, 2019. In both the meeting and in the report, you stated that prior to any batch discharge, Heligear provides a sample to SCL for analysis. You stated that the analysis of that sample revealed that Heligear was in compliance for cyanide prior to the discharge. You also stated that analysis of a split sample collected during District sampling also showed that Heligear was in compliance.

Mr. Zak stated that Heligear wishes to have a dialogue as to how the District's cyanide analysis is performed and requested that simultaneous sampling and analysis by District and SCL personnel be performed at such time as when Heligear schedules the next batch discharge. SCL also requested that they be allowed to witness the cyanide analysis methodology at the District's Stickney Analytical Laboratory in order that they might compare methodologies.

Currently, Heligear's RD-112 compliance date is August 9, 2019. Mr. Zak stated that Heligear may require an extension of the compliance date prior to any simultaneous sampling.

Any such request for a hearing by the Board shall be made within 30 days after receipt of this letter.

Dear Sir:

On August 6, 2015, the Board of Commissioners ("Board") adopted Ordinance No. R15-006 establishing the right-of-way for the construction, operation and maintenance of the Addison Creek Channel Improvement Project located in the municipalities of Northlake, Stone Park, Melrose Park, Bellwood, Westchester, and Broadview (Contract 11-187-3F) ("Project"). Ordinance R15-006 was subsequently amended by Ordinances R15-007, R18-003, and R19-002 to include additional right-of-way needed for the Project.

Said Ordinances authorized and directed the Executive Director to negotiate with the respective owners to acquire fee simple title or such lesser interests, as appropriate, in and to the real estate described in the Ordinances.

On September 6, 2018, the Board authorized the District to enter into intergovernmental agreements with the City of Northlake, Village of Stone Park, Village of Melrose Park, Village of Bellwood, Village of Westchester, and Village of Broadview for the Project. The proposed channel improvements are broken down into nine reaches along approximately 15,300 linear feet of Addison Creek beginning at Hirsch Street in the City of Northlake and continuing to Cermak Road in the Village of Broadview. The Addison Creek channel improvements, along with the proposed Addison Creek Reservoir, will provide flood reduction benefits to approximately 2,200 properties.

The Project requires the acquisition of a vacant parcel commonly known as 3809-3811 West Lake Street in Stone Park, Illinois. The parcel, which comprises 3,627 square feet, is asphalt-paved and used for parking. The parcel is owned by Chicago Title Land Trust Co., as Trustee under Trust Agreement No. 8002361120 dated January 28, 2013.

After the owner did not respond to the District's offer to acquire the parcel, the District filed an

eminent domain lawsuit entitled <u>The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago v. Chicago Title Land Trust Co., et al.</u>, Case No. 19L050053 in the Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois. Since filing the lawsuit on February 1, 2019, the District has served all parties in interest as required by the court, including the owner. However, the owner has not appeared and has been defaulted by the court. Accordingly, the District intends to file a Motion for Summary Judgment asking the court to enter an order establishing final just compensation in the amount of \$27,000.00. Upon deposit of the final just compensation with the Cook County Treasurer, the interested parties may petition the court to withdraw any funds to which they may be entitled and the District will be vested with title to the property.

It is the opinion of the General Counsel and Special Counsel, Neal & Leroy, LLC, that this amount is within the range of value for the subject property based on the fair market value appraisal obtained by the District. The property is vacant, so no relocation costs are anticipated.

Accordingly, it is requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it adopt the following orders:

- 1. That the General Counsel be authorized to present a Motion for Summary Judgment to finalize the eminent domain lawsuit entitled <u>The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago v. Chicago Title Land Trust Co., et al.</u>, Case No. 19L050053 in the Circuit Court of Cook County;
- 2. That upon granting of said Motion, the District be authorized to make payment of final just compensation in the amount of \$27,000.00 to acquire fee simple title to real estate commonly known as 3809-3811 West Lake Street in Stone Park, Illinois;
- 2. That the General Counsel be authorized and directed to execute and deliver all other documents and take such other actions as may be necessary to effectuate said Motion and to obtain possession of said property.

