- Raise procurement thresholds for contracts, purchase orders and operating emergencies to \$100,000

- Department of Transportation (IDOT) Right of Way (ROW) requirements to reimburse the Work with Illinois Association of Wastewater Agencies (IAWA) to amend Illinois District to move infrastructure when required
