Authorization is requested to issue a purchase order and enter into an agreement with Ciorba Group, Inc. (Ciorba) for professional engineering services for Contract 14-111-5F Final Engineering Design for a Flood Control Project on 1st Avenue between Roosevelt Road and Cermak Road in Proviso Township, in an amount not to exceed \$593,057.00.

On September 19, 2013, the Board of Commissioners granted its approval to assist local communities and agencies with various projects to address flooding problems through the District's Phase II Stormwater Management program. Among the projects approved was a conceptual project submitted by the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT), which included an evaluation of potential flood mitigation measures to address flooding on 1st Avenue and adjacent properties, including the Loyola University Medical Center (LUMC), from Roosevelt Road to Cermak Road in Proviso Township.

On September 18, 2014, the Board of Commissioners authorized the District to enter into an agreement with Ciorba to perform Preliminary Engineering for a Flood Control Project on 1st Avenue from Roosevelt Road to Cermak Road.

The Engineering Department conducted a consolidated consultant selection process to assess prospective consulting engineering firms for design of Stormwater Management Phase II projects. The following firms participated in the process:

While the qualifications of all of the above firms in the design of Stormwater Management Phase II projects were evaluated, the knowledge and experience exhibited by Ciorba Group, Inc. was determined to be most suitable for this project.

The Preliminary Engineering Phase involved the development and evaluation of potential flood mitigation alternatives as previously stated. Ciorba has now completed the work for the first phase, and recommended the installation of new parallel trunk sewers and bioswales to address flooding in the project area. The Engineering Department has reviewed the recommended project and believes that it is economically justified and technically feasible, and local stakeholders, including IDOT and LUMC have provided strong support for this project.

On March 15, 2018, the Board of Commissioners authorized the District to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) for various stormwater projects throughout Cook County. The MOU identified projects that could be approached more effectively, economically, and comprehensively with the District and IDOT cooperating and using their joint efforts and resources, including the Flood Control Project on 1st Avenue between Roosevelt Road and Cermak Road. Further approval by the Board of Commissioners will be sought prior to negotiating intergovernmental agreements between the parties to establish roles and obligations of financial and personnel resources for specific projects.

Ciorba was recommended because of the firm's knowledge and experience with similar stormwater management projects. The Engineering Department stated in the Board Letter authorizing preliminary engineering that an agreement with Ciorba for Final Design of the Flood Control Project on 1st Avenue, between Roosevelt Road and Cermak Road in Proviso Township, would be forthcoming after completion of the Preliminary Engineering Phase.

The proposed project will address lack of access to the LUMC for emergency vehicles and medical personnel caused by flooding on 1st Avenue, by increasing stormwater conveyance capacity. Existing storm sewers on 1 st Avenue will be replaced with two parallel trunk sewers on the east and west sides of the road with sizes ranging from 18-inch to 48-inch in diameter. Multiple bioswales will be installed along the eastern right-of-way of 1st Avenue to manage runoff from the adjacent Forest Preserve District of Cook County property. The existing stormwater drainage system provides less than a 2-year storm level of protection and the proposed improvements will provide flood reduction benefits for the project area up to and including a 50-year storm event. The construction cost estimate for this project is \$4.875 million.

The time allowed for services to be performed under this agreement is 270 days from the date the contract is awarded. There are no provisions in the agreement for extension of time except for such reasonable period as may be agreed upon between parties.

On June 1, 2017, the Board of Commissioners ("Board") authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to issue a purchase order and enter into an agreement with the law firm of Neal & Leroy, LLC to represent the District in acquiring certain property rights in connection with the construction, operation and maintenance of the Addison Creek Channel Improvements Project (Contract 11-187-3F) ("Project") in the municipalities of Northlake, Stone Park, Melrose Park, Bellwood, Westchester, and Broadview, Illinois. This project, combined with the Addison Creek Reservoir Project (Contract 11-186-3F), is expected to provide \$116 million in flood relief benefits to the area, with approximately 2,200 properties receiving relief from flooding damages.

The designated right-of-way for the project requires the District to acquire property interests impacting approximately 175 parcels of land consisting of 271 property index numbers, including both residential and commercial properties located across all six municipalities. The needed property interests include a combination of fee simple takings and permanent or temporary easements.