The subject parcel is under lease to the Village of Worth ("Worth") under a public recreational lease for operating and maintaining the Water's Edge Golf Course. The lease expires May 31, 2058. Worth has agreed to the Lions Club's use of a portion of its leasehold for the tree sale. 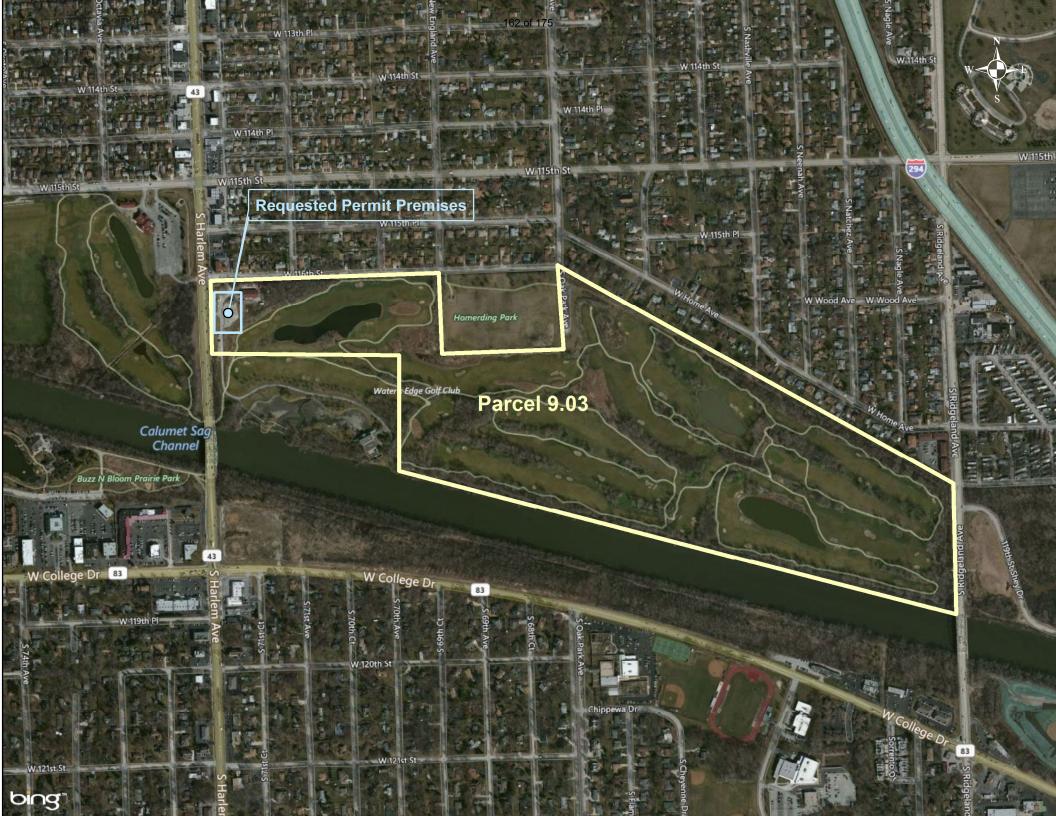

Dear Sir:

On January 24, 2019, the Board of Commissioners ("Board") authorized a 10-month permit extension to United Parcel Service, Inc. ("UPS") to allow seasonal use of 20.5 acres of District Cal-Sag Channel Parcel 10.04 located at the Cal-Sag Channel and Ridgeland Avenue in Alsip, Illinois and known as the Ridgeland Avenue Drying Facilities ("Ridgeland Facilities") for storing and parking trucks and trailers. The permit extension includes the five-month periods of September 1, 2019, to January 31, 2020, and September 1, 2020 to January 31, 2021. These months represent the time of year when UPS requires additional land for parking trucks and trailers due to demands related to the holiday season. UPS's existing permit fee is \$820,000.00.

