The goals should be specified in the Invitation to Bid, the Proposal, and the Agreement.

- The Affirmative Action Ordinance Revised Appendix D, dated May 21, 2020, **must** be included
- Appendix K should not be included
- Appendix C must be included
- Appendix V should not be included
- Exhibit C must not be included
- Assist Agencies List must be included

Also, please refer to the attached Revised memo, dated June 29, 2020, for new boiler plate language. This language should be consistent in its incorporation in the Invitation to Bid, the Proposal, and the Agreement.

Responsiveness

On May, 21, 2020, the Affirmative Action Ordinance, Revised Appendix D was revised and adopted by the Board of Commissioners. Accordingly, all contracts that contain Affirmative Action Goals must include the Revised Appendix D effective May 21, 2020. This change will apply to all contracts advertised after May 21, 2020.

The following language must be included in the Invitation to Bid, the Proposal, and the Agreement. The Ordinance sets the parameters of the newly implemented process affecting the MBE, WBE, SBE Utilization Plan and the MBE, WBE, SBE Subcontractor's Letter of Intent.

- 1. Each Bidder must submit with their proposals a signed and completed MBE, WBE, SBE Utilization Plan which lists each business intended to be used as a MBE, WBE, SBE on pages UP-2, UP-3 and UP-4 and supplemental pages as necessary. The Bidder must sign the Signature Section page on UP-5. Failure to submit a signed MBE, WBE, SBE Utilization Plan will result in a bid being deemed non-responsive and the bid will be rejected. Also, if a Waiver is sought, the Bidder is required to sign pages UP-5 and UP-6, the Waiver Request Form; failure to do so will be viewed as non-responsive and the bid will be rejected.
- 2. Each Bidder must submit with their bid package an original or facsimile copy of MBE, WBE, SBE Subcontractor's Letter of Intent, page UP-7 for each subcontractor listed on their MBE, WBE, SBE Utilization Plan. The submitted MBE, WBE, SBE Subcontractor's Letter of Intent must be completed and signed by the subcontractor and accompanied with a copy of the subcontractor's current Letter of Certification from a state, local government or agency or documentation demonstrating that the subcontractor is a MBE, WBE or SBE within the meaning of the Affirmative Action Ordinance, Revised Appendix D. Failure to submit the MBE, WBE, SBE Utilization Plan signed by the Bidder at the time of the bid opening and the MBE, WBE, SBE Subcontractor's Letter of Intent signed by each MBE, WBE, SBE will be viewed as non-responsive and the bid will be rejected.
- 3. If the Bidder exceeds the allowable *Supplier Utilization* amount which is stated in the bid documents, the bid will be viewed as non-responsive. Therefore, the Bidder may not exceed the use of a MBE, WBE, SBE supplier for more than 25% of each respective MBE, WBE, SBE goal, unless the Administrator has authorized a Supplier's Exception notated on page AU-1.

UTILIZATION AND TRANSPORTATION OF AIR DRIED BIOSOLIDS FROM LASMA AND CALSMA

CONTRACT 21-692-11

GENERAL

The Contractor shall furnish all necessary labor and supervision, equipment, vehicles, permitted sites and all appurtenances and resources for providing all required biosolids transportation and management services for the ultimate distribution and utilization of air-dried biosolids, consisting of up to 29,000 wet tons (WTs)of approximately 30%-50% solids and up to 30,000 WTs of approximately 60%-70% solids from the Lawndale Avenue Solids Management Area (LASMA), Group A, and of up to 31,000 WTs of approximately 30%-50% solids and up to 20,000 WTs of approximately 60%-70% solids from the Calumet Solids Management Area (CALSMA), Group B, in an approved lawful manner, for an approximate 36-month period, as specified herein.

The sites for Group A include the Lawndale Avenue Solids Management Area (LASMA), Harlem Avenue Solids Management Area (HASMA), the Marathon Site, the Stony Island Drying Site, and the Vulcan Site. The sites for Group B include the Calumet East and West Drying Sites, and the CALSMA Lagoons. The Contractor shall provide all landapplication and management for site utilization and for storage of biosolids. The Contractor shall provide all labor, supervision, technical expertise, equipment, appurtenances, and resources, for the full and satisfactory completion of the specified work, including:

- 1. Utilization/disposal of biosolids;
- 2. Permit compliance and maintenance, and any required reporting and record keeping;
- 3. Application/utilization sites, services, and equipment;
- 4. Storage sites, services, and equipment;
- 5. Transportation of biosolids to utilization/disposal site.

The intent of this Contract is to identify acceptable proposal(s) from suitable entities to receive District biosolids from the approximate period of April 17, 2021, through December 31, 2023.

The Contractor shall be responsible for complying with any and all applicable laws, statutes, regulations, ordinances, permits and directives.

Bidders are <u>STRONGLY URGED</u> to inspect all areas of the work sites prior to bidding, in order to familiarize themselves with the nature of the work and the method of accomplishing the same.