Since the execution of the agreement, Neal & Leroy, LLC has provided legal assistance in the negotiations of the complex acquisitions and has filed seven condemnation lawsuits on behalf of the District. Neal & Leroy, LLC is also overseeing the relocation assistance program for eligible property owners to ensure compliance with the Federal Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act.

A change order is requested in order for Neal & Leroy, LLC to complete the pending negotiations and condemnation cases, and to file additional condemnation lawsuits where an agreement cannot be reached with the property owners. In addition, Neal & Leroy, LLC will continue to oversee the relocation assistance program for the remaining persons who are displaced due to the Project. To minimize legal costs, the District has been handling all closings and municipal easements in-house, and will continue to do so for the remainder of the right-of-way acquisition.

The primary issue is that the irrigation system that the project was designed around was not in proper working order. Despite efforts by the CHA to make repairs, several issues were unresolved and a test of the system needed to ensure the proposed improvements would be functional cannot be performed at this time due to CHA resource priorities. The CHA indicated it will not be able to revisit the irrigation issues until at least the spring of 2019. In addition, several issues were found with the existing stormwater vault and related infrastructure that would require extensive modifications beyond the scope of the District's project, with no timeframe indicated for addressing these additional concerns. Subsequently, the District and Concord have mutually agreed to discontinue the subject contract, and Concord will be paid a total of \$102,747.66 for the work completed prior to date, which consisted of preparation of administrative submittals, mobilization, and site investigation.

Therefore, it is in the District's best interest to discontinue the current contract and to decrease and close this purchase order. The District will coordinate with the CHA to verify that the irrigation system is fully functional and that the stormwater system discrepancies have been corrected, and then could re-advertise the contract for bid at a later date.

On September 3, 2015, the Board of Commissioners authorized the Director of Procurement and Materials Management to issue a purchase order and enter into an agreement with Rubinos and Mesia Engineers, Inc. (RME) for professional engineering services for Contract 09-875-3D Civil, Structural, and Architectural Engineering Consulting Services, in an amount not to exceed \$3,000,000.00. The original contract completion date of December 31, 2018, was extended to December 31, 2019, to complete design work already in progress.

Currently, there is \$581,703.06 remaining on the purchase order for completion of ongoing design work. The contract provides engineering services on an as-needed basis for a three-year period and provides additional resources to reduce project backlogs, maintain critical project schedules or augment District staff when specialized design or inspections are required.

RME is completing detailed structural inspections and is currently designing the third and final phase of critical repairs of the A/B and C/D Service Tunnels at the Stickney WRP. Work on these tunnels was initiated on an emergency basis under Contract 06-153-9D, which was completed in 2007. The Phase 1 construction on the tunnels was completed in 2016 under Contract 04-131-2D, and Phase 2 of the tunnel rehabilitation is currently in construction under Contract 04-132-3D. The final phase of work is required to extend the useful life of the remainder of the service tunnels, which contain low pressure air mains, fiber optic cables, steam piping and other critical plant components needed to maintain ongoing treatment operations. Design of the complex project is currently underway; however, insufficient budget remains to develop the necessary details and complete the work.

Similarly, RME is also performing design work for Contract 15-069-3D Rehabilitation of Steel Spandrel Beams of Pump and Blower House, O'Brien WRP. This project was initiated following the collapse of a south parapet wall in 2013 which resulted from corrosion of the structural steel framing embedded in the masonry walls. Critical work under this contract consists of reinforcing the perimeter steel members at the roof level after the masonry parapets and decorative stonework are removed above the roof elevation. The masonry parapets and stonework will be rebuilt after structural steel repairs are completed. The design is approximately 60% complete; however, due to the complexity of the work and the number of details required, the design cannot be finalized within the current budget.

Insufficient budget remains to complete on-going design work on these two critical structural rehabilitation

projects. Therefore, an increase in the amount of \$1,500,000.00 is requested to complete the designs. Increasing this budget will save the time and costs associated with preparation and turnover of design work which is already in process to another consultant.

Dear Sir:

On May 10, 1999, the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (District) entered into a Project Cooperation Agreement (PCA) with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) for the McCook Reservoir. The PCA specifies a project cost contribution of 25 percent by the District with the Corps providing the remaining funds. In addition, the Corps is responsible for design and construction of the major reservoir features.