UPS has requested to add 4+/- acres to the permit premises for the remaining nine months of the permit term, for a total permit area of 24.5 acres that will be used for the same purposes as set forth in the permit. The permit fee will therefore be increased by \$144,000.00 using the same per-acre fee. The District's technical departments have no objections to making this additional acreage available for such use by UPS.

With this addition, the total permit fee for the revised permit premises will be \$964,000.00, which represents the pro-rata share of over 10% of the fair market value of the land, based upon recent appraisals of nearby comparable sites.

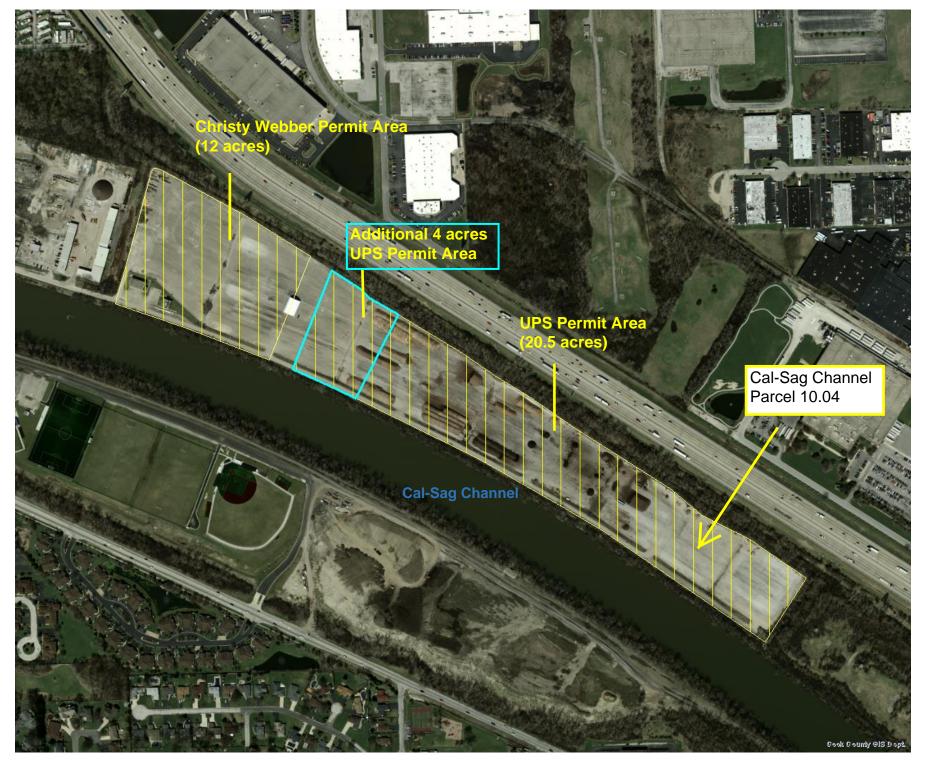
It is requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it authorize an amendment to the permit agreement issued to United Parcel Service, Inc. on 20.5 acres of District real estate located at the Cal-Sag Channel and Ridgeland Avenue in Alsip, Illinois and known as the Ridgeland Avenue Drying Facilities; Cal-Sag Channel Parcel 10.04 (eastern portion) for storing and parking trucks and trailers, to add 4+/- acres to the permit premises for the remaining permit period of October 3, 2019 to January 31, 2020, and

September 1, 2020 to January 31, 2021. Consideration shall be \$144,000.00.

It is also requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that the Chairman of the Committee on Finance and the Clerk be authorized to execute said permit agreement amendment on behalf of the District after it is approved by the General Counsel as to form and legality.

On August 6, 2015, the Board of Commissioners ("Board") adopted Ordinance No. R15-006 establishing the right-of-way for the construction, operation and maintenance of the Addison Creek Channel Improvement Project located in the municipalities of Northlake, Stone Park, Melrose Park, Bellwood, Westchester, and Broadview (Contract 11-187-3F) ("Project"). Ordinance R15-006 was subsequently amended by Ordinances R15-007, R18-003, and R19-002 to include additional right-of-way needed for the Project.

Said Ordinances authorized and directed the Executive Director to negotiate with the respective owners to acquire fee simple title or such lesser interests, as appropriate, in and to the real estate described in the Ordinances.

On September 6, 2018, the Board authorized the District to enter into intergovernmental agreements with the City of Northlake, Village of Stone Park, Village of Melrose Park, Village of Bellwood, Village of Westchester, and Village of Broadview for the Project. The proposed channel improvements are broken down into nine reaches along approximately 15,300 linear feet of Addison Creek beginning at Hirsch Street in the City of Northlake and continuing to Cermak Road in the Village of Broadview. The Addison Creek Channel improvements, along with the proposed Addison Creek Reservoir, will provide flood reduction benefits to approximately 2,200 properties.

The Project requires the acquisition of temporary and permanent easements on the property owned by Guerine & Company, Inc., an Illinois corporation, located at 4700 W. Division Street in Melrose Park, Illinois. The Property consists of 1,075,932 square feet and is improved with the Guerine Mobile Home Park. The easements at this location are primarily located along the Addison Creek and no mobile homes in this particular park will be impacted by the Project.

The District and the property owner have reached an agreement regarding the compensation to

be paid for the temporary and permanent easements in the amount of \$29,589.00. This amount is within the range of value for the subject easements based on fair market value appraisals obtained by the District and the property owner. This agreement will also save the District substantial costs that would otherwise be required to proceed to litigation, including attorney's fees, expert witness fees, and additional appraisal fees.

It is requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it accept and approve the temporary and permanent easement grants from Guerine & Company, Inc., an Illinois corporation, in connection with the captioned project, and authorize payment in the amount of \$29,589.00 as compensation for the easements.

It is further requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that the Chairman of the Committee on Finance and Clerk be authorized and directed to execute any documents necessary in connection with the subject easements after they are approved by the Director of Engineering as to technical matters and by General Counsel as to form and legality.

Consent to sublease between ACBL Transportation Services, LLC and Consolidated Grain and Barge Co. on an approximate 12.98-acre portion of the ACBL leasehold located at 16100 Des Plaines River Road, Main Channel Parcel 22.08, in Lemont, Illinois. Consideration shall be a minimum annual fee of \$5,000.00

Dear Sir:

On December 15, 2005, the Board of Commissioners authorized a 39-year lease ("Lease") to ACBL Transportation Services, LLC ("ACBL"), on 30.1 acres, known as Barge Slip 4, located at 16100 Des Plaines River Road in Lemont, Illinois, Main Channel Parcel 22.08. The Lease commenced December 16, 2005, and expires December 15, 2044. Parcel 22.08 is improved with a warehouse. ACBL's current annual rent is \$1,210,649.38. ACBL loads and unloads barges and stores shipping containers and calcium chloride. The District's consent is required before ACBL may sublease any portion of the leasehold to another entity.

ACBL has requested the District's consent to sublease 12.98 acres to Consolidated Grain and Barge Co. ("Consolidated Grain"). The initial sublease term would be for two years, with options for up to four additional terms of two years each. If approved, Consolidated Grain intends to use the sublease premises to operate the existing warehouse, load and unload barge freight, store steel, shipping containers, bulk packages of calcium chloride and non-hazardous dry materials.