At a special meeting held on November 20, 2017, authority was granted for the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (District) to assume responsibility for the completion of the design and construction of remaining elements of the McCook Reservoir Stage 2 in exchange for receiving a lump sum payment from the Corps for the federal government's share of the estimated remaining costs. The decision to assume such responsibilities was the result of inadequate funding levels appropriated by Congress for Stage 2 and indications that support for continued funding was declining and could not be guaranteed in the future. In lieu of continued annual funding, the Corps and the Office of Management and Budget supported the use of a special provision, Section 1043 of the Water Resources Development Act of 2014, allowing for a non-federal sponsor to carry out construction of projects for flood risk management. As a result, the Corps has secured \$34,700,000.00 for the federal share of estimated Stage 2 costs that will be transferred to the District, less approximately \$880,000.00 for the estimated cost of the Corps participation activities in completion of the project.

It was initially intended to amend the 1999 PCA to include the terms for the transfer of funds from the Corps to the District and to outline the District's responsibilities for completion of design and construction of Stage 2. However, after working through the draft amendment, the Corps recently decided that a new Project Partnership Agreement (PPA), formerly known as a PCA, would be required. The existing PCA will be amended simply to clarify that completion of construction of Stage 2 will be pursuant to the new PPA.

The PPA will define the terms for the transfer of funds as well as the responsibilities of both the Corps and District. As the non-federal sponsor in this PPA, the District's responsibilities will include completion of the design and construction of the remaining elements of the McCook Reservoir Stage 2. The District will also be responsible for maintaining the structural and mechanical components of the reservoir upon completion of construction.

Design and construction costs for the remaining portions of Stage 2 are estimated to be \$46,267,000.00, of which the District's 25 percent cost share would be \$11,567,000.00, and the Corps would be responsible for

\$34,700,000.00. As part of the agreement, the District would be responsible for any cost overruns.

Based on the foregoing, it is respectfully requested that the Board of Commissioners grant authority to enter into a PPA with the Corps, for design and construction of the remaining portions of the McCook Reservoir Stage 2 Project, and to amend the existing PCA accordingly. It is further requested that the Chairman of the Committee on Finance, Executive Director, and Clerk be authorized to execute said agreement on behalf of the District, as well as any documents necessary to effectuate the transaction and conveyance, upon approval by the Director of Engineering as to technical matters and by the General Counsel as to form and legality.

## 2018 ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CIVIL SERVICE BOARD

The Civil Service Board ("Board") held twelve regular meetings and two special meetings during 2018. Three members serve on the Board. Mr. John S. Kendall served as Chairman from January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018. Mr. Kendall's term expires January 31, 2020. Ms. Mazie A. Harris served as Vice Chairman from January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018. Ms. Harris's term expires January 31, 2022. Mr. Donald J. Storino served as Secretary from January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018. Mr. Storino's term expires January 31, 2024.

At the regular meetings of the Board, 459 requests for leaves of absence were ratified.

During 2018, the District sought the discharge of four employees. Of those four cases, two employees remain on suspension and two employees resigned. Details of these cases are as follows:

- The District suspended one employee pending discharge in February 2018. This case proceeded to hearing before the Board, and pursuant to its May 2018 Order, the employee was reinstated. However, a Motion for Discharge was filed in September 2018. The employee resigned effective September 18, 2018.
- The District suspended one employee pending discharge in June 2018. The employee entered into a stipulation with the District and was reinstated. However, a Motion for Discharge was filed in October 2018. This case is currently pending before the Board.
- The District suspended one employee pending discharge in August 2018. This case is currently pending before the Board.
- The District suspended one employee pending discharge in September 2018. The employee retired October 16, 2018, and the discharge case was stricken from the Board's Agenda on October 17, 2018.

Two discharge cases were carried over from 2017. The Board decided in favor of the District and discharged the employee in one case, while the other case is currently pending before the Board as a result of a remand from the Circuit Court on appeal. Details of these cases are as follows:

- The District suspended one employee pending discharge in September 2017. This case proceeded to hearing before the Board. On April 10, 2018, the Board granted the District's petition to discharge this employee.
- The District suspended one employee pending discharge in February 2017. This case proceeded to hearing before the Board. In its August 2017 Decision, the Board upheld the 30-day suspension and found that an additional six-month suspension but not termination was warranted. The employee returned to work on September 11, 2017. The employee appealed the Decision in Circuit Court. The Circuit Court upheld the Board's Decision except to the extent it imposed additional suspension time after the date of the Decision and remanded the case for further proceedings. This case is currently pending before the Board.

In 2018, employees filed twelve appeals with the Board in which they protested some action regarding their employment with the District, pursuant to Illinois Statutes or the Personnel Rules for the Classified Service. Of those twelve appeals, six are currently pending. One appeal was dismissed with prejudice by Agreed Order. Three of the appeals were stricken due to the employee's resignation. The Board decided against two appellants. Details of these cases are as follows:

- One employee appealed their denial of leave of absence request. After the parties presented an Agreed Order to the Board to dismiss this appeal with prejudice, it was stricken from the Board's Agenda on June 20, 2018.
- One employee appealed a determination denying a claim for vacation credit related to prior employment with another government entity. In its October 17, 2018 Order, the Board granted the District's motion to dismiss this appeal.
- One employee filed three appeals. Two of the appeals related to the employee's performance reviews and the third appeal concerned the employee's 30-day suspension pending discharge. The employee resigned from the District. The employee's three appeal cases were stricken from the Board's Agenda in October 2018.
- One employee appealed a denial of complaint of discrimination. This Board determined it did not have jurisdiction over this appeal. In its August 15, 2018 Order, the Board granted the District's motion to dismiss.
- One employee appealed a decision regarding vacation time. This appeal is currently pending before the Board.
- One employee appealed a 1-day suspension. This appeal is currently pending before the Board.
- One employee appealed the scoring of an examination. This case proceeded to hearing before the Board and was taken under advisement. This appeal is currently pending before the Board.
- One employee appealed a 30-day suspension pending discharge. This appeal is currently pending before the Board.
- One employee appealed a 5-day suspension. This appeal is currently pending before the Board.
- Another employee appealed a 5-day suspension. This appeal is currently pending before the Board.

Five appeals to the Board were carried over from 2017. One appeal was granted, two appeals were denied and two appeals were withdrawn and stricken. The District filed a petition for rehearing in the appeal that was granted by the Board. Details of these cases are as follows:

- One employee appealed being removed from a promotional eligible list in January 2017. This case proceeded to hearing before the Board. The Board granted this appeal, directing that the District restore the employee's name on the promotional eligible list. The District filed a petition for rehearing, which is currently pending before the Board.
- One employee appealed a performance evaluation in March 2017. This case proceeded to hearing before the Board. In its December 12, 2018 Order, the Board denied this appeal.

- One employee appealed a 1-day suspension in March 2017. This case proceeded to hearing before the Board. In its April 10, 2018 Order, the Board denied this appeal. The employee filed a petition for rehearing in May 2018. In its September 5, 2018 Decision, the Board denied the petition for rehearing.
- One employee appealed a 3-day suspension in July 2017. The appeal was withdrawn and stricken from the Board's Agenda in March 2018.
- One employee appealed a 5-day suspension in October 2017. The appeal was withdrawn and stricken from the Board's Agenda in March 2018.

The District presented and requested the Board's approval of five Amendments to the District's Classification Plan and Lines of Promotion, and two Amendments to the Personnel Rules. The Board approved all of the proposed Amendments.

Since March 8, 1973, the Board of Trustees of Junior College District 534 ("Spoon River") has been issued a series of permits for use of approximately 39.16 acres of District real estate on the former Consolidation Coal Company Farm located north of Hickory Road and east of Route 22 in Cuba, Fulton County, Illinois as a farm land laboratory. Spoon River operates the laboratory as part of its Agricultural Management Technology Curriculum, which provides training and education to students looking to acquire the practical skills necessary for a career in agriculture. The current permit expires March 24, 2019, and the annual permit fee is \$2,927.00.

Spoon River has requested a new 5-year permit to continue operating the laboratory as part of its agricultural program.