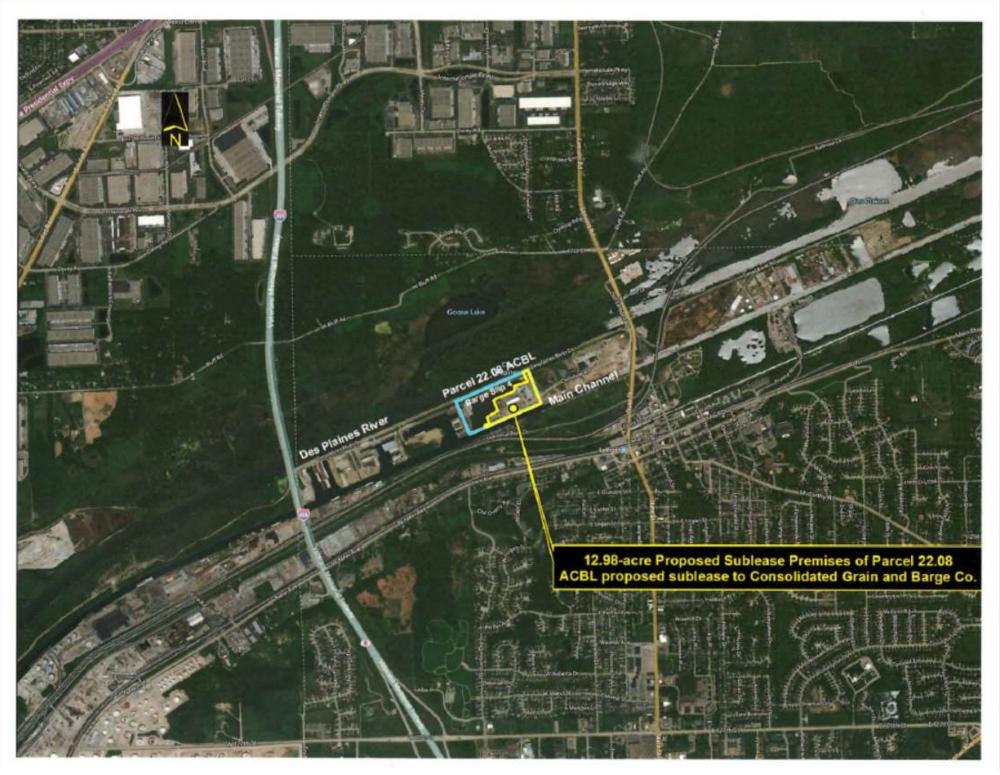
Under the Lease, the District is entitled to 50% of the increment or value received by ACBL from any sublease in excess of what ACBL is paying with respect to its proportionate share of rent for the subleased area. ACBL's current proportionate share of its annual rent for the sublease premises is \$522,067.41, whereas the proposed initial annual sublease rent from Consolidated Grain is \$100,000.00. Because Consolidated Grain's annual sublease fee does not exceed ACBL's proportionate share of the sublease premises, the District's standard minimum annual fee of \$5,000.00 shall be assessed. The technical departments have no objection to the proposed sublease by ACBL to Consolidated Grain.

It is requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it consent to a sublease between ACBL Transportation Services, LLC and Consolidated Grain and Barge Co. on an approximate 12.98-acre portion of the ACBL leasehold located at 16100 Des Plaines River Road, Main Channel Parcel 22.08, in Lemont, Illinois. Consideration shall be a minimum annual fee of \$5,000.00.

It is also requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it authorize and direct the Chairman of the Committee on Finance and the Clerk to execute the Consent to Sublease on behalf of the District after it is approved by the General Counsel as to form and legality.

Authorization is requested to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with and make payment to the Village of Mount Prospect (Village), for the design, construction, operation and maintenance of Levee 37 interior drainage improvements under Phase II of the Stormwater Management Program.

On May 17, 2018, the Board of Commissioners authorized the District to begin negotiations with several entities, including the Village of Mount Prospect, for IGAs that would include provisions allowing for the District to provide funding towards the construction of various shovel ready stormwater projects. The Village proposes to construct a 13.4 acre-foot detention basin and a 54-inch diameter connection to existing storm sewers. This project is intended to provide flood relief for 32 structures within the Levee 37 interior drainage area. The District and the Village have agreed in principle to the terms of the IGA, which include payment by the District towards construction costs of the captioned project in an amount not to exceed \$1,348,000.00. Partial payments to the Village will be made at predefined intervals during construction, which is anticipated to commence in 2020. The Village has spent approximately \$80,000.00 on engineering, property acquisition, and other design-related project costs. The Village will also contribute approximately \$2,432,000.00 towards total construction costs, including construction inspection. The IGA requires the Village to advertise and award the construction contracts in conformance with the District's Purchasing Act, Multi-Project Labor Agreement, and Affirmative Action Requirements. The Affirmative action goals to be applied to the total amount of reimbursement provided by the District for this project are 20 percent for Minority-Owned Business Enterprises, 10 percent for Women-Owned Business Enterprises, 10 percent for Small Business Enterprises and 3 percent for Veteran-Owned Business Enterprises. The Village will assume responsibility for design, construction, perpetual maintenance, and operation of the project and be solely responsible for any change orders to the project. The IGA also contains provisions which allow the District to review the project's design and perform inspections after the project is constructed.

Based on the foregoing, it is requested that the Board of Commissioners grant authority to enter into an IGA with and make payment to the Village in an amount not to exceed \$1,348,000.00. It is further requested that the Chairman of the Committee on Finance, Executive Director and Clerk be authorized to execute said agreement on behalf of the District, as well as any documents necessary to effectuate the transaction and conveyance, upon approval by the Director of Engineering as to technical matters and by the General Counsel as to form and legality.

The estimated expenditures for 2020 and 2021 are \$1,100,000.00 and \$248,000.00 respectively. Funds for 2020 and 2021 expenditures are contingent on the Board of Commissioners' approval of the District's budget for those years.

Authority to execute real estate documents required by the Federal Emergency Management Agency related to the acquisition of flood-prone properties in the City of Des Plaines (15-IGA-18 and 16-IGA-11)

Dear Sir:

On September 3, 2015, the Board of Commissioners ("Board") authorized an Intergovernmental Agreement ("IGA") with the City of Des Plaines ("City") for the acquisition of 13 flood-prone properties, with the District's funding contribution not to exceed \$949,829.00 (15-IGA-18). On November 17, 2016, the Board authorized a second IGA with the City for the acquisition of 47 flood-prone properties, with the District's funding contribution not to exceed \$3,625,068.00 (16-IGA-11).

Under both IGAs, the City received a commitment from the Illinois Emergency Management Agency ("IEMA") to receive federal grant funds through a Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") program that covers 75% of the acquisition costs. The City and the District fund the remaining 25% of the acquisition costs. These projects were selected pursuant to the Board's policy, adopted August 7, 2014, to prioritize flood-prone property acquisitions where federal funding is available.

The City has completed the acquisitions under both IGAs (which are voluntary on the part of the homeowner) and the District has made its reimbursements to the City pursuant to the IGAs. However, Regional Counsel for FEMA has recently informed the City that it must take certain corrective actions to demonstrate that the City obtained clear title to the properties consistent with FEMA regulations. In particular, FEMA is requiring the City to remove any title encumbrances that have not been approved by FEMA. If such corrections are not made, the City may be required to reimburse FEMA up to \$14,101,121.11 for non-conformance with the federal grant award.

In order for the City to remain in compliance and to keep its federal funding, FEMA has indicated that the District must release any deed restrictions or easements that it has on the properties. The District has no objections to these FEMA requirements, as FEMA's approved deed restrictions are designed to ensure that these parcels will remain as open space in perpetuity consistent with the District's flood-prone property buyout program. The District's IGAs with the City also set forth that the City is responsible for perpetual public ownership and

maintenance as open space of all acquired parcels.

Accordingly, it is requested that the Board of Commissioners grant authority for the Chairman of the Committee on Finance, the Executive Director, and the Clerk to execute the real estate documents required by FEMA to ensure that the City remains in compliance with FEMA requirements for the acquisition of flood-prone properties (15-IGA-18 and 16-IGA-11) as set forth herein, upon approval by the Director of Engineering as to technical matters and by the General Counsel as to form and legality.