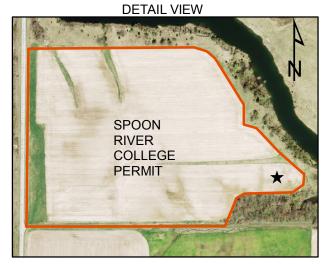

Tri-State Fire Protection District ("Fire District") has requested a five (5) year permit to use the dock facility/boat launch located on Main Channel Parcel 30.05 and access road on Parcels 30.05, 30.06, 31.01, 31.05, and 31.06, and to install a "knox box" on the District's gate on Parcel 30.06 in Willow Springs, Illinois. The Fire District is a Special District created by Illinois statute for the prevention and control of fire and the underwater recovery of drowning victims within certain boundaries of Darien, Willowbrook, Burr Ridge, Willow Springs, and unincorporated DuPage County, Illinois. Under the permit, the Fire District will conduct routine training and rescue operations in the Main Channel, as well as respond to any fire emergency at the Valvoline, Inc./Valvoline, LLC ("Valvoline") leasehold located at Parcel 30.05. 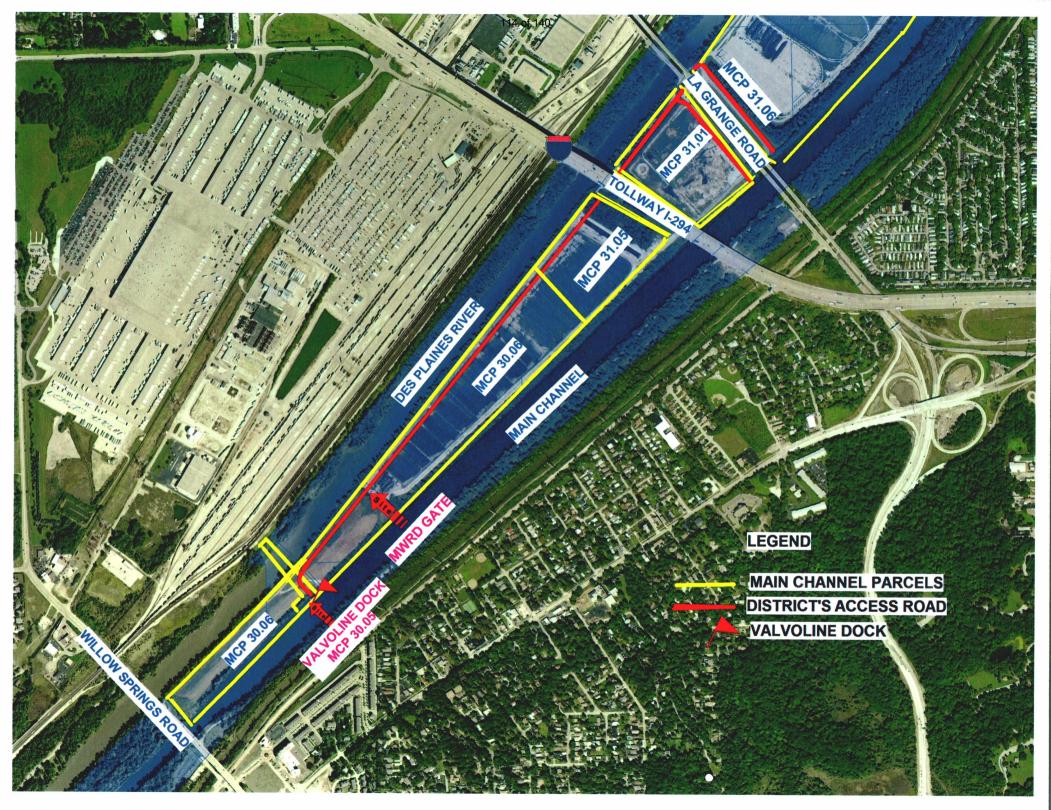

Authority to issue a ten (10) month permit extension to United Parcel Service, Inc. to continue to store and park trucks and trailers on 20.5 acres of District real estate located at the Cal-Sag Channel and Ridgeland Avenue in Alsip, Illinois and known as the Ridgeland Avenue Drying Facilities; Cal-Sag Channel Parcel 10.04 (eastern portion). Consideration shall be \$820,000.00

Dear Sir:

On September 14, 2017, the Board of Commissioners ("Board") authorized the issuance of a 9 ½ month permit to United Parcel Service, Inc. ("UPS") to allow seasonal use of 20.5 acres of District Cal-Sag Channel Parcel 10.04 located at the Cal-Sag Channel and Ridgeland Avenue in Alsip, Illinois and known as the Ridgeland Avenue Drying Facilities ("Ridgeland Facilities") for storing and parking trucks and trailers. The permit, issued for a fee of \$779,000.00, commenced September 15, 2017, and expires January 31, 2019.

UPS has requested a ten (10) month extension to the permit for the five-month periods of September 1, 2019, to January 31, 2020, and September 1, 2020 to January 31, 2021. These months represent the time of year when UPS requires additional land for parking trucks and trailers due to demands related to the holiday season. The District's technical departments have no objections to extending the permit for such use by UPS.

A permit is recommended in this instance due to the designation by the Board on April 3, 2014 of the Ridgeland Facilities as a potential regional sediment management facility for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers ("Corps") in connection with the Cal-Sag Navigation Project. The District may also need the site for other corporate purposes, such as biosolids management and related activities. A permit allows the District to terminate the agreement, if necessary, to accommodate the Corps' or the District's use of the site.

Christy Webber Landscapes ("Christy") currently uses the western 12 acres of the Ridgeland Facilities under a District permit for mulching and storing leaves, and storing and parking trucks and trailers. The Ridgeland Facilities contain sufficient acreage to allow both permits. Any permit issued to UPS will require UPS to coordinate its activities with Christy.

The recommended permit fee is \$820,000.00, which is the same per-acre fee as the existing permit, and represents the pro-rata share of over 10% of the fair market value of the land based upon recent appraisals of nearby comparable sites.

It is requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it authorize and approve the issuance of a ten (10) month permit extension to United Parcel Service, Inc. to continue to store and park trucks and trailers on 20.5 acres of District real estate located at the Cal-Sag Channel and Ridgeland Avenue in Alsip, Illinois and known as the Ridgeland Avenue Drying Facilities; Cal-Sag Channel Parcel 10.04 (eastern portion). Consideration shall be \$820,000.00.

The Village of Oak Lawn ("Oak Lawn") has requested: (1) a 4-year, 124,972± sq. ft. temporary construction easement and (2) a 50-year, 32,262± sq. ft. non-exclusive easement to construct, install, operate, maintain, repair and remove a 60-inch subterranean water main on and/or beneath Cal-Sag Channel Parcels 8.04 and 8.05 and the Cal-Sag Channel in Palos Heights, Illinois. The easements are requested to allow Oak Lawn to upgrade and expand its existing water distribution system servicing Oak Lawn and 12 other southwestern suburbs.

Parcel 8.04 is leased to the City of Palos Heights ("Palos Heights") until July 14, 2038, and Parcel 8.05 is leased to the Commuter Rail Division of The Regional Transportation Authority ("Metra") until November 30, 2039. The easements are therefore subject to the written consents of Palos Heights and Metra.

The District's technical departments have reviewed Oak Lawn's requests and have no objections thereto. It is recommended that an initial annual easement fee of \$5,000.00 be assessed for the 4-year temporary construction easement and an initial annual easement fee of \$5,000.00 be assessed for the 50-year easement, as 10% of the fair market value of each easement premises would yield a fee less than the District's minimum easement fee of \$5,000.00. Each fee is based upon the District's policy to assess an annual fee based on fair market value when the easement is generating revenue. Because Oak Lawn will derive revenue from the water main, an initial annual easement fee of \$5,000.00 for each easement is recommended.

It is requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it grant to the Village of Oak Lawn: (1) a 4-year, 124,972± sq. ft. temporary construction easement and (2) a 50-year, 32,262± sq. ft. non-exclusive easement to construct, install, operate, maintain, repair, and remove a 60-inch subterranean water main on and/or beneath Cal-Sag Channel Parcels 8.04 and 8.05 and the Cal-Sag Channel in Palos Heights, Illinois. The Illinois State Toll Highway Authority ("ISTHA") is redesigning the Mile Long Bridge ("Bridge") that crosses over the Des Plaines River and the Main Channel as part of the I-294 Central Tri-State Corridor Project. The middle portion of the Bridge is located between Main Channel Parcels 31.01 and 31.05. Parcel 31.01 is currently vacant and Parcel 31.05 contains the District's drying beds.

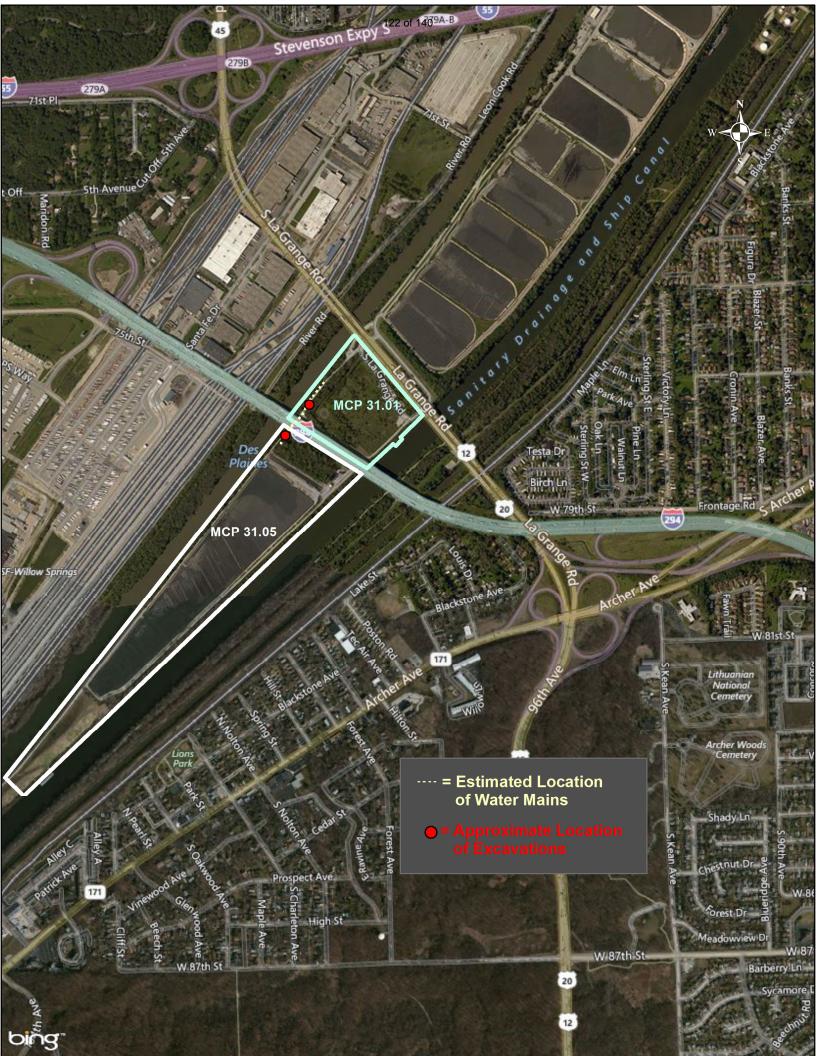
To avoid conflict between the Bridge's redesign and water mains located beneath these parcels, ISTHA has requested a 5-day permit to perform two (2) hydro-vacuum excavations, one excavation on each parcel, and associated surveying work to verify the location, depth and size of the mains. The excavated areas will be backfilled with approved materials.

The District's technical departments have reviewed ISTHA's request and have no objections thereto. A nominal fee of \$10.00 is recommended as is customary with governmental entities using District property for a public purpose.

It is requested that the Executive Director recommend to the Board of Commissioners that it authorize and approve the issuance of a five (5) day permit to the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority to perform two (2) hydro-vacuum excavations and associated survey work on Main Channel Parcels 31.01 and 31.05 in Willow Springs, Illinois to verify the location, depth and size of existing water mains. Consideration shall be a nominal fee of \$10.00.

Dear Sir:

Since 1954, BP Pipelines (North America), Inc. ("BP") has operated and maintained an approximate 9.4 mile, 8 -inch subterranean petroleum pipeline ("Pipeline") traversing the southern bank of the Main Channel between Route 83 in Lemont and Harlem Avenue in Forest View, Illinois. The easement is perpetual and was subject to a one-time payment of \$49,510.00.

BP is performing in-line maintenance work and has requested a nine (9) month permit to use an approximate 40' x 80' portion of Main Channel Parcels 27.01, 28.02, 28.06, 33.04 and 37.05 in Lemont, Willow Springs, Bedford Park, and Forest View, Illinois for construction staging. At each staging area, BP will store excavated soil and construction and repair equipment, and park motor vehicles.

Parcels 33.04 and 37.05 are currently vacant. Parcel 27.01 is leased to Full Circle Repair ("Full Circle") until September 30, 2060, Parcel 28.02 is leased to the Cook County Forest Preserve District ("Forest Preserve District") until March 31, 2033, and Parcel 28.06 is leased to Rowell Chemical Corporation ("Rowell") until December 31, 2048. The permit is therefore subject to the written consents of these entities.

The District's technical departments have reviewed this request and have no objections thereto. A permit fee in the amount of \$5,000.00 is recommended, as the pro-rata share of 10% of the fair market value of the land would yield a fee less than the District's minimum permit fee of \$5,000.00.

Report on Green Infrastructure, Detention, and Compensatory Storage Volumes Required by the Watershed Management Ordinance

Dear Sir:

The Watershed Management Ordinance (WMO) regulates sewer construction within the District's service area and development within suburban Cook County. It provides uniform stormwater management regulations to prevent future development projects from exacerbating flooding and protect environmentally sensitive areas. Green infrastructure (GI) is installed to comply with the stormwater management requirement of capturing one inch of stormwater runoff from all impervious surfaces of the development. Detention requires site runoff to be retained and controls the rate at which water is released, and compensatory storage is required to mitigate development impacting the floodplain.

When a WMO permit is required, development must comply with the stormwater management provisions of the WMO. The attached table includes the number of permits issued per quarter since the WMO became effective. It also summarizes the development area, volume captured by GI, detention provided, and compensatory storage. The total for each year and running total are also provided. This table will continue to be updated at the end of each quarter and transmitted for your information.

# **RESOLUTION FOR BOARD MEETING OF JANUARY 24, 2019**

RESOLUTION sponsored by the Board of Commissioners recognizing Martin Luther King Day.

WHEREAS, the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was born January 15, 1929 and became a revered leader in the civil rights movement in the 1950s and an American icon;

WHEREAS, Dr. King dedicated his life to bringing about positive social and political change through nonviolent discourse and demonstration; and

WHEREAS, during a tumultuous time in our history, Dr. King brought his message of equality and justice for all and service to others to the people of this great Nation; and

WHEREAS, on August 28, 1963, Dr. King delivered his now famous and oft-quoted "I Have A Dream" speech on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial, which has inspired and emboldened the spirits of those fighting against the poverty, racism, intolerance and inequality; and

WHEREAS, passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 was the result of the hard work and dedication of Dr. King and every citizen who supported and joined him in the streets and marched for justice and equality; and

WHEREAS, in 1964, Dr. King became the youngest person at that time to receive the Nobel Peace Prize for his work to end segregation and racial discrimination through non-violent means; and

WHEREAS, making the ultimate sacrifice for his beliefs, Dr. King was assassinated on April 4, 1968; and

WHEREAS, in 2012, the Martin Luther King Holiday has been observed in over 100 countries; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the Board of Commissioners of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago, on behalf of ourselves and staff, do hereby recognize and honor Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. by urging the staff of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago,

Dear Sir:

The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago's Bond Redemption and Interest Fund holds sufficient assets on hand to permit the full abatement of its 2018 Real Estate Tax Levies to be collected in the year 2019 related to its General Obligation Capital Improvement Bonds Unlimited Tax (Alternate Revenue Source), 2014 Series B (Green Bonds), 2016 Series E (Green Bonds), and 2014 Illinois Environmental Protection Agency ("IEPA") Bond Project Designated 14O. The attached Ordinance presents the detail of abatement for the bond issues, and authorizes the abatement action on the 2018 levy of taxes for the Bond Redemption and Interest Fund.

A full abatement of \$6,152,228.00 is requested for approval from the Bond Redemption and Interest Fund levy for the General Obligation Capital Improvement Bonds Unlimited Tax (Alternate Revenue Source), 2014 Series B (Green Bonds), 2016 Series E (Green Bonds), and 2014 IEPA Bond Project Designated 14O. The abatement is required as a result of the deposit into the 2014 or 2016 Alternate Revenue Bond Debt Service Funds on January 18, 2019. A transfer was made by the Treasurer from the Stormwater Management Fund tax receipts account in an amount sufficient to provide for the punctual payment of principal and interest due in 2019 in accordance with Ordinances O14-012 and O16-006, Section 15, and O14-009 Section 11.

The 2018 levy will be reduced in the amount of \$6,152,228.00 and the amount levied for interest and principal on outstanding bonds, when due, will be adjusted to \$238,706,638.00.

It is recommended that "Ordinance O19-001 An Ordinance directing the County Clerk to reduce the levy of taxes on Capital Improvement Bonds for the levy year 2018" be adopted by the Board of Commissioners, providing for the abatement of taxes in the amount of \$6,152,228.00 levied for payment of interest and principal for the District's General Obligation Capital Improvement Bonds Unlimited Tax (Alternate Revenue Source), 2014 Series B (Green Bonds), 2016 Series E (Green Bonds), and 2014 IEPA Bond Project Designated 14O bond issues for the levy year 2018.

WHEREAS the Board of Commissioners (the "*Board*") of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (the "*District*") has provided for the issuance of general obligation capital improvement bonds of the District as follows:
